# FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) Why is Jesus' death and resurrection so important?
A) It is the promise of future hope.

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

Hope is a deeply personal emotion. While collectively our hopes may align along some similar themes (physical safety, financial security, prospects for the future), the way in which it looks is often very unique. Our hopes and dreams are based on our current situation and circumstances. Unfortunately, sometimes our hopes don't work out the way we want them to.

The reality is that all of us will ultimately meet our earthly end in death. Our time is limited. All the dreams and aspirations that seem so important to us now will no longer matter. And yet there is one hope that is consistent for all Christians. A hope that does not disappoint. A hope that will not fail. It will endure past our earthly death into an eternal confidence promised to us by Jesus Christ. It is the assurance of Jesus Christ through his sacrifice that is the bedrock of our faith. It is summed up in these words:

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 6:23)

Christians can live their lives banking on this promise. Though we deserve death because of our sins. Our Lord has promised us life – eternal life – in Christ Jesus. That enables believers to live their lives differently. And when others see those differences in our outlook, they may recognize it in us. And when they recognize that, we must be prepared to share the reason for our hope (1 Peter 3:15).

#### Arrival To School

- -The earliest students can enter the building is 7:15.

#### Dress Code

<u>TUITION PLAN</u> to be accepted and enrolled at MLHS.



]	<b>Register for a Placement Exam.</b> Students will register to take the Placement Exam on the online application.
	Take a VIRTUAL Placement Exam at MLHS (upcoming dates are either December 5th or January 23)
	After a Placement Test has been taken, you will receive your test results and a <b>Next Step Letter</b> .  If academically accepted, you will be prompted to finish an enrollment form. To enroll, either log back into your online application or use the link found in your 'New Student Welcome' email.
	Remember to set up a payment plan in February! (see next step)
1	Starting February 1, 2021, apply for a <b>Choice Seat</b> OR set up a <b>Tuition Payment Plan</b> :
	□ Choice: Apply online for a MPCP seat (February 1 – 22, April 1 – 20, July 1 – 20, 2021) or a WPCP seat (February 1, – April 15, 2021). When Choice Seats are filled, a wait list will be started. APPLY EARLY! (see Milwaukee/Wisconsin Parental Choice Programs sheet)
	☐ <b>Tuition</b> : After being academically accepted, enroll & set up a billing agreement. To enroll, either log back into your online application or use the link found in your 'New Student Welcome' email.
	<b>Select Classes.</b> We will contact you in the Spring to sign up for a Freshman Course Selection Night only AFTER <u>Academic Acceptance</u> AND a <u>Choice Seat or Tuition Plan</u> are verified.

# 2021-2022 School Year CHOICE Programs Application Process Begins Soon!

This is a reminder to all our current families that our first MPCP Open Enrollment Period begins February 1, 2021 and ends February 22, 2021 (WPCP is February 1 - April 15, 2021). The online application process remains the same as last year and you will be able to log in starting **MONDAY**, **February 1**, at the following link with the email and password that you used last year: <a href="https://www.dpi.wi.gov/choice">www.dpi.wi.gov/choice</a>

#### **EVERY CURRENT CHOICE STUDENT MUST RE-APPLY EVERY YEAR!**

If you aren't a current Choice family and think that you may qualify for the CHOICE program this year, go to the above link and click on 2021-2022 Income Limits to see if you qualify. It is STRONGLY recommended that you apply for CHOICE during the February open enrollment period, as all our MPCP seats will be filled during that month, and you will be on a wait list if you apply after February – we can NOT guarantee your student a CHOICE seat at Milwaukee Lutheran if you apply during a later open enrollment period! 
