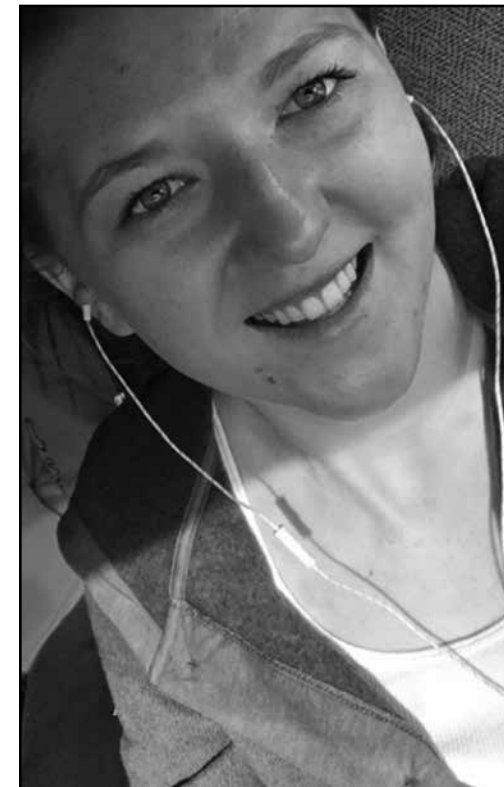

Senior’s hard work leads to top honor

Of all the 1A players recognized with high honors this season, none may have come farther than Nikolaevsk senior Megan Hickman.

“She’s probably the hardest worker I’ve ever coached,” Nikolaevsk head coach Bea Klaich said of Hickman recently. “She never played basketball until the sixth grade. She could barely catch the ball. With all of the persistent hard work, she’s a good player.”

And with all of the hard work, Hickman is now seen as one of the best in her class. Hickman has been named to the first team of the MGJ Building Group/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Girls All-State Team.

Klaich said Hickman’s path from her struggles as a sixth grader to where she is now, a Peninsula Conference Player of the Year and first-team all-state selection makes her a prime example of how hard work can pay off.

“She’s a great example for our team, as well as all the young ladies across Alaska,” Klaich said. “It will pay off if you put the time in.”

Klaich said Hickman is also a perfect example of what she likes to tell young players.

“The offseason makes the player. It really helps the team to work hard in the offseason,” Klaich said.

Hickman is a 5-foot-7 shooting guard who can score, and handle the ball when needed. But the

intangibles reign supreme.

“Her sticktoitiveness even in the face of adversity. She knows what she wants, and she’ll work hard until she gets it,” Klaich said.

That hustle has earned Hickman a potential shot at a career at the next level. Klaich said UAF has expressed interest in Hickman, and the senior has also been looked at by junior college coaches.

“I think she’s just at the beginning, she has a lot of potential,” Klaich said.

Klaich said Hickman has put in the hours to get better. Hickman’s parents have sacrificed to make sure Hickman can get to camps. Klaich said it’s been gratifying for all to see Hickman receive all of the reward that has come from hard work.

“It didn’t come naturally to her, but it’s definitely something she had a desire for. She did anything and everything she could,” Klaich said.

Kylie Wallace hails from Petersburg, a small coastal town in Southeast Alaska.

Wallace is part of a Petersburg girls basketball program that dropped from the 3A level to 2A during the offseason.

Small town. Small school. But Wallace is no small talent.

Wallace's play against her team's toughest opponents is one of the many reasons why the 5-foot-7 shooting guard will take her talents beyond Petersburg. Wallace will make the move to UAF and play for the Division II Nanooks next year.

One of Petersburg's top opponents this season, Ketchikan, new exactly what they were facing. Brock said Wallace has attended basketball camps with the Ketchikan coaches. Knowing what Wallace can do, Brock said Ketchikan's focus was on stopping Wallace. The senior still managed to top the 20-point mark.

Ketchikan did beat Petersburg, but that was the only loss of the season for the Vikings. Petersburg entered its conference tournament 19-1.

Wallace's play against 4A opponents also included a matchup against a future teammate. The Petersburg-Palmer game during the second round of the Clark Cochran Classic in Ketchikan featured a pair of UAF-bound seniors, Wallace and Moose senior Kiana Till. Brock said he's excited about Wallace's future with the Division II Nanooks.

"I think it will be a good fit. She'll have a chance to grow," Brock said.

Wallace's chance to play for the Nanooks in one of the top Division II conferences in the nation, the Great Northwest Athletic Conference, is more proof that Wallace is a big talent from a small school.

"She's a very good all-around player," Brock said of Wallace, who has been named all-conference in each of her four years with the Vikings. "She can score, pass, handle the ball. She's our leading rebounder. She's a very good leader for us."

Off the court, Brock said Wallace is a straight-A student who is active in their community.

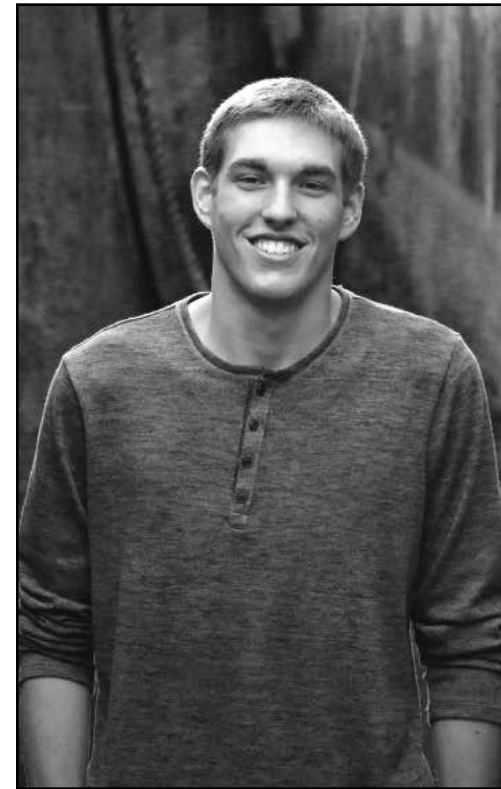

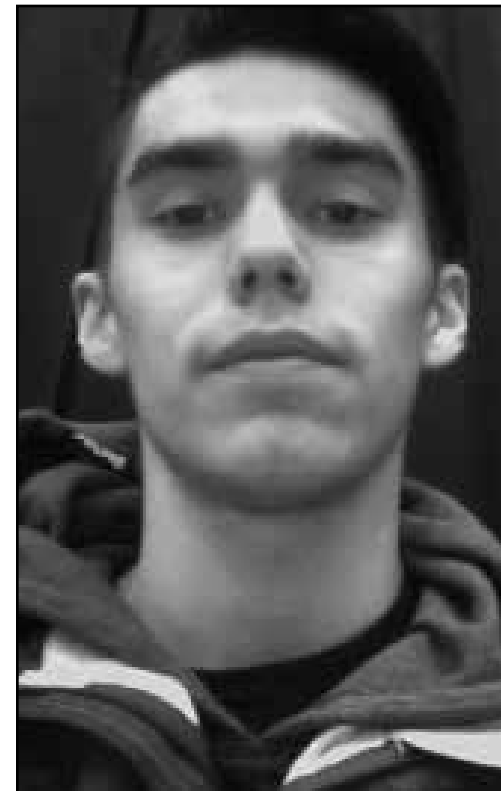

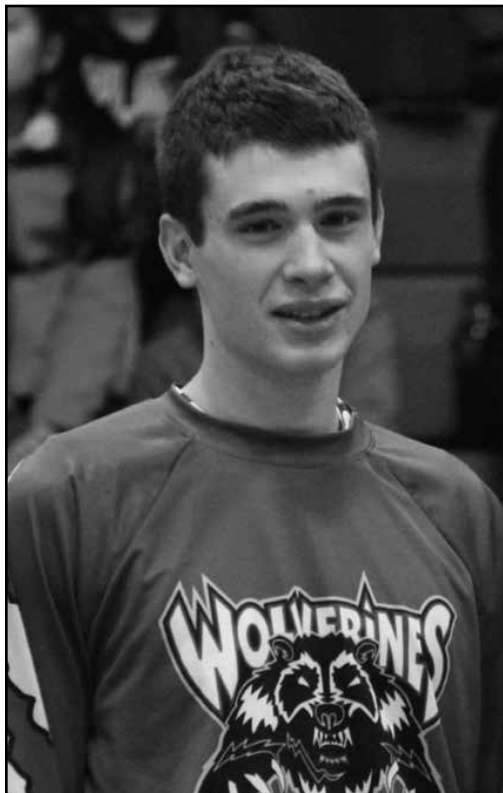

Seldovia senior caps stellar career

Aidan Philpot got his first taste of basketball in the fourth grade. Philpot participated in a youth basketball clinic. At the end of the clinic, the coach offered a free basketball to each young player as long as each promised to keep practicing, keep dribbling.

"Aidan gave his basketball back to the coach," Philpot's dad, Seldovia head coach Mark Janes, said with a laugh recently.

Philpot may not have found his home on the hardwood that day. But it wasn't long before Philpot was on the basketball court to stay. And that's a good thing. He would have missed out on a stellar prep career that includes a state championship and a pile of individual honors.

Philpot, a Seldovia senior who helped lead the Otters to the 1A boys state championship last season, has been named to the first team of the MGJ Building Group/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Boys All-State Team.

Philpot is a three-time first-team All-Peninsula Conference selection, and was recently named the Peninsula Conference Player of the Year. Janes said Philpot's achievements are largely due to the amount of work Philpot has put in since Philpot found a home on the floor in the sixth grade.

Philpot is a talented shooter with scoring range. But above that is the work, Janes said.

"Mostly, he just works hard," Janes said. "He consistently practices twice a day during the season."

After starting in the sixth grade, it didn't take long

for Philpot to make the jump to the varsity level. Philpot is a five-year starter with the Otters, making his debut in the lineup on as an eighth-grader, which is allowed at the 1A level.

"He benefited from getting to play five years," Janes said. "He got to go out there and feel that pressure."

Janes said Philpot has always liked the challenge, and that hooked him on the sport as much as anything.

All of the work has allowed Philpot to take basketball beyond Seldovia. Next year, Philpot will make the move to the NAIA level to play for Clarke University in Dubuque, Iowa.

"It's definitely a nice step. How many kids get to go on and play at the next level?" Janes said.

Philpot has also excelled in the classroom, with a 3.97 grade point average, and was named to the conference's all-academic team. Philpot has also been consistently active in the Seldovia community. The complete package of Philpot's work — athletics, academics and community service — has left Janes filled with pride, as both a coach and a father. "Aidan is an awesome young man," Janes said.

Senior helps Unalaska excel with unselfish play

Ben Enlow has enjoyed his fair share of individual honors.

The Unalaska senior is a past all-state and all-state tournament selection. His name has been in headlines, and his work on the floor has peppered scoresheets. Some with Enlow's accolades could be inclined to do whatever it takes to add to the personal highlight reel. But Enlow has taken a different route, according to Unalaska head coach Kent Russell.

"He's pretty unselfish. He has a willingness to take on a different role with the team," Russell said recently.

Different role. Same recognition. Enlow is still seen among the best.

Ask a selection of coaches across the state in his class, and he is the best.

Enlow has been named the MGJ Building Group/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 2A Boys Player of the Year.

"Probably not what you'd expect out of one of your better players. He's willing to not be the leading scorer," Russell said.

Enlow still gets his points. The 6-foot-1 senior averages about 10 points per game. But everything else he adds is what makes Enlow special, Russell said.

"He sacrifices his energy guarding the other team's best player, working the boards. This year, he's done whatever we needed him to do," Russell said.

Enlow can play either forward position for the Raiders. Russell calls Enlow a hybrid, an athletic player who is tough in the paint and a menace on defense.

"We use him on rebounding a lot," Russell said.

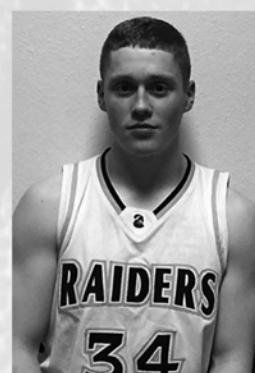
Enlow helped Unalaska roll through the regular season with a 13-1 mark. The team's lone loss came to 3A Bethel. The 2A Raiders also knocked off a few 3A opponents along the way — Nome, Kotzebue and Homer twice.

The senior is also part of a Unalaska squad that's two Enlow deep. Enlow's twin brother Ross is another player honored by the AABC, earning a third-team spot on the all-state team.

"Them together can be a nightmare (for opposing teams)," Russell said. "They're 6-1. They can dunk. They're athletic. It's hard to keep them off the boards."

Russell said Ross, an acclaimed cross-country runner, brings additional toughness to the floor for Unalaska.

"Ross is more of a banger," Russell said. Both have been staples of the Unalaska program through their high school careers. Russell said he saw their potential early, and had them on the traveling team as freshmen. Both also excel academically, he said. Ross Enlow has a 4.0 grade point average, and Ben sports a 3.8.

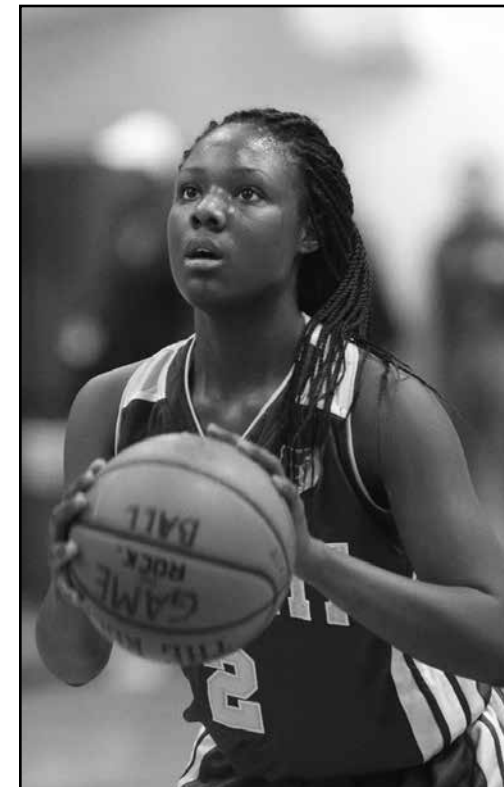

West Valley head coach Jessie Craig calls Ruthy Hebard the “Pied Piper”.

“She does it as a team player. She does it in a humble way. Her team feels like a part of what she does,” Craig said.

Craig said Hebard hasn’t allowed all of the attention to alter character or attitude.

“Across the board she has a humble attitude. I think that’s what makes her so successful,” Craig said. “She doesn’t have that cocky attitude. If a teammate is more open, she’s willing to give it up.”

Craig said Hebard has a unique combination of assets, a very coachable player blessed with tremendous skill and athletic talent. That combination will help her succeed at the next level, Craig said.

“She just keeps getting better and better,” Craig said. “It’s going to be exciting to watch her play at Oregon.

“I can’t emphasize enough what a great person she is. She’s just a great kid.”

Barrow sophomores earn national recognition

Early in the season, as the Barrow Whalers hit the court to play the host Warriors during the annual Doc Larson's Roundball Classic at Wasilla High, the number of fans in attendance donning Barrow blue could rival those in WHS red. The roars from the Whalers fans steadily filled the Wasilla gymnasium with sound.

The weekend was an example of how well the Whalers draw, even on the road.

Fans certainly take pride in the Whalers, the 2015 3A state champions. But for at least a few of the Whalers, their celebrity status has extended far past Alaska's northernmost town.

Barrow sophomores Kamaka Hepa and Travis Adams are now nationally known. Hepa is a nationally-ranked talent on the hardwood, and Adams, also a Barrow football standout, was a player featured prominently on a television series about Whaler football seen on the NFL Network.

Both can add another honor to their list of achievements. Hepa has been named the MGJ Building Group/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Boys Player of the Year. Hepa and Adams have also both been named first-team all-state.

Barrow head coach Jeremy Arnhart said his players have handled the attention well.

"They have a good head on their shoulders. They're pretty smart kids," Arnhart said earlier this season. "The thing with them and the notoriety, they go out and compete in the summer. We do a lot of team camps. They go out with the best of the best in the

nation. They see the level they need to be at, and the work."

Hepa is a nationally recognized talent, ranked No. 21 on the ESPN.com list of top boys' basketball players in the class of 2018. He was a first-team all-state selection as a freshman, and is already receiving offers from Division I programs across the country.

An ESPN writer, in a piece published in September of 2015, called Hepa Alaska's best product since Bartlett graduate Mario Chalmers, who won a national title at Kansas and multiple NBA titles with the Miami Heat.

"Kamaka, you could see him one time in the NBA. He's definitely going to be a big time Division I player. A lot of people want him," Arnhart said.

In just two seasons with the Whalers, Hepa has already amassed nearly 1,000 total points. As of March 8, Hepa had 928 total points. This season, Hepa is averaging 19.3 points and 12.2 rebounds, 3.4 blocks, 3.0 assists and 2.1 steals per game. Adams is averaging 16.8 points, 4.5 rebounds, 5.8 assists and 2.4 steals per game.

Barrow is 46-7 since the duo entered the program and freshman, and the pair helped Barrow win the 2015 3A state title.

Unforgettable moment a highlight in West Valley senior's season

Alaska basketball fans have watched West Valley standout Daniel Hornbuckle dazzle throughout his high school career. But as a senior, Hornbuckle drew national attention.

With his team trailing Colony 63-60 late in a first-round game of the O'Brady's Invitational at South Anchorage High School, Hornbuckle scored an improbable five points during the final five seconds of the game to lead West Valley to the 65-63 win over the Knights.

With about 10 seconds left in the game, Hornbuckle went the length of the floor and hit a three-pointer that tied the game at 63. With about five seconds left, Hornbuckle stole the ensuing inbound pass, and knocked down a fade-away jumper at the baseline at the buzzer to give the Wolfpack the win. A video of the finish posted on Twitter was picked up by national blogs, including Sports Illustrated's Campus Rush.

"You never want to be on the Sports Illustrated Twitter blog as the team that happens to. But coaching as long as I have now, I know you're doing to run into that moment where something like that happens. Daniel did a great job of doing what Daniel does," Colony head coach Tom Berg said later that weekend. Fast forward two months, and that moment still resonates with the Wolfpack.

"I think it will go down in the history of memories," West Valley head coach Cornelius Mingo said recently. "We'll be talking about it for a long time. It's not often a kids scores five points with 4.3 seconds left in the game."

Hornbuckle's heroics against the Knights don't represent the only highlights of a stellar prep career. But they are a great example of the type of talent Hornbuckle is, Mingo said.

It also represents one of the reasons why Hornbuckle is part of the first-team of the MGJ Building Group/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 4A Boys All-State Team.

"He's really special," Mingo said. During the regular season, Hornbuckle averaged 28 points, five rebounds, three assists and three steals per game as a senior. As impressive as those statistics are, Mingo said there is one thing about Hornbuckle that really stands out.

"What's most impressive to me is his work ethic," Mingo said.

Mingo said spectators see what Hornbuckle can do on the court, but don't see the work he puts in behind the scenes.

"Hours and hours and hours," Mingo said of the 5-foot-11 guard. "It rubs off on the rest of the team." Mingo said Hornbuckle intends on playing college basketball, but has yet to announce where. But wherever Hornbuckle goes, Mingo expects great things for Hornbuckle, who also excels in the classroom with a 4.0 grade point average.
