Dear Alaskan athletes,

I attended the AABC Senior All-star Game and Exposure camp in April 2014. It is one of the best decisions I could have made. I started playing basketball in kindergarten and started to take it seriously in 6th grade. The teamwork, competition, pressure, excitement, and constant strive for improvement are all pieces of basketball I love. When senior year came, I was not sure what to do. I was not ready to give up basketball and I did not have enough money to get through college without loans. That's when my coach, Bea Klaich, convinced me to participate in the exposure camp. There I met Deb Castle and was introduced to Steve Epperson and the Cardinal family.

Participating in the Skagit Valley basketball program was amazing. I learned a lot and made lifelong friends. Whichever college you choose to attend, I hope that you set yourself up for success on and off the court. Teller junior earns first-team honors for second straight year

Teller head coach Eric Boring describes Lindsay Weyanna as a point-center. It's not something you'll often find at larger schools in Alaska. But for a 1A program, it can be a dominant combination. Weyanna has established herself as one of the top players at the 1A level. And she's only a junior.

Weyanna has been named to the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Girls All-State first-team for the second straight year.

"She's the team's strongest ball handler and she is our best player in the post," Boring said recently.

Boring said the 5-foot-8 junior stands out across the court for his squad.

"Lindsay is an extremely aggressive player. She doesn't shy away from contact on either end of the court. She boxes out well on defense and goes to the free throw line a lot on offense," Boring said.

Weyanna averages a double-double for her team, with team-high 19 points and 10 rebounds per contest. She's a force inside, but has also expanded her game to the perimeter.

"Lindsay has a big impact on the game. She is consistently drawing double and triple team when she goes to the basket," Boring said. "She can also step out and hit threes."



Boring said Weyanna has been active in volleyball in the past, but opted to focus on basketball, and also praised her as a person

"Lindsay is a great kid off the court. She is always on the honor roll and is a great role model for the younger kids in the community," Boring said.

After filling the void left by 2017 state player of the year, Bristol Bay guard named 2A's best in 2018

Lyon said Hansen has competed in swimming and volleyball in the past, but her focus in athletics is on the sport of basketball.

"She's one of the girls who wants to be in the gym," Lyon said.

Off the court, Lyon said Hansen excels in the classroom.

"She's a good student," Lyon said.

Overall, Lyon said Hansen sets a good example. "I wish I could have five of her on the court," Lyon said.

Scammon Bay junior makes a difference in the paint

Jeremy Brink doesn't just occupy space inside, Scammon Bay head coach Harley Sundown said, Brink can change the game. After leading Scammon Bay to the Yukon-Delta title and another trip to state, Brink, a Scammon Bay junior, has been named first-team on the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Boys All-State Team.

On the offensive side, Sundown said Brink's play in the low post opens up Scammon Bay's inside-outside game.



"Teams collapse on him," Sundown said.

And that opens up opportunities for Brink's teammates, Sundown said.

Just a junior, Sundown said, Brink is still growing as a player.

Literally and figuratively.

Sundown also praised Brink off the court.

"He's a real good student as well as a very good community member in our village," Sundown said. "He doesn't do anything that's at-risk behavior. He's very respectful. He's very talkative, a really well-rounded student."

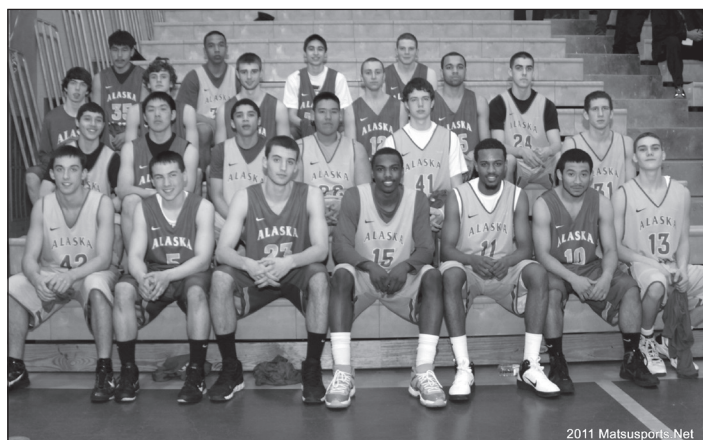

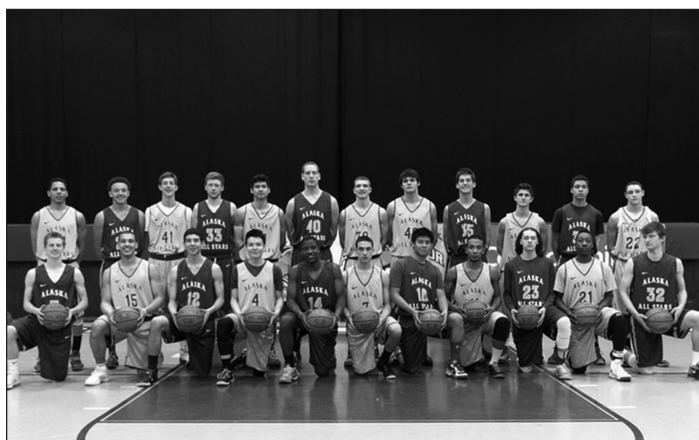

This is Miller's second all-freshman team honor; he was also named to the South Atlantic Conference's newcomer list and earned SAC Freshman of the Year. .

DaJonee Hale

Central Methodist University

2013 AABC All-Star

As a senior, DeJonee "Nene" Hale left her mark on Central Methodist University. The senior guard, from Anchorage, Alaska, was nominated National Player of the Year, along with National Player of the Week, 2x Heart of the Player of the Year, 3x NAIA All American, and 3x Heart 1st Team All-Conference. In 28 games, Hale averaged 22.8 points per game, 87.4% from free throw line, and 3.0 three-pointers per game. She became Central Methodist's all-time leading scorer with 2,109 points, being the first ever 2,000 points scorer. She broke the record against Avila University and tied the record for most free throws made in a game with 17. In her last game at Central Methodist University, Hale scored 50 points during the game to ice the cake on her career. She wrapped up her career with 2,109 points, 499 rebounds, 260 assists, 173 steals and 233 made three pointers.



Nathan Fromm

Western Wyoming Community College

2017 AABC All-Star

As a freshman, Nathan Fromm dominated the court at Western Wyoming Community College. The shooting guard graduated from Anchorage, Alaska in 2017. In 28 games, Fromm had an impressive average of 20 points per game, 51.4% field goal percentage, 45.1% from the three point line, and 74.8% from the free throw line. Starting all 28 games, he also had 6.0 rebounds per game, 60 turnovers, and 58 assists.



Hall of Fame

Don Witzel



Don Witzel has dedicated his life to coaching the game of basketball. In 15 seasons as the head girls basketball coach at Colony High School, Coach Witzel amassed a 308-117 record and has a career record of 337-117. During his tenure at Colony High School he lead his teams to 7 state title games and came away with 4 state championships. Coach Witzel was also selected as the Alaska 4A girls coach of the year twice in 1998 and 2008. He was also named the Northern Lights Coach of the year three times (1997, 2000 & 2005). During his tenure, he had the opportunity to coach Gatorade Player of the Year, Parade all-American and NBA star Jessica Moore.

In addition to coaching, Don Witzel has been a member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and served on the following national committees: The WBCA High School All-American Selection Committee and the WBCA national coach of the year committees from 1998-2004. In 2008 he was honored with being inducted into the WBCA's 300 Victory Award Club.

Coach Witzel's success and dedication to his athletes and the game of basketball not only at the state level but at the national level is unparalleled. Those who coached against Don Witzel would say he coached with integrity and class. He has had a lasting impact on all of his players and those who know him.



Hall of Carlos

Carlos Boozer's game was born in the NBA.

Boozer blossomed into one of the greatest basketball players of his first NBA All-Star nod in 2007 and greatest basketball player. He worked power forwards, joining Tim Duncan. The 6-foot-9 Boozer was a beast inside the paint, with a tattoo on his left shoulder.

At Juneau-Douglas High School, he helped the Crimson Bears compile a Class 4A state titles in 1997 and 1999. He was named American and turned heads in the pro game with 22 points and 11 rebounds.

At Duke University, he became a star. He helped the Blue Devils win the national title before turning professional after his senior season.

For most of his early basketball career, he was overshadowed by Anchorage's Trajan Langdon. Langdon was the state's first pro NBA player. But the tide turned in late 2006 when Boozer took the mantle as Alaska's greatest.

Boozer wasn't just Alaska's best player. He signed a five-year deal with the Chicago Bulls for \$10 million. He played in the NBA until 2013, averaging 19.5 rebounds during a 13-year career.

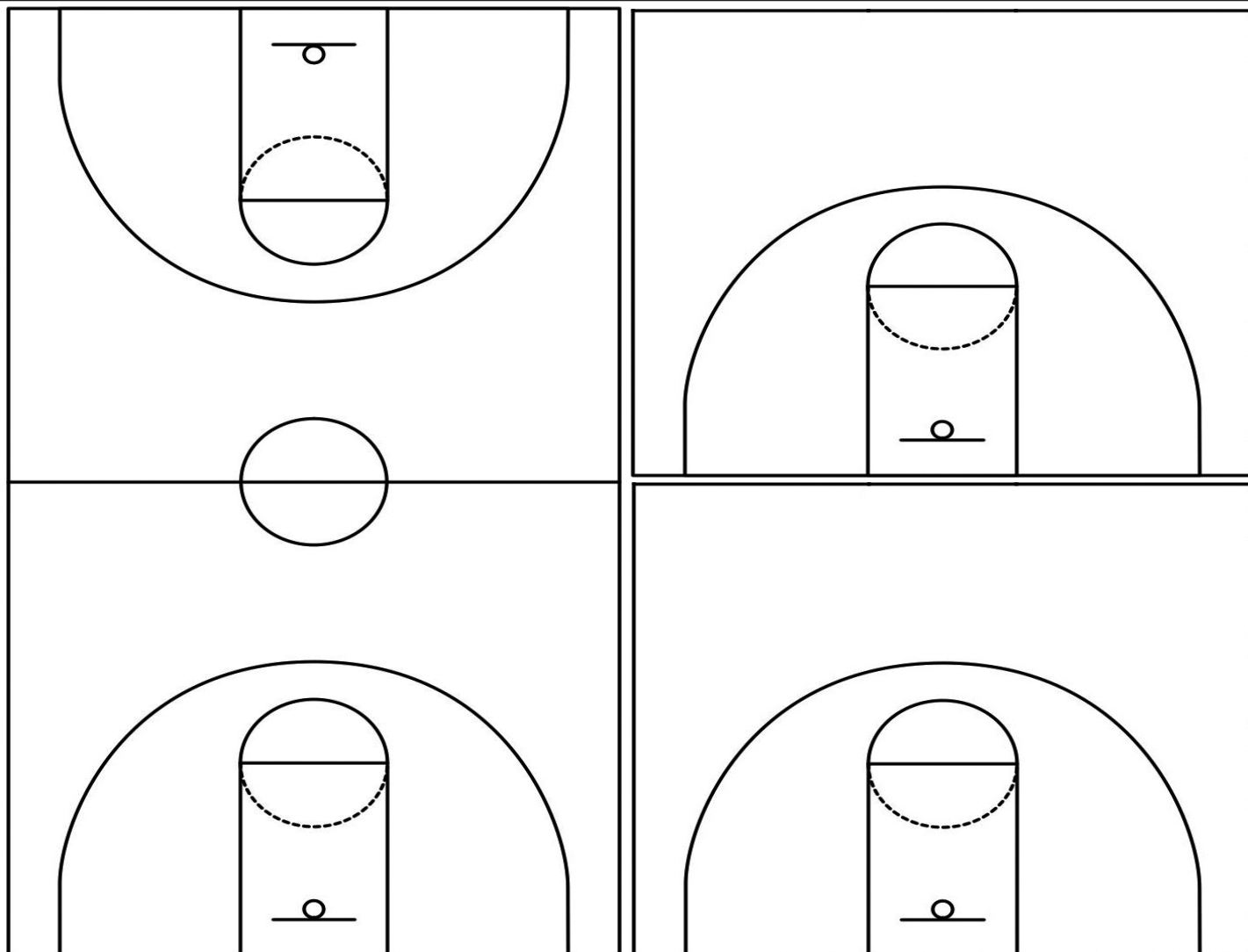

Nikiski junior overcomes two major knee injuries to become 3A's top player

A torn anterior cruciate ligament can be devastating for a basketball player. Bethany Carstens suffered the injury not just once, but twice.

And that didn't stop the Nikiski junior. Carstens worked her way back from both injuries, and is now recognized as one of the top players in the state. Carstens has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Girls Player of the Year.

"Typically you have one injury like that and you're not the same player," Nikiski head coach Scott Anderson said recently. "One of the most impressive things about her is she's come back, trained, and made herself a pretty amazing player."

In just two seasons of high school basketball, Carstens has scored more than 1,000 total points for the Bulldogs. But she had to work through recovering from a major knee injury twice before she put herself in position to reach the milestone. Carstens suffered her first injury prior to her freshman season at Nikiski. As a sophomore, Carstens helped Nikiski established itself as one of the top 3A girls' basketball programs in the state during the 2016-17 season. The Bulldogs were among the contenders for a state title, but on the second day of the Southcentral Conference Championships, Carstens tore the ACL in her other knee. Anderson said the second injury could have derailed Carstens, but her determination wouldn't allow it.

"After the second one, I was shocked at how fast she got back," Anderson said.

Anderson said Carstens' drive and work ethic allowed her to return from the injury faster than expected.



"It comes back to home much she puts into it," Anderson said.

She has the skills. She has the athletic ability. But the work ethic sets her apart Anderson said.

Carstens played in 50 games entering the 2018 conference tournament. She averaged 20.3 points per game as a junior regular season, identical to her average as a sophomore. She also averaged 5.1 rebounds, 4 steals and 3 assists a game. In 50 career games, Carstens has 1,015 points, 390 rebounds, 201 steals and 151 assists.

Local standout nets chance to play college basketball in Colorado

WASILLA — As Azlynn Brandenburg worked through the recruiting process, her older sister, Kasara, a former college basketball player, had some valuable advice.

"She really helped me write a pros and cons list to pick the school, and to realize to not just to focus on the basketball aspect of the school," Brandenburg said. "You spend so much time there. Be clear it's a place you want to be."

For Brandenburg, that place is Grand Junction, Colorado. Brandenburg, who helped the Wasilla Warriors earn back-to-back 4A state girls' basketball titles as a sophomore and junior, will play for Division II Colorado Mesa University next year.

But before she makes the move to the Centennial State, Brandenburg will help her team make a run at the 4A three-peat.

The senior standout has also been named first-team on the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 4A Girls All-State Team.

"I think she really stepped up this year," Wasilla head coach Jeannie Hebert-Truax said. "She had to step up and take over some games."

Brandenburg said she was able to visit the Grand Junction campus, and that helped her make her final decision.

"I felt like I went to a place I could see myself living past the college years," Brandenburg said. "I really felt comfortable there."

The standout shooting guard said she did consider UAA. "The only reason it was a tough decision is UAA has such a good basketball program," she said.

But all along, Brandenburg said she hoped to venture outside of her home state.

"I really like traveling, experiencing new places," Brandenburg said.

Brandenburg, a varsity starter since her freshman season



with the Warriors, has had the opportunity to play with youth traveling basketball teams since about the seventh grade. During the summer prior to her freshman season, Brandenburg started to appear on coaches' radar.

"It was a really good trip. Traveled for a month, got a lot of interest from college coaches," Brandenburg said. Coaches continued to have interest. UAA and Western Oregon were among the Division II schools. Brandenburg said she was also recruited by Division I programs, but the opportunities were mostly invitations to walk on rather than scholarship offers. Throughout the process, Brandenburg worked for the scholarship.

Brandenburg, who currently attends Mat-Su Middle College School, said Mesa is a fit academically. While she said she's not 100 percent sure, Brandenburg may opt to double-major in both business and psychology. She hopes to have her own wellness center in the future. Mesa also presents the chance for Brandenburg to hit the court early in her basketball career.

"They really made it seem like I'll help the program," Brandenburg said. "I want to go into the program helping it. There's a lot of potential for playing time."

3A boys first team includes a pair of UAA recruits

Athletes from Anchorage, the Interior and the north coast are represented on the 3A boys' first-team list. But two of them will share at home at UAA next fall.

A pair of Seawolves recruits — Grace Christian senior Tobin Karlberg and Barrow senior Travis Adams — have been named to the first-team of the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Boys All-State Team.

Karlberg, who was also named the 3A Boys Player of the Year for the second straight season, committed to UAA in November.

"We are excited that Tobin has chosen to join the Seawolf family," UAA head coach Rusty Osborne said in a press release issued by the university. "He is not only an outstanding player, he is a tremendously mature young man with excellent leadership qualities."

Karlberg was also named the Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year after averaging 20.1 points, 4.3 steals and 3.9 assists through the first 25 games of his season. Last week, Karlberg led Grace to a win over Anchorage Christian School in the Southcentral Conference title game. Three days after announcing the signing of Karlberg, UAA announced Adams had inked an intent to play for the Seawolves. Adams enters the 2018 3A state tournament with more than 1,500 career points. This season Adams is averaging



14.6, 5.3 assists and 4.5 assists per game. The 5-foot-10 point guard helped Barrow earn a 3A state title as a freshman and a sophomore.

"Travis is a true point guard with not only basketball skills, but the intangibles of a winner," Osborne said of Adams in a release. "He understands that success of the team is what matters most."

UAA landed an Alaska player of the year for the second straight year. Former Ninilchik standout Austin White, a UAA freshman, was 1A's top player last year. UAA also featured Alaskans Eric Jenkins (Dimond), Ryan Trailer (Bartlett), Alex Adams (South) and Kylan Osborne (Dimond) on the 2017-18 squad.

Palmer senior leaves program as team's all-time leading scorer

Longtime Alaska basketball coach Chuck Martin could make the argument that Palmer standout Clayton Southwick was cursed and blessed during his senior season.

"It's a curse we expect so much out of him," Martin, Palmer's head coach, said recently. "For us to (be successful) Clayton has to be fabulous. But he's got to make his teammates better. Some kids embrace that."

But there's the blessing.

"He continues to work. He's a joy to coach," Martin said. "The two things — he's big, he's talented. And he loves to play. He likes being coached. To have a kid this talented who wanted to be coached, who wants to win, you can't ask for much more from that as a player."

Southwick, who leaves the Palmer boys basketball program as the most prolific scorer in school history, has once again been recognized for his efforts. A week after winning Northern Lights Conference Player of the Year honors for the second time, Southwick has been named first-team on the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 4A Boys All-State team for the second straight year.

Southwick, a four-time first-team All-NLC selection, ruled in just about every statistical category. The 6-foot-7 all-around star scored more than 1,700 points in his career, a school record, but



also finished with 760 rebounds and 302 assists in four years.

"He's just a very talented kid who wants to get better, and loves to play," Martin said. "He's made a tremendous impact for four years."

Southwick amassed the 1,700 career points, but Martin said statistics were never the focus for Southwick.

"Clayton really wants his team to do well," Martin said. "His greatest characteristic, he doesn't care about anything but winning."

Born in Glennallen and raised in Tok, Jeannie Hebert-Truax is one of Alaska's greatest high school players and is well known for her time playing at Miami University (FL). During her high school career, Hebert-Truax was the first player to win three Alaska Player of the Year awards, first at North Pole High School and the second two at Monroe Catholic. She also led her team at Monroe Catholic to two state titles in 1987 and 1988.


By the time Hebert-Truax graduated from Miami University, she ranked second in the program history in assists (694), third in scoring (1,766) and fourth in steals (237). She helped the Hurricanes to their first NCAA tournament berth in 1989. Those accomplishments earned her a spot in the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame.

Armed with two master's degrees, Hebert-Truax returned to Alaska, where Wasilla High hired her in 1994 to teach math. The following year she became the school's head girls coach, and in 2007, she led the Warriors to a state championship, and followed up with three in a row from 2011-2014. Through 19 seasons, Hebert-Truax and the Warriors have won 74 percent of their games.

Hebert-Truax and her husband of 15 years, Mark, have one 12-year-old son, Trent.
