Scammon Bay senior earns top honor

During the final game of her junior season, Kiah Charlie lit up the Alaska Airlines Center.

The Scammon Bay junior poured in 30 points, and led her team to its first state championship in school history, helping her squad score a 66-43 win over Wainwright in the girls' 1A state title game.

As a senior, Charlie picked up right where she left off on the big floor on the UAA campus. After leading an undefeated Scammon Bay squad into the 1A state tournament, Charlie has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Girls Player of the Year.

Charlie averaged more than 30 points per game during the regular seasons, Scammon Bay head coach Hershel Sundown said. And at 5-foot-5, Sundown said Charlie can have success in a variety of different ways.

"(She scores from) all over. She does a little bit of everything," Sundown said.

Sundown said having Charlie on the floor is a luxury for his team. She can post up one moment, and be at the top of the press the next. She can score and rebound in the paint, and then pull out and hit the three.

"She does everything," Sundown said. "She's a coach's dream."

Throughout Charlie's career, Sundown said the senior has consistently put forth the time and effort to improve.



"The willingness, the fact that she's so coachable," Sundown said of Charlie's many positive attributes. "Year after year. She's only getting better."

Sundown Charlie has the desire, and certainly the ability, to play at the next level. He said the senior has already been offered a scholarship from a school in Wisconsin, and there are programs in Washington also interested in her. Sundown said he'd love to see Charlie have the chance to play in her home state at either UAA or UAF.

"Hopefully they'll watch her during the state tournament," Sundown said.

Heath Lyon said Rylie, a 5-foot-7 senior, is his team's point guard. He said Rylie could play inside at the 2A level and could be a shooting guard at the college level, but prefers her to play point guard for



Bristol Bay. From that spot, Rylie is averaging more than 18 points per game, but Heath Lyon said his daughter does a great job at getting her teammates involved.

"She gets the ball to everyone else," Heath Lyon said.

Overall, Heath Lyon said Rylie is simply passionate for the game.

"The biggest thing for her, is her love for the game," Lyon said.

Finley said his wife looked at White, then an eighth grader, and was surprised to see a boy that tall that didn't play basketball. Finley's wife urged White to hit the court.

"I can't even explain how many times we were in the gym for individual workouts," Finley said of White, a 6-foot-8 Ninilchik senior who has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Boys Player of the Year. And thanks to that work, White is now among the state's best players at any level.

White averaged 17.8 points, 13.5 points, 3.9 blocks and 3.5 assists during the regular season, Finley said, and shot 62 percent from the field. White enjoyed a monster effort during the Peninsula Conference title game in early March, notching a triple-double in the win over Nikolaevsk, collecting 26 points, 16 rebounds and 12 blocks. He also had four assists.

Finley said White is a big reason why Ninilchik was able to dominate the level, beating 1A opponents by an average of 52 points a game. But Ninilchik also had schools from higher classes, and White



continued to have success. Finley's squad beat 3A Nikiski and 4A Soldotna, and also played 4A Dimond during the regular season. Finley said Ninilchik worked to provide tougher competition for White and his teammates

White's senior year also included an opportunity to sign his National Letter of Intent to attend UAA and play basketball for the Division II Seawolves.

"It's a huge deal," Finley said.

Petersburg senior grabs top player honors

Following his sophomore year of high school, Petersburg standout Stewart Conn was invited to compete overseas to compete in an international tournament in Germany and Austria.

Conn, a starter with the Vikings since his sophomore year, was already a good player. But following the trip, in which Conn helped lead a Team USA U16 to gold in the United Winter Games, Petersburg head coach Rick Brock said Conn came back an improved player.

"His game went to the next level," Brock said recently.

Now as he enters the final stretch of his prep career, Conn is seen as the best in his class. The Petersburg senior has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 2A Boys Player of the Year.

Brock said Conn, who helped lead Petersburg to the 2A state title game last season, is averaging 21 points and nearly eight rebounds a game for a squad that captured the region title earlier this month.

"He is really the leader of this group," Brock said.

Brock said Conn has developed into a versatile threat for the Vikings, a player who can attack



inside and out. Brock calls the 6-foot-3 senior a point forward, a player who can bring the ball up the floor and work inside.

"We play him all over the floor," Brock said. "He sees the floor so well, passes, shoots the ball. He can shoot the ball outside, score inside."

Brock said Conn wants to play at the next level.

"He would love to go play. He's got some community colleges looking at him right now," Brock said. "It's his dream. He definitely wants to go play at the collegiate level."

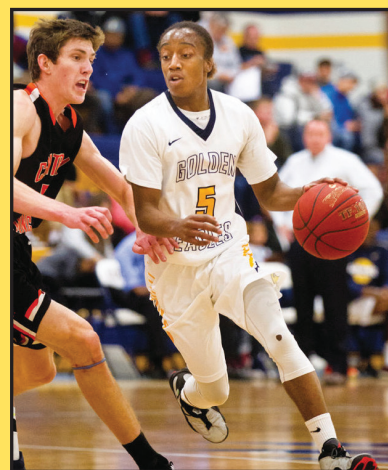


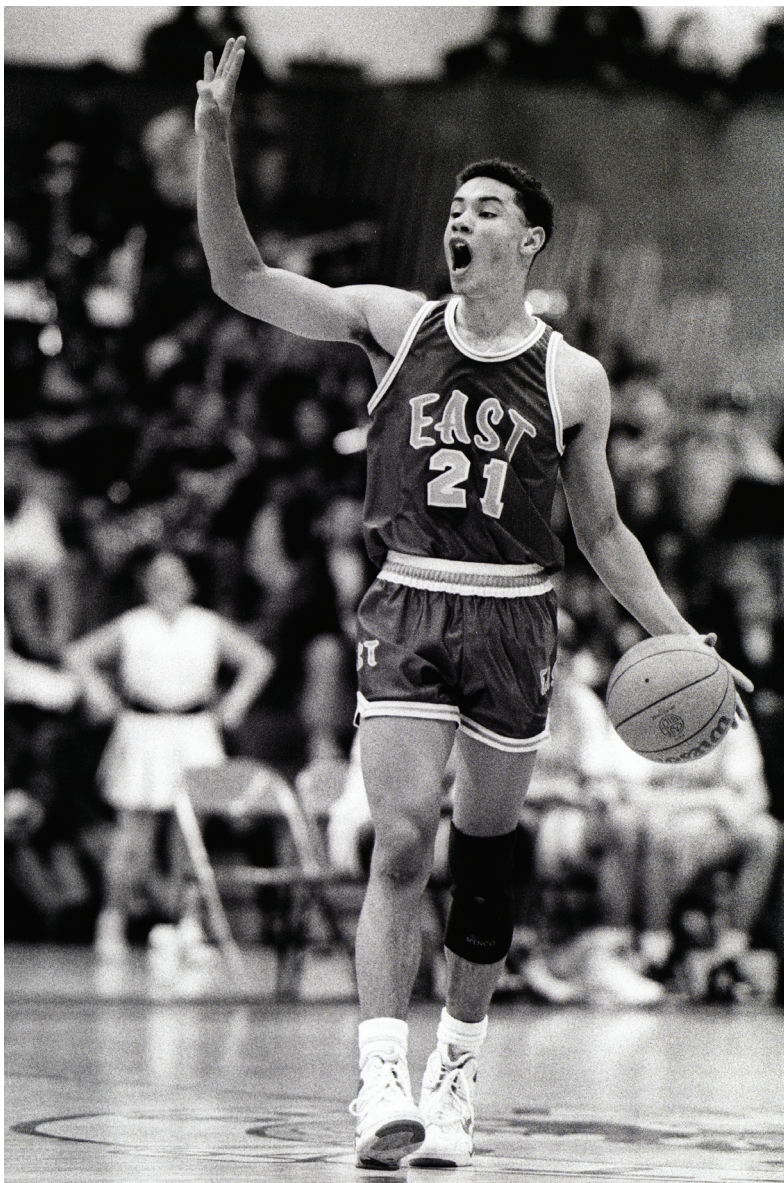
Jack Hobbs **University of Hartford** **2013 AABC All-Star**

Turning in a career performance against Sacred Heart, he scored 18 points, 6-of-9 shooting with five 3-pointers and two steals. Hobbs continued to better himself throughout the season with a career-best four assists against Boston College and career high three steals versus Dartmouth. Jack finished the season with 25 steals, 13 blocked shots, and 196 points.

Da'Zhon Wyche **Laramie County Community College** **2016 AABC All-Star**

As a freshman, Da'Zhon Wyche earned All-Region Team honors leading the Eagles to its best season in three decades with an overall record of 23-11 including a 12-4 record in Region IX South play, resulting in the Region IX South regular season championship. In 33 games, Wyche average as team leading 17.2 points, 5.6 assists, and 2.1 steals per game. He finished the season with an impressive 2.1:1 assist-to-turnover ratio, accounting for over 28 points per game when considering his points and assists together.

A basketball prodigy renowned for his hard work, he became the profile of Alaska high school basketball. A 6-foot-3, barrier-breaking guard for East High School, he was a dominant force on the court.

In his four seasons starting for the Thunderbolts, he led his team to four consecutive Alaska large-school state championships. He was the first player in the state's history to be selected player-of-the-year three times.

Regarded as a deadly three-point jump shooter, he was nicknamed "The Roman Emperor" from a Roman emperor, was nicknamed "The All-American." A prolific scorer and passer, yet appreciated simultaneously for his leadership, recognition and faced some of the nation's top talent.

In an unprecedented accomplishment for an Alaskan, he was invited to participate in national summer camps for underclassmen and played in the McDonald's All-America game and won the 3-point shooting contest. He was the first recruited Alaskan in history before selecting to play collegiate play.

During his Blue Devils career, Langdon was a star performer, an All-American and played in the NBA. A free-throw shooter, Langdon set Duke records for career and season free-throw percentage. After college, Langdon played minor league baseball in the United States.

In 1998, Langdon was a member of the United States team that won the FIBA World Championships.

A lottery draft pick, Langdon became the first Alaskan chosen by the Cleveland Cavaliers and made his NBA debut. He played three seasons with the Cavaliers and then played in the NBA for several successful years with Russia's Moscow CSKA.

Langdon then returned stateside and became the general manager in the office for the San Antonio Spurs (three seasons) and then the assistant general manager for the Brooklyn Nets.

Langdon was an All-Atlantic Coast Conference player and played in the NCAA championship game. A 90 percent shooter for 3-point shooting. Over summers while in college, he played in the San Diego Padres organization. He was a member of the United States team that won a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics.

Langdon was the first Alaskan to play in the NBA when he was drafted in 1999. Langdon spent parts of his career playing professionally in Europe, including seven seasons in the German Basketball Bundesliga.

Langdon became an NBA executive. He worked in the front office for the New York Knicks and Cleveland Cavaliers (one season) before becoming a general manager for the Brooklyn Nets in 2016.

George Houston



George Houston is a basketball coaching institution in the state of Alaska, one of which who is considered to be a mentor, inspiration, and a coaching legend.

Coach Houston has dedicated his life to helping school-aged kids through the game of basketball in the state of Alaska. He has had an influence on thousands of kids across the state in his 40+ years of involvement with basketball. Coach Houston grew up in Juneau and was a state champion basketball player at Juneau-Douglas High School (JDHS) in 1969. He chose to stay in state to go to college at UAF, where he worked with the Lathrop High School basketball team. Upon his graduation from UAF, he returned to Juneau where he began teaching and working with his alma mater. Coach Houston spent 18 years as an assistant coach and then another 13 years as a head coach. During his tenure at the helm of JDHS he won over 200 games, including 11 Region V championships and two state championships, and only finished outside of the top 5 in the state twice. Since his retirement from teaching and running the basketball program at JDHS over a decade ago, he began volunteering his time to work with middle school basketball players, multiple local camps and clinics, and the local AAU programs.

Coach Houston's success and dedication to kids through the sport of basketball in Alaska is unparalleled. His humble nature has never sought out individual awards and accolades, but those in coaching circles, or even remotely associated with high school basketball in the state of Alaska, know his lasting impact.

Wasilla coach calls senior 'one of the most underrated players in the state'

WASILLA — McKenna Dinkel spent a portion of her prep career flying underneath the radar.

Playing alongside first-team all-state selections, Dinkel may not have drawn the bulk of the attention during her run as a four-year varsity player with the Wasilla Warriors. But Dinkel found success in whatever role she was assigned. And now as a senior, Dinkel can't be overlooked. Dinkel currently leads the defending Northern Lights Conference and 4A state champions in both scoring and rebounding.

"She's probably one of the most underrated players throughout the state," Wasilla head coach Jeannie Hebert-Truax said of Dinkel recently. "People just don't take notice of her."

But Hebert-Truax and the Warriors know exactly what Dinkel brings to a squad. Entering the NLC tournament, Dinkel led the Warriors with 13.5 points and 7.8 rebounds per game. The forward is also shooting 54 percent from the floor, a team-high, and even leads the squad shooting 41 percent from behind the arc. Dinkel has knocked down 17 threes this season, third best on the team.

Dinkel is third on the team with 58 steals and fourth with 44 assists.

And now Dinkel is getting more recognition. After earned NLC Player of the Year honors, Dinkel has been named first-team all-state by the Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches.

Hebert-Truax said Dinkel has shown versatility throughout her career, and can help the team in a variety of ways. Earlier in her career, Dinkel was looked to as a player that needs to rebound and defend. As she became a veteran, the team began to depend on her more on the offensive end. This year, Hebert-Truax said Dinkel has become a threat inside and out.



"She can post up. We can pull her out to the perimeter. She also has a pretty good midrange game," Hebert-Truax said.

As the Warriors dealt with injuries, Hebert-Truax said the coaches even put together a package that includes Dinkel working at the point guard spot, and bringing the ball up the floor.

Hebert-Truax said Dinkel's basketball I.Q. allows the Warriors to use the senior in so many different roles.

"She knows and understands the game of basketball," Hebert-Truax said. "One of her major attributes is she understands the game. Not just her position, but everyone else's position too."

During the regular season, Tobin Karlberg shot 62 percent from the field. It's a number you might see from a big man who makes his living in the paint. But for the statistic is even more impressive for Karlberg, Grace Christian School's junior standout, a player who can score anywhere on the floor.

Raising his shooting percentage was a focus for Karlberg, Grace Christian head coach Jason Boerger said recently.

Despite scoring nearly 25 points per game, Boerger



said Karlberg is also selective with his shot.

"He doesn't shoot a lot. He's incredibly efficient," Boerger said. "He's fun to watch."

Karlberg also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 4.4 assists and 4 steals during the regular season.

In addition to all of his ability, Boerger said there are intangibles that stick out.

"Overall, his mental toughness," Boerger said. "He's so competitive. He's just so determined to win. He also has a good heart and loves his teammates. He wants to see them play well."

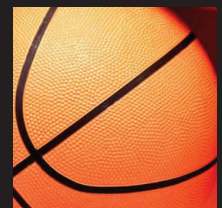

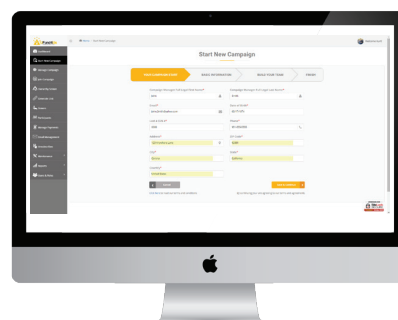

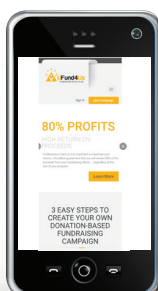
