BEFORE SCHOOL

2022-2023 School Year CHOICE Programs Application Process Begins Soon!

This is a reminder to all our current families that our first MPCP Open Enrollment Period begins February 1, 2022 and ends February 21, 2022 (WPCP is February 1 - April 21, 2022). The online application process remains the same as last year and you will be able to log in starting **TUESDAY, February 1**, at the following link with the email and password that you used last year: www.dpi.wi.gov/choice

EVERY CURRENT CHOICE STUDENT MUST RE-APPLY EVERY YEAR!

If you aren't a current Choice family and think that you may qualify for the CHOICE program this year, go to the above link and click on 2022-2023 Income Limits to see if you qualify. It is **STRONGLY** recommended that you apply for CHOICE during the February open enrollment period, as all our MPCP seats will be filled during that month, and you will be on a wait list if you apply after February – we can NOT guarantee your student a CHOICE seat at Milwaukee Lutheran if you apply during a later open enrollment period. Juniors: ACT Prep Opportunity

The ACT is a standardized test that measures a student's skills in five core areas: Math, English, Science, Reading, and Writing. Results from the ACT are reviewed by most colleges as part of the application process. **All Juniors will take the ACT on March 8 as part of state testing.**

In order to help students prepare for the ACT, MLHS will be offering ACT Test Prep Sessions at no cost to our students.

All sessions will be held in the Red Knight Room, beginning promptly at 3:30, concluding promptly at 4:30. Please arrange transportation accordingly.

Students may select one or more sessions as desired.

Since our students come from many parts of the metropolitan area, weather conditions may vary from one area to another. Please use discretion in sending your child to school even though school may be in session. A guideline to use in making your decision would be the decision that your local public school district has made. (Example: If you live in Cedarburg and the Cedarburg school district has closed due to the weather, consider keeping your child home from school that day.)

In the event that a sudden snowstorm forces school to close before the regular closing time, make certain that your child knows exactly where to go and what to do should no one be home during the school day.
