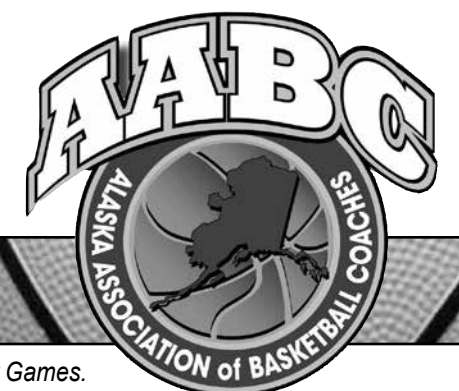

Shishmaref guard named 1A’s top player

Big things can come in small packages. Denise Fernandez may stand at just 5-foot-2, but the Shishmaref junior certainly plays much bigger.

“As far as my guards, she’s the most physical, does the most rebounding of my guards,” Shishmaref head coach Jordan Wallin said recently of Fernandez, who has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Girls Player of the Year.

This also marks the second straight year Fernandez has been named first-team all-state, and the third time she has been recognized by the AABC. Fernandez was named third-team all-state as a freshman.

Fernandez has enjoyed a long and successful run in the Shishmaref varsity girls basketball program, and she’s only a junior. Fernandez, a shooting guard, cracked the starting lineup with the team as an eighth grader.

Earlier this month, Fernandez scored 26 points to lead her team to a 53-38 win over

Teller in the Bering Sea Conference title game. By helping her team win the tournament, Fernandez is leading her squad to the state tournament for the fourth time in her career. Last season, Shishmaref reached the state title game and finished as the runner-up. In her three years at the state tournament, Fernandez has been named a player of the game four times.

Overall, Wallin said Fernandez has evolved both as a player and a person.

“She’s matured a lot this year, in terms of not only her style of play, but in her attitude and demeanor on and off the court,” Wallin said. “She’s made big improvements just this season. It’s paid big dividends.”

With her aggressive play, Wallin said Fernandez is an asset on the defensive end. Fernandez also provides a luxury for Shishmaref, Wallin said. Teams need to guard Fernandez, but if opponents pay too much attention to Fernandez, Wallin said Shishmaref has the supporting cast to do damage.

Fernandez is averaging 19.6 points per game.

## Glennallen standout named 2A's top player

Great players rise to the challenge. This year, Glennallen senior standout Ariana Dougall played some of her best basketball when facing some of the biggest challenges. The 2A standout scored 30 or more points twice against 3A opponents, and 24 against a third.

"She rises to the occasion," Glennallen head coach Jim Lorence said recently. "She wants to compete at the highest level. She rises to whatever challenges are in front."

Dougall has also risen to the top of the 2A ranks. The Glennallen senior has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 2A Player of the Year.

This also marks the second straight year that Dougall has been named first-team all-state, and the third time she's been recognized by the coaches association. Dougall was a second-team selection as a sophomore.

Dougall is a four-year starter for the Panthers. The senior point guard has led Glennallen to three straight conference titles, and three straight trips to the state tournament. Glennallen was third in 2013 and fourth last year.

Throughout her prep career, Lorence said Dougall's game has continued to evolve. She's always been able to score for the Panthers. Dougall passed the 1,000 career points mark early this season, and she's expected to hit 1,500 career points during the



first round of the 2A tournament. Dougall enters the state tourney with 1,494 career points.

She's averaging 24.6 points per game as a senior. Earlier this season, Dougall scored 31 points against a Valdez team that recently won the 3A Aurora Conference title. She also scored a season-high 40 points against Tok.

But there's more to her game. Lorence said she handles the ball well as the team's point guard, and is very aggressive on the defensive side. She's always shot well from the perimeter, but her ability to attack the basket and finish has rounded out her game, Lorence said.

That’s not an issue now. “This year, he came here ready to play ball. His body has matured completely. His mind has matured completely,” Sundown said.

Standing at 6-foot, Medina does a lot of things for Scammon Bay, Sundown said. Scammon Bay prefers an up-tempo style of play, with full court defensive pressure. Medina’s skill set, Sundown said, allows him to be an asset for Scammon Bay at both ends of the floor. He currently leads the team in scoring, averaging 17 points per game. He’s also averaging about 10 rebounds and five steals per game.

Lifelong Ram enjoys first-team honors

Dawson Matthews has spent his entire life on the Susitna Valley Jr./Sr. High School basketball court. Matthews spent most of his life on the sidelines as his father, longtime Su Valley boys head coach Mike Matthews, worked with his team. But for the last four years, Dawson Matthews was a big part of the boys program as a player.

“He grew up as a Su Valley Ram ever since he was a little baby,” Mike Matthews said of Dawson, who has been named to the first team of the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 2A Boys All-State Team.

Mike Matthews said Dawson is the first Su Valley boys basketball player to be named first-team all-state in more than two decades. Dawson is also following in the footsteps of his older brother Paxson, a former Rams player.

“As soon as he could dribble a basketball player, he’s been a little spark plug. Super competitive,” Mike Matthews said of Dawson.

Matthews said Dawson grew up around the varsity team. When it became his turn to hit the floor in Su Valley’s blue and gold. became a quick competitor for the Rams.

“He’s been a leader on our team for a long time,” Matthews said. Matthews described Dawson as a point guard, shooting guard mix. But that doesn’t mean Dawson camps out on the perimeter. Dawson typically leads the Rams in just about every statistical category. This year, Mike Matthews said, Dawson even led the Rams in rebounding. Dawson Matthews av-



eraged just about 20 points, nearly seven rebounds and three assists per game as a senior.

Mike Matthews admits he’s a bit biased, but believes Dawson is as talented as any player he’s coached. He also lauded his son’s work ethic and drive.

“I’m proud to be his dad. He’s a hard worker. The way he leads his team all the time is pretty fantastic,” Mike Matthews said.

This is the third time Dawson Matthews is being recognized by the coaches association. He was named second-team all-state as a sophomore and a junior.

Dawson Matthews also excels in the classroom. He has a 3.96 grade point average. His GPA is greater than 4.0 when advanced placement courses are factored in.

## Marian Wamsley stands out

When asked what allows Marian Wamsley to stand out, Valdez High girls basketball coach Doug Fleming had a quick answer.

“Her personality,” Fleming said recently. Even during stellar moments on the basketball court, it’s Wamsley’s personality and character that stands out, he said. Earlier this season, during a game at Anchorage Christian School, Wamsley hit 1,000 points for her career. Fleming called a timeout to allow the Valdez senior standout to enjoy her moment. In the huddle, Fleming said, Wamsley told her teammates, “that’s not my 1,000th point, that’s our 1,000th point.”

That moment captured the true character and personality of Wamsley, Fleming said.

“To me that spoke volumes about her personality. It wasn’t just about her getting her 1,000th point. She made it about them, as well as her,” Fleming said of Wamsley, who has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Girls Player of the Year.

Wamsley was also named first-team all-state for the second straight year and recognized by the AABC for the third time in her career. Wamsley was a third-team selection as a sophomore.

Wamsley, who will play Division II basketball at UAF in the fall, is key to the success of the Buccaneers in a variety of ways, Fleming said. This year, Valdez, which recently won the Aurora Conference title, has not had to rely as much on Wamsley on the offensive end. But even though her points per game may not be where it was last year, Fleming said, the 5-foot-10 post helps her team be successful in so many different ways.



“Her personality and work ethic. She beams on and off the court,” Fleming said. “She’s always gives 100 percent.”

Fleming said Wamsley’s personality has rubbed off on her teammates.

“That’s what’s so amazing about this year. We have nine (players) that have her personality,” Fleming said. “She’s a senior. They’ve learned to emulate Marian.” Fleming said Wamsley also excels academically and in other extracurricular activities. She’s a member of the pep band, has performed with the school choir and holds a 4.0 grade point average. Fleming joked, Valdez even had to delay tip-off momentarily in one contest because Wamsley sang the National Anthem before the game.

“She’s an amazing, great young lady,” Fleming said.

Wamsley is the first Valdez athlete to win the 3A girls player of the year award in school history.

Colony senior ready to cap career with success

PALMER — As one of the best high school girls basketball players in the state, Faith Farris of Colony is repeatedly asked about her plans to play college basketball. Coaches, fans, pretty much everyone asks the same question.

“I get that all the time, especially as it’s getting close to the end of the season, everybody is like, ‘Where are you planning to play in college?’” Farris said. “I tell them, ‘Oh, I don’t think I’m going to’ and everyone is always so surprised.”

She’s good enough to play in college so it’s easy to assume she would. Most kids would. But she’s not like most kids.

The 18-year-old is as versatile as she is successful — an all-state player, honor-roll student, part-time model and wanna-be doctor.

“She’s a smart gal and she’s going to do some amazing things in her life,” Colony coach Jeff Bowker said.

The biggest reason why Farris isn’t going to play basketball in college is because she plans to work in the medical field and recognizes the academic commitment it’ll take to become a doctor.

“I’ve talked with a lot of basketball players that play in college and they said it’s more of a job when you get to college, and it’s so much more of your time,” she said. “So since I’ll be focusing on school, maybe it’s not the best choice for me putting so much time into something else. I think I’ve known this for a long time.

“And last summer I started getting into modeling, too, so that’s also something I don’t know if I would have the time to do if I played basketball.”

Until then, though, her focus is helping Colony get back to the ASAA Class 4A state tournament. The Knights finished second last season and third her sophomore and freshman seasons.

“This year has had more meaning to me,” Farris said. “It’s



my last year. There is a sense of urgency and a sense of want for that state title.”

The 5-foot-8 guard is the centerpiece for fourth-ranked Colony [14-5]. She averages 15 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals per game.

“I think she’s one of the three, four best players in the state,” Bowker said. “She’s fearless going to the basket and by the same token she is one of the best perimeter shooters out there.

“She’s long, so she can get steals and create havoc defensively. Offensively, she can shoot the ball against bigger girls. She’s a real strong competitor.”

## Monroe senior has embraced every role with team

Jalon McCullough has helped the Monroe Catholic Rams win a lot of basketball games. The Monroe senior is a four-year varsity player for the three-time defending 3A boys state champions. In the past, McCullough's roles on the team were more specific, more specialized. But as McCullough worked his way through the program the last four years, working to improve, Monroe head coach Frank Ostanik said McCullough evolved, and has become an all-around player and leader for the Rams.

"He came into our school known as a tremendous shooter, great ball handler. Now people recognize him as a very good defender, very good teammate, a guy who can do everything as a basketball player," Ostanik said recently of McCullough, who has been named to the first team of the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A All-State Team.

Ostanik said McCullough entered his program as a talented young player. Since McCullough, has done a good job of adapting and embracing to his role on the team, whatever it may be. Ostanik said part of what makes McCullough special is his willingness to do what helps the team, rather than focusing on instant gratification or individual pursuits. "What's unique is his role has changed every year," Ostanik said.

As a freshman, Ostanik said, McCullough earned minutes off the bench, but may not have played as much in big games. As a sophomore, McCullough became the first guard off the bench.

"A lot of kids, if they're not starting their sophomore year, they're out. Instead, he just said, hey I'm going to get better every day. I want to be a great teammate. I want to win," Ostanik said. "His junior year, he was a starter from Day 1 for a team that went 28-0."

McCullough remains a fixture in the Monroe starting lineup, and is the leader of a group of athletes hungry to push Monroe into the 3A state title game for the fifth straight year.

Heading into the state tournament, McCullough was averaging 16 points per game. The senior point guard has 73 assists, compared to only 30 turnovers, and has collected 43 steals. McCullough has hit 66 three-pointers this year, and is shooting 41 percent from behind the arc. Ostanik said McCullough plans to play at the next level, and there has been a good amount of interest. A decision has not been made, but Ostanik said he expects McCullough to have a promising future.

"Wherever he goes, in four to five years, they're going to say, man that kid was special," Ostanik said.

Desmond Johnson has solid numbers

There's a lot to measure in the game of basket-ball. Statistics, speed, vertical jump. Desmond Johnson has solid numbers in all of the above. But if you ask his head coach, Jason Jno-Lewis, there's something else about the East Anchorage senior you can measure. And the results are off the charts.

"His heart," Jno-Lewis said recently of John-son, who has been named to the first team of the 2015 Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Asso-ciation of Basketball Coaches 4A Boys All-State Team.

"He's an undersized guard with a big heart," Jno-Lewis said. "He outworks everybody else on the court."

The 5-foot-10 point guard currently leads the Thunderbirds in a number of statistical cate-gories. Johnson, a first-team all-state selection for the second straight year, averages 20 points, 8 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game. He's second on the team with 2.7 steals per game.

"He's impacts the game in so many different ways," Jno-Lewis said.

The rebounding numbers (5.7 defensive and 2.3 offensive) are a product of Johnson's heart, Jno-Lewis said.

Johnson can score. He passed 1,000-point mark for his career earlier this season. But the assists show he can also distribute.

"He's a phenomenal player," Jno-Lewis said. "He makes everyone around him better." Jno-Lewis called Johnson, a "coach on the floor," with a personality others are drawn to.



"Everyone gravitates toward him," Jno-Lewis said.

Johnson helped East win the Cook Inlet Con-ference title earlier this month. The T-Birds raced past rival West Anchorage 82-61 March 7 to earn the conference crown. In that game, Johnson fell two assists shy of recording a triple-double. Johnson finished with 16 points, 12 rebounds and eight assists.

Johnson will cap a stellar prep career during the 2015 4A state tournament, but Jno-Lewis said Johnson's days on the basketball court are far from over. A number of schools are inter-ested in Johnson, Jno-Lewis said.
