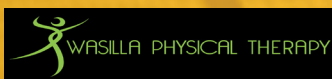

Wasilla High activities director, girls basketball head coach among those honored by Alaska associations

WASILLA — Stacia Rustad, a former Kenai Central High School multisport standout who is now the activities director at Wasilla High School, received a special phone call recently. Craig Jung, Rustad's head coach during her days with the Kenai girls basketball program and her mentor, had some news.

Rustad had been elected to the Alaska High School Hall of Fame.

"I am honored," Rustad said earlier this week.

But the fact that Jung was able to deliver the news made it that much better, Rustad said.

"He was an important figure to me as a young athlete," Rustad said. "He helped me pursue my dreams of playing Division I basketball. He and I are super close."

Jung was inducted into the Alaska High School Hall of Fame in 2012, after he was nominated by Rustad. Now Rustad is a member thanks to a nomination from Jung.

Jung has also earned his place in another hall. He is one of four who will be inducted later in this month in the Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame. Jung, former Fairbanks basketball mentors Joe Tremarello and George Roderick will be inducted as coaches. Wasilla High School girls head coach Jeannie Hebert-Truax, a star at both North Pole and Monroe Catholic as a high school athlete, will be inducted as a player.

In addition to her duties as activities director, Rustad is an assistant on the Hebert-Truax Wasilla girls. Before making the move to Wasilla High prior to the 2015-16 school year, Rustad was the head coach of the Kenai girls program for six years. During those six years, Jung was her assistant coach. Rustad just finished her fourth season coaching alongside Hebert-Truax, a member of multiple halls of fame as both a coach and a player. Rustad said she has been fortunate to be able to spend her basketball playing and coaching career in Alaska with the two of the most respected people in the Alaska basketball community.

"It's the best of both worlds," Rustad said. "I am very bias when it comes to Coach Jung. He was a huge part of getting me where I was as a player and a person. He's a role model for me."

Rustad said coaching alongside Hebert-Truax has been a great experience, and has learned a great deal while working with the state's winningest high school girls basketball coach.

Rustad is one of seven athletes part of the Alaska High School Hall of Fame's 2019 class. Chugiak's Alev Kelter and Cody Tanner, Juneau-Douglas' Justin Dorn, Homer's Phil Engebretsen, Bethel's Randy Hanson and Ninilchik's Austin Vanderford will also be inducted.

Engebretsen is a former boys basketball head coach at Colony High School. His younger brother Ryan is currently the head boys basketball coach at Wasilla.

Rustad said coaching alongside Hebert-Truax has been a great experience, and has learned a great deal while working with the state's winningest high school girls basketball coach.

Rustad competed in basketball, cross-country running, volleyball and track and field at Kenai. Rustad, a 1992 graduate of Kenai Central, helped lead the Kards to the 1991 4A girls state title. She also earned a Region III individual title in cross-country running.

Rustad played Division I basketball at the University of Maine, where she helped the Black Bears advance to the NCAA tournament in 1995 and 1996.

Hebert-Truax, who played in four girls' basketball state title games during her high school career, is the lone player this year to be inducted by the Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches into its hall of fame. Hebert-Truax said she's honored to be recognized and remembered for her work on the floor during her high school career. Hebert-Truax played in the 4A girls state championship game in each of the four years of high school. As a freshman and sophomore, she was part of a North Pole program that finished as the state runner-up. She helped Monroe win it all as a junior and senior in 1987 and 1988.

Hebert-Truax also helped Monroe with a state volleyball title in 1988.

Hebert-Truax played college basketball at Division I University of Miami (Florida), and finished her career ranked second in program history in assists, third in scoring, and fourth in steals. She also helped the Hurricanes earn their first berth into the NCAA tournament in 1989.

Hebert-Truax is also a member of the Alaska High School Hall of Fame, Alaska Sports Hall of Fame, University of Miami Hall of Fame and was named a Legend by the Atlantic Coast Conference.

As a coach, Hebert-Truax hit another milestone during the 2018-19 season. With a 50-48 win over Chugiak Feb. 18, Hebert-Truax earned the 500th win of her career as a girls basketball head coach in Alaska. Hebert-Truax, who recently finished her 24th season, is not only the first to hit 500 wins, but she is also the only coach in Alaska girls basketball history with at least 400 wins.

Hebert-Truax will be inducted into the Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame April 13 at the Wells Fargo Arena in Anchorage, during the association's day of senior all-star games. Jung, Tremarello and Roderick will also be inducted.

Jung spent 23 years coaching girls basketball at Kenai. He was named the Region III Coach of the Year three times, and was also the state coach of the year in 1991.

Tremarello, known best as 'Coach T', spent 17 years with Lathrop basketball. He also played and coached at UAF.

Roderick was the head coach of the UAF men's basketball team for 20 years.

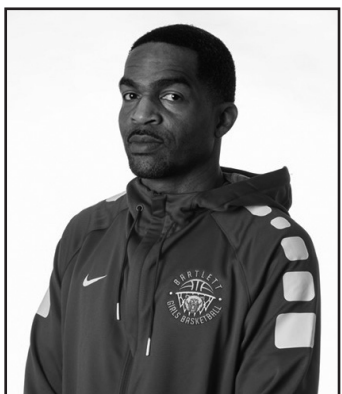

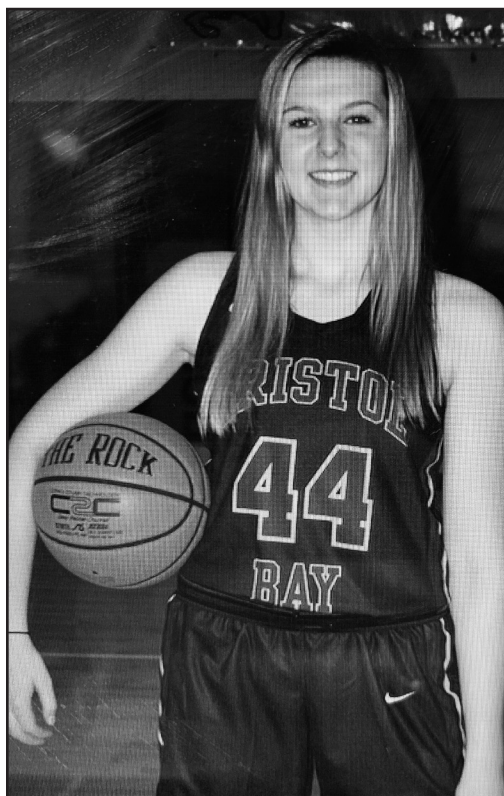

King Cove junior named player of the year

Elaina Mack has a ritual. She fires three, after three, after three, until she hits a goal.

"She makes 100 three-pointers every day," King Cove head coach Gary Lamar said recently.

And the extra work has paid off for the King Cove junior. Mack is shooting 55 percent from the floor and 43 percent from behind the arc.

"That's says a lot," Lamar said. "There's an old saying in coaching. If you can shoot 40 from two and 32 from three, you've got a shooter."

Lamar's King Cove squad has a shooter, and the player tabbed as the best in the state. Mack has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Girls Player of the Year.

"She's the real deal," Lamar said.

Lamar said he's been coaching basketball for 35 years, the bulk of that time in Texas.

"She's the best shooter I've ever had," Lamar said. "That says a lot."

And Mack has the statistics to back it up. The 5-foot-7 guard is averaging 37.5 points per game, a state-best according to statistics provided on asaa365.com. Mack has scored 50 or more points in a game four times this season, including a season-high 57 against Newhalen. And she has also performed at a high level against teams from higher classifications. Mack scored 50 in a win over 2A Unalaska, 34 against 3A Seward and 37 against 3A Redington. Mack also poured in 39 against the Dimond junior varsity, a squad part of a Lynx program that won the 4A state title last year.

Mack led King Cove to a 26-0 record and the Aleutian Chain Conference title. King Cove is also the top seed in the 2019 1A girls state tournament.

Lamar said, while Mack has tremendous talent and potential, the junior is also part of a core group that has helped Mack flourish. Mack is also averaging more than five assists per game. Lamar said Mack has the knack for finding the open player on the floor.

"Her ball handling skills are what allows her to do a lot of this," Lamar said.

Lamar said Mack also has great vision on the floor.

"That allows her to find where the girls come open," Lamar said.

Lamar said Mack is also a student-athlete with high character and humility.

"She plays with her heart. She never celebrates. She could finish with 50 points or 34 points, she walks off with the same humility," Lamar said.

Bourgeois is not the player that's going to pour in 20 every night, Sjostedt said, but the senior brings so much more to the court.

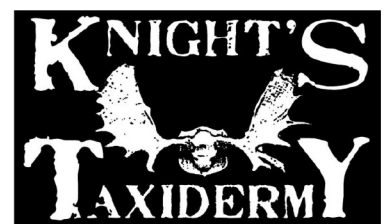
"She's more of an all-around playmaker," Sjostedt said.

Edward Kokeok garnered a rare honor for a freshman when the Shishmaref standout graduated to the level of high school basketball. Kokeok was named a captain as a ninth grader. Kokeok's value exceeds statistics, Ivanoff said.

"He's a natural team leader. He leads by example," Ivanoff said. "He works extra hard on everything he does."

Ivanoff said Kokeok is also an all-around athlete. In the fall, Kokeok won the district meet and qualified for the state cross-country running meet. He also stands out on his school's Mixed 6 volleyball squad.

Aidan is averaging about 18 points and four rebounds a game. The 5-foot-10 guard is also shooting nearly 40 percent from beyond the arc. Aidan also helped Glennallen earn the No. 2 seed in the 2A boys state tournament bracket.

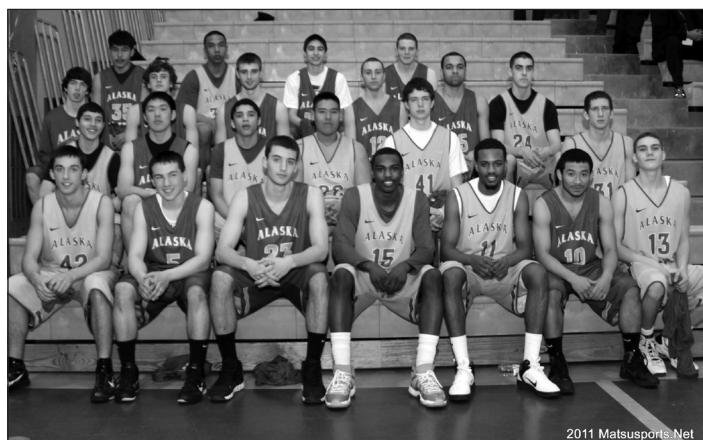

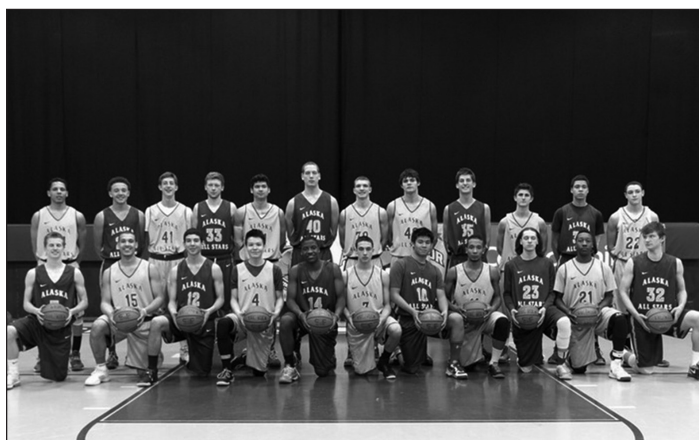

Barb Lyons, a Petersburg native taught 31 years at Valdez City Schools, in both the High School and Middle School. Barb graduated from Petersburg High School and played basketball at UAF her Freshman year. She later moved on to broadcasting and coaching for UAF for the remainder of her years. She is married to her best friend Bob Peca.

Barb coached Valdez basketball for 25 years – 21 years as Varsity Girls Coach, 4 years as Junior Varsity Girls Coach and 7 years as Middle School Girls Coach.

Barb won the A.C.S. Tournament 10 times; won the Valdez Elks Tournament 8 times, and had 8 second place finishes. She won regionals 7 times and had 6 second place finishes. Barb had three State Championships. Barb was voted as Coach of the Year in 1993-94.

After retiring, Barb continues to work as Athletic Director for Valdez City Schools and is active in the community.

The AABC Integrity Award is given annually to an Alaskan coach who has demonstrated the following ideals/characteristics:

Sportsmanship- behavior that is ethical, appropriate, polite, and fair. He/she has followed all of state athletic association rules, and is gracious in victory or defeat.

Leadership- teaches life lessons and model's character traits like honesty, respect, and personal responsibility.

Camaraderie- is a positive force in the coaching community whose interactions with fellow coaches help to promote fellowship and the game of basketball.

Respect- consistently maintains a positive approach in his/her interactions with their own team, game officials, opposing players/coaches, and fans.



Hall of Fame

Craig Jung



Craig Jung began teaching science and coaching girls basketball at Kenai Central High School in 1976. For the next 23 years, Craig pushed his teams to be the best they could be. During his coaching career he was honored four times as Region III Coach of the Year. He was also Alaska State 4A Coach of the Year in 1991.

His team won the State 4A Girls basketball title that year as well. He won 2 region titles and qualified for State 8 times.

Craig was an intense coach, quick to correct but just as quick to congratulate. His players thrived under his coaching style. During

his coaching career Craig coached many talented athletes that became members of the NLC first team All-Conference teams, as well as, All-State teams. He also had many of his players go on to play college basketball, most notably, Stacia Rustad and Mendy Benson, both of whom played and graduated from DIVISION 1 universities in the Mid 90's.

Coach Jung retired from teaching in 1991 and officially retired from coaching in 2017.

He was also inducted into the ASAA Hall of Fame in 2012 and was a recipient of the Gold Lifetime Pass in 2012 as well.

Jeannie Hebert-Truax

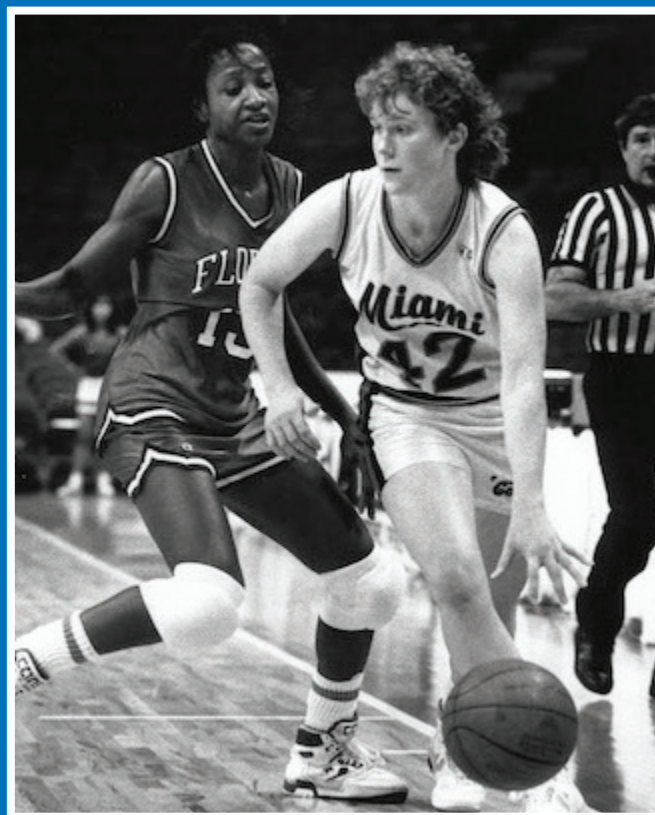


Six state championships as a coach.
Three Alaska player of the year awards.
Two state championships as a player.
One NCAA Division 1 All-America Award

Do the math and you get a snapshot of Jeannie Hebert-Truax's athletic career.

A game-changer at every level, Hebert-Truax is one of Alaska's greatest high school players, one of its greatest college players and one of its greatest high school coaches. She was the first player, boy or girl, to win three Alaska prep player of the year awards, claiming the first while at North Pole High School and the second two while at Monroe Catholic, where she led the Rams to consecutive state titles in 1987 and 1988.

Those accomplishments earned her a spot in the Alaska High School Hall of Fame.





“The Game-Changer”

The Miami Hurricanes won the recruiting war for the 5-foot-8 play-making guard, and Hebert-Truax did not disappoint. By the time she graduated, she ranked second in program history in assists (694), third in scoring (1,766) and fourth in steals (237), plus she helped Miami to its first NCAA tournament berth in 1989.

Those accomplishments earned her a spot in the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame.

Armed with two masters degrees, she returned to Alaska, where Wasilla High hired her in 1994 to teach math. The next year she became the school’s head girls coach. In 2007, she led the Warriors to a state championship, and from 2011-2014 she guided them to three in a row. Through 19 seasons, she and the Warriors won 74 percent of their games.

Those accomplishments – plus the stellar high school and stellar college career – landed her in the Alaska Sports Hall of Fame. She is the first woman enshrined for the sport of basketball.

Hebert-Truax is a made-in-Alaska success story – she was born in Glennallen, raised in Tok, went to high school in Fairbanks and became a championship coach in Wasilla.

“I’ve gone through life and worked hard at what I did, and I think all these accolades have just come from that,” she said. “It’s just what my mom and dad engraved in me. If you want to achieve something you go out and work for it.”

Hall of Fame

George T. Roderick



After serving two years in the US Army, Ft. Wainwright, Alaska, George T. Roderick was hired as head basketball coach/athletic director at Monroe High School in 1971. During the following five years, Coach Roderick's Rams won four conference titles including three third place finishes and one runner up at the State Championships. During the 1973 season, MHS completed the campaign with a 30-3 record including a first ever 9-1 Christmas basketball trip to the Hawaiian Islands. From 1971-1976, the Rams compiled a 118-36 won-loss record, often competing against the large schools in Alaska and many out-of-state teams. The Rams won numerous tournaments that featured out-of-state teams. During Coach Roderick's years at Monroe, the Rams moved from Class B (small schools) regional alignment to competing in regionals that included the larger schools in the State.

The spring of 1976 Coach Roderick accepted an assistant men's basketball position at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, which was the beginning of a 20 year career, eight as an assistant & 12 as head men's basketball coach. During Coach Roderick tenure, the Nanook basketball program elevated from NAIA to NCAA Division 2 competition. In 1989 the Nanooks captured the school's first ever Great Northwest Championship and a trip to the NCAA regional play offs. The team finished rated #1 in the region and Roderick was awarded conference and regional Coach of the Year.

Prior to retiring in 1996, Coach Roderick founded and named the Top of the World Classic basketball tournament featuring 7 Division 1 teams and host UAF Nanooks, and also served as it's tournament director for seven years. Due to NCAA rule changes, the tournament was discontinued after 12 successful years.

Fairbanks, UAF, the basketball program as well as the State of Alaska received national recognition and exposure.

Coach Roderick and his wife Joanie are retired and live on a golf course in New Braunfels, Texas.



Hall of Fame

Joe Tremarello

Joe Tremarello moved to Alaska in the summer of 1950. His father was in the Army and was stationed at Ladd Field.

Joe was on the Fairbanks High School varsity basketball team for the next three years. By his junior year, he was described as one of the “shortest starting forwards in the league” and a “sharp-shooter.” That year the Malemites lost the Western Alaska title to Anchorage by one point. “Joey” was named to the 1952 Western Alaska Class A All-Tournament team.

In the 1952-53 season, the Malemites beat Anchorage twice in the double elimination tournament for the Western Alaska title and swept Douglas High School in three games for the Territorial Class A championship. Joe was captain of the team and won the First National Bank of Anchorage Sportsmanship trophy as well as the Fairbanks Daily News-Miner Sportsmanship trophy.

He attended Eastern Washington College of Education for one year and then returned to Alaska and enrolled at the University of Alaska in 1954. He was a starter on the UA basketball team for 4 years and was captain of the team that won its first intercollegiate game on December 23, 1957, beating EWCE by one point, 71-70.

Joe graduated from the university in 1958 with a Bachelor of Education degree.

For the next two years he taught sixth grade and coached the UA junior varsity basketball team.

In 1960, he began teaching and coaching at Lathrop High School. Besides a full teaching load, initially he coached track and the junior varsity and varsity basketball teams. He led the Lathrop Malemites to a state championship in 1964 and state runner-up in 1966. He compiled a 141-31 record in his seven years as coach at Lathrop. He continued to teach at Lathrop until 1970.

He earned a Master of Education degree from UAF in 1968.

Joe served as director of housing at UAF from 1970-1972. From the fall of 1972 until his retirement from the school district in 1984, he was teacher and later principal at the Fairbanks Alternative High School. All during this time he sponsored and played on a successful city league basketball team.

He was a member of the coaching staff of the UAF women’s basketball team for 7 years and served as head coach for four years. After 6 wins and 21 losses the previous year, his 1991-92 team finished with 18 wins and 6 losses, the best record in UAF women’s basketball history up to that time. At the end of the season he was named NCAA Continental Divide Conference Coach of the Year. From 1995-2012, Joe was associated with the Lathrop High School boys’ basketball team, initially as “official” assistant coach, and, for the majority of the time, as a very dedicated volunteer assistant coach.

Joe was awarded the UAF Alumni Achievement Award in 1991 and was inducted into the UAF Athletic Hall of Fame as a member of the first class. He also was awarded the Fairbanks North Star Borough Recognition of Excellence in 1996.

Joe Tremarello resided in Fairbanks for nearly 63 years with a successful career as an elementary and high school teacher and coach, high school principal, UAF Student Housing Director, UAF women’s basketball coach, businessman and sponsor of city and youth sports. His dedication to Lathrop High School basketball is legendary.

Coach T’s Celebration of Life was held September 23, 2012 at the Davis Concert Hall on the UAF Campus.

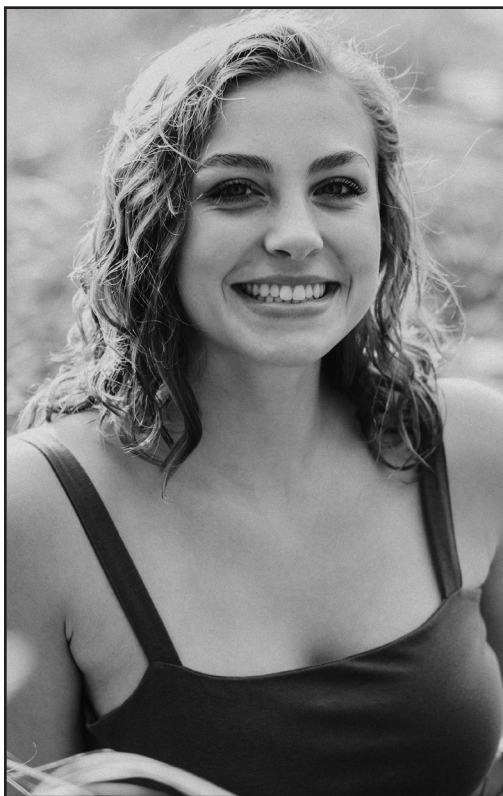

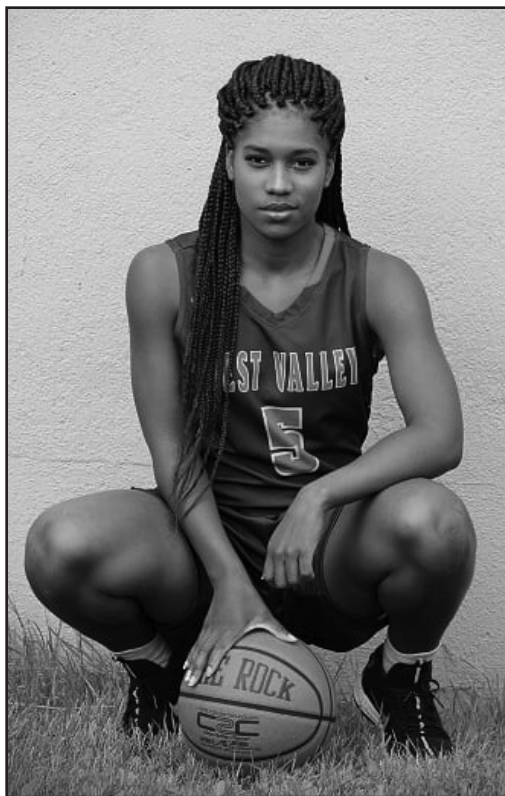

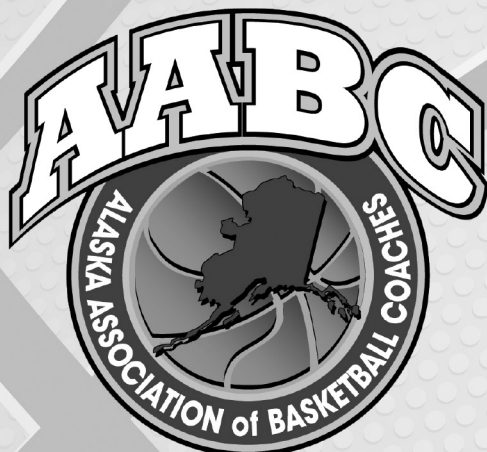

She is also the first Galena girls player to reach 1,000 points since former Galena standout Jenna Buchanan, the 2012 3A girls player of the year, hit the milestone. Buchanan also played college basketball at UAA.

"I think she has dreams to follow in Jenna's footsteps," Wightman said.

Wightman said Green excels on and off the court. Green currently carries a 4.0 grade point average.

"She's just a great kid. Positive attitude, very coachable," Wightman said.

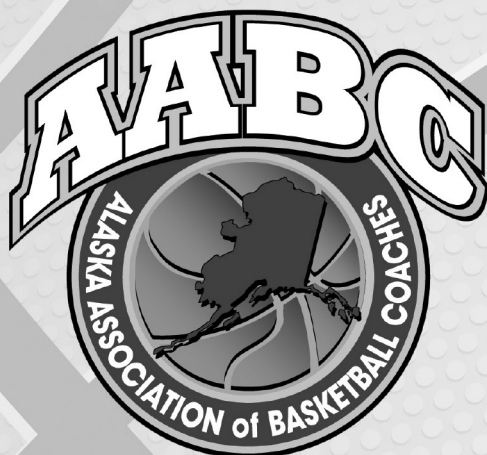

Dimond star named state's top player for third straight year

Another year, another batch of honors for Dimond star Alissa Pili.

About two weeks after she was named the Gatorade Alaska Girls' Basketball Player of the Year for the third straight year, Pili has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches for the third consecutive season.

"Alissa Pili is a fantastic basketball player," South Anchorage head coach Larry Wilson said in a press release issued by Gatorade. "She's a great scorer, she grabs a lot of rebounds and she's stronger than everybody. What gets overshadowed by all of the points is her passing, which is the best I've seen up here."

Pili also passed the former leading scorer in Alaska girls' basketball history in February. Former Chugiak standout Brit Jacobson had held the state's career scoring mark with 2,290 total points. But Pili coasted by that and has spent the final weeks of the season building herself a cushion at the top of the list.

Pili, who helped the defending state champion Lynx earn the No. 1 seed in the 2019 4A state tournament, is averaging 28 points and 16 rebounds as a senior.

This is also the fourth straight year Pili has earned first-team all-state honors.

Pili is also among a handful of Alaska seniors prepared to make the jump to the Division I level next year. Pili has signed her National Letter of Intent to play for Southern California.

Anchorage Christian's top shooter named state's top player

It doesn't take long to figure at least one thing out about Orlando Lozano.

The Anchorage Christian School senior can shoot the basketball.

"If we're just doing a shooting contest, I'm picking him," ACS head coach Zack Madren said.

Madren said he honestly could not think of a better pure shooter than Lozano in the state right now. But there is more to Lozano's game than just shooting, and coaches across the state have recognized that. Lozano has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Boys Player of the Year.

Lozano enters the state tournament leading his team with an average of 17 points per game, according to statistics on asaa365.com. He has nearly 400 total points this season, and the majority have come from beyond the arc. Lozano has hit 91 threes, while shooting about 45 percent from three. Madren said of Lozano's overall growth and maturity as a player includes his shot selection.

"He used to just jack'm," Madren said. "Now he picks and chooses his best time to shoot."

It's obviously no secret that Lozano can shoot the ball, Madren said, and the Lions take that into consideration.

"I know a lot of other coaches game plan for that" Madren said. "Many times we've used him as a decoy, and he's happy to do it."

Lozano is also second on his team with 70 assists.

"He's a team-first guy," Madren said. "He could very easily want to dominate the basketball, take the most shots. He's very unselfish, very willing to make that extra pass."

Madren said Lozano brings a confidence to the floor stemming from the time he has put in.

"He puts in a lot of work in the offseason, a lot of work in practice and on his own time," Madren said.

Lozano has also shown a great deal of maturity as a senior.

"He calms us down," Madren said. "He's a great teammate on and off the floor."

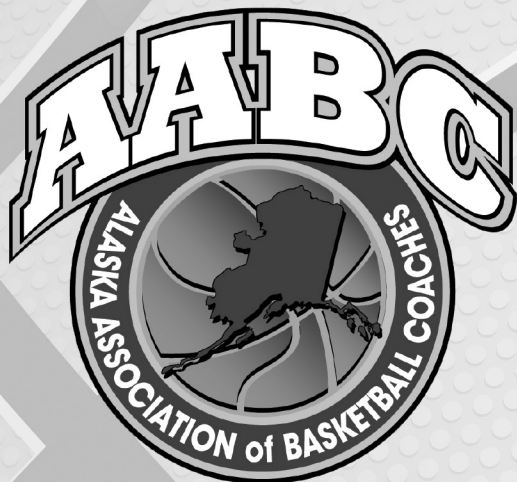

Colony High senior Sullivan Menard has been named the Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year.

PALMER — Sullivan Menard has all of the skills necessary to play basketball at a high level, Colony head coach Tom Berg said. But the Knights mentor said there is something that separates his senior standout from the remainder of the pack.

"A lot of guys have the skills, but he does it in a more intense way," Berg said. "His motor and attitude is what puts him over the top. It's what makes him elite." And that tenacity is a reason the Colony senior has garnered an illustrious honor. Menard has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 4A Boys Player of the year. This comes days after Menard earned Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year honors.

"He does it faster than most other guys. When you think about really good players, what separates is his intensity, energy, effort and intuition. He has all of those traits." Berg also praised the basketball IQ of Menard, who also boasts a 4.02 grade point average off the court.

Menard, a 6-foot-3 and 180-pound senior, is averaging 15.8 points, 5.1 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 3.1 steals. He helped the Knights score the No. 2 seed in the 4A state tournament, which starts Thursday in Anchorage.

"Menard can score, rebound, pass and he's a little gritty," West head coach Josh Muehlenkamp said in the press release issued by Gatorade Friday. "He plays and competes the whole tie, and he's got a real edge to him.

He's long and athletic and he really gets after it on the defensive end too."

Menard has committed to play basketball for Division I DePaul. Menard has a spot as a preferred walk-on for the Chicago, Illinois, school that competes in the Big East Conference.
