Water Security for Sustainable Development

Since the establishment of diplomatic relations in 1973, the bilateral relationship between Vietnam and Australia has gone from strength to strength, driven by growing convergence of our political, strategic and economic interests. In 2018, the Prime Ministers of Australia and Vietnam elevated the bilateral relationship to the level of a Strategic Partnership, committing both countries to deepening ties that contribute to peace, stability and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific region. A core pillar of the Strategic Partnership is our support for economic growth and development. Through our economic partnership, Australia is assisting Vietnam to achieve its socio-economic and development aspirations, with an emphasis on economic reform, human resource development, private sector engagement, climate change, gender equality and innovation. And we are continuing to work together to address regional and global emerging issues, including water security and access to safe, clean and sustainable water supply.

Water security reduces poverty, increases living standards and underpins many other development goals. It provides a foundation for improved quality of life for all, especially the most vulnerable—usually women and children—who benefit most from good water governance. The water sector provides essential services to our populations, delivers a vital input to agriculture, supports industry and the services sector and is playing an increasing role in enhancing the liveability of our urban communities. In Australia, water is also central to the cultural, social and spiritual identity of First Nations Australians.

Our water sectors are now focused on future policy directions – and for good reason. The efficiency and quality of water services has a direct impact on the national economy, the productivity of cities and rural communities and the health and wellbeing of all citizens. This has been all too evident in recent times, with the water sectors at the front line in response to new extremes in floods, droughts and the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Vietnam and Australian water sectors have collaborated for many years and achieved significant outcomes together, including in response to COVID-19. As the world, and the challenges facing our water sectors, change, the time has come to take stock of these challenges and strengthen the dialogue for our water leaders. This will ensure we can plan for our water future and map how best we can support one another on this journey.

This Vietnam–Australia Water Week brings together leaders from across both of our water sectors to share experiences, discuss our interconnected water future, support each other's policy directions and identify opportunities to best collaborate in support of these goals. I look forward to joining, in the first instance, as well as receiving the communiqué on the forum's outcomes and strategic directions.

- Unlocking innovation in delivering safe, secure, sustainable and efficient water services – this session focuses on strengthen our water sectors innovation agenda to prepare for and embrace opportunities associated with Industry 4.0.

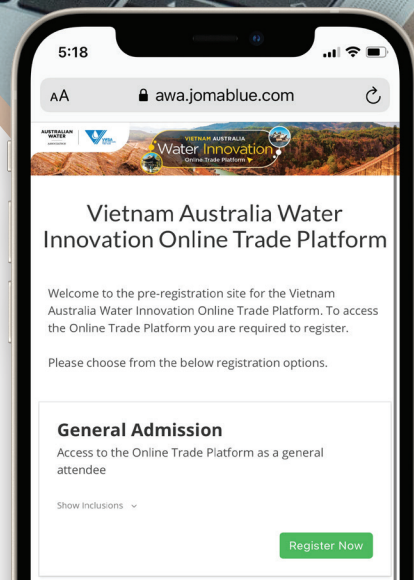
