### FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

### God sends us to our neighborhood & community

Last month, we looked at the responsibility that God gives us to share the Gospel message with our families. The next expanding area that we have been called to as Christians is as a witness to our communities.

The first century Christians understood this well. Those who believed in the resurrection of Jesus initially were a small number of people. As the message spread throughout the region, it was spread by faithful families. More than just a spoken belief, however, it became how they lived life. And because of the message, the number of believers increased daily.

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers (Acts 2:42)

This lesson is important for us to understand today. We are not called to be disciples of Christ who live in isolation. We are not just called to share the message with our immediate family members. We are also called to proclaim the saving message of Jesus Christ to those in our close proximity. Both our message and our lives should be a demonstration of our commitment to carrying out that Calling. When we do that faithfully, we trust the Holy Spirit to do the saving work of those around us. As was the case in the early Church, God blesses that faithfulness and the number of saved believers increases. May we be bold enough to declare our willingness to answer that Call (Isaiah 6:8).



### **NEW PHYSICS RECORD SET!**



Right before Christmas break the 2021-22 Physics Students competed in the annual Self-Propelled Car Contest. Students built a car from common materials that moved with its own mechanical power system (no electronics). Setting a new school record this year was Junior Steven Ross. His car rolled 29.79 Meters under its own power system (almost 98 feet)!
