

Glennallen standout named 2A's top player

Great players rise to the challenge. This vear. Glennallen senior standout Ariana Dougall played some of her best basketball when facing some of the biggest challenges. The 2A standout scored 30 or more points twice against 3A opponents, and 24 against a third.

"She rises to the occasion," Glennallen head coach Jim Lorence said recently. "She wants to compete at the highest level. She rises to whatever challenges are in front."

Dougall has also risen to the top of the 2A ranks. The Glennallen senior has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 2A Plaver of the Year.

This also marks the second straight year that Dougall has been named first-team all-state, and the third time she's been recognized by the coaches association. Dougall was a second-team selection as a sophomore.

Dougall is a four-year starter for the Panthers. The senior point guard has led Glennallen to three straight conference titles, and three straight trips to the state tournament. Glennallen was third in 2013 and fourth last year.

Throughout her prep career, Lorence said Dougall's game has continued to evolve. She's always been able to score for the Panthers. Dougall passed the 1,000 career points mark early this season, and she's expected to hit 1,500 career points during the



first round of the 2A tournament. Dougall enters the state tourney with 1,494 career points.

She's averaging 24.6 points per game as a senior. Earlier this season, Dougall scored 31 points against a Valdez team that recently won the 3A Aurora Conference title. She also scored a season-high 40 points against Tok.

But there's more to her game. Lorence said she handles the ball well as the team's point guard, and is very aggressive on the defensive side. She's always shot well from the perimeter, but her ability to attack the basket and finish has rounded out her game, Lorence said.

He's also averaging about 10 rebounds and five steals per game.

PALMER — As one of the best high school girls basketball players in the state, Faith Farris of Colony is repeatedly asked about her plans to play college basketball. Coaches, fans, pretty much everyone asks the same question.

"She's a smart gal and she's going to do some amazing things in her life," Colony coach Jeff Bowker said.


The biggest reason why Farris isn't going to play basketball in college is because she plans to work in the medical field and recognizes the academic commitment it'll take to become a doctor.

"This year has had more meaning to me," Farris said. "It's




my last year. There is a sense of urgency and a sense of want for that state title

'She's long, so she can get steals and create havoc defensively. Offensively, she can shoot the ball against bigger girls. She's a real strong competitor."

As a freshman, Ostanik said, McCullough earned minutes off the bench, but may not have played as much in big games. As a sophomore, McCullough became the first guard off the bench.

"A lot of kids, if they're not starting their sophomore year, they're out. Instead, he just said, hey I'm going to get better every day. I want to be a great teammate. I want to win," Ostanik said. "His junior year, he was a starter from Day 1 for a team that went 28-0."

McCullough remains a fixture in the Monroe starting lineup, and is the leader of a group of athletes hungry to push Monroe into the 3A state title game for the fifth straight year.

Heading into the state tournament, McCullough was averaging 16 points per game. The senior point guard has 73 assists, compared to only 30 turnovers, and has collected 43 steals. Mc-Cullough has hit 66 three-pointers this year, and is shooting 41 percent from behind the arc. Ostanik said McCullough plans to play at the next level, and there has been a good amount of interest. A decision has not been made, but Ostanik said he expects McCullough to have a promising future.

"Wherever he goes, in four to five years, they're going to say, man that kid was special,' Ostanik said.

Desmond Johnson has solid numbers

There's a lot to measure in the game of basketball. Statistics, speed, vertical jump. Desmond Johnson has solid numbers in all of the above. But if you ask his head coach, Jason Jno-Lewis, there's something else about the East Anchorage senior you can measure. And the results are off the charts.

"His heart." Jno-Lewis said recently of Johnson, who has been named to the first team of the 2015 Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 4A Boys All-State Team.

"He's an undersized guard with a big heart," Jno-Lewis said. "He outworks everybody else on the court."

The 5-foot-10 point guard currently leads the Thunderbirds in a number of statistical categories. Johnson, a first-team all-state selection for the second straight year, averages 20 points, 8 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game. He's second on the team with 2.7 steals per game.

"He's impacts the game in so many different ways," Jno-Lewis said.

The rebounding numbers (5.7 defensive and 2.3 offensive) are a product of Johnson's heart, Jno-Lewis said.

Johnson can score. He passed 1,000-point mark for his career earlier this season. But the assists show he can also distribute.


"He's a phenomenal player," Jno-Lewis said. "He makes everyone around him better." Jno-Lewis called Johnson, a "coach on the floor," with a personality others are drawn to.



"Everyone gravitates toward him," Jno-Lewis said.

Johnson helped East win the Cook Inlet Conference title earlier this month. The T-Birds raced past rival West Anchorage 82-61 March 7 to earn the conference crown. In that game, Johnson fell two assists shy of recording a triple-double. Johnson finished with 16 points, 12 rebounds and eight assists.

Johnson will cap a stellar prep career during the 2015 4A state tournament, but Jno-Lewis said Johnson's days on the basketball court are far from over. A number of schools are interested in Johnson, Jno-Lewis said.
