

I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. (John 16:12-14)

And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness. (Acts 4:31)

These two verses show that the Holy Spirit guides us into truth and gives us the courage to share that message with boldness and conviction. 

- 1. Apply now! Take time in October to complete college applications online.
- 2. Notify me (<u>ksteinke@milwaukeelutheran.org</u>) when an application is submitted. I will send your transcript right away!
- 3. Complete the FAFSA found at fafsa.gov. Students MUST complete the FAFSA in order to qualify for federal financial aid. The application opened October 1st

If these steps are completed during October, colleges will typically communicate admissions decisions and financial aid awards before Christmas. This gives families a great head start on making decisions!




