A) He desires all to be saved.


Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

All of us are sinful (*see last week's message*). All of us are incapable of atoning for our sins. Jesus Christ was sent to earth to stand in our place. He is our substitute – a sort of spiritual proxy. He endured not only the everyday challenges that all humans face but the worst suffering and execution that this world could throw at Him. So, the question becomes, why would He be willing to go through this? Why would He willingly endure this when He could have simply stayed in heaven?

From the creation of the world, we were created in God's image. Every one of us bears the image of God. The fall into sin altered that image. God's desire is to repair it. He wants to fix it. He recognizes our inability to account for our sins, but knows that His Son, Jesus Christ, can. His passion is to restore the relationship that we have with God. He desires us to be saved. Saved from eternal death. Saved from sin. Saved from our human desires. Really, saved from ourselves.

This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth (1 Timothy 2:3-4)

This was the only way. The way to save His people – to rescue them – was to take on human flesh. Endure the worst of this world. Triumph over evil and restore all people who believe to a right relationship with Him. It is that sacrifice which reveals the truth. It is His resurrection and the promise of eternal life in a restored relationship with Him that informs our hope (1 Peter 3:15).



Help Needed This year we are changing things up for the bake sale to make things easier. If you are able to help bake, please use the sign-up genius below. If you need a copy of the MLHS approved recipe, please let us know & we will email it to you. The recipes are easy; three don't even require baking! Since we're all at home at least part of the week, making the treats to sell is a fun way to contribute—even for those who can't be in school at this time. Here are some notes about it:

- -Everything must be homemade, following the recipe for consistency. (Please let us know if you need a copy.)
- -Please make your treat no sooner than the day before the Craft Fair we want as fresh as possible!
- -Put your batch of wrapped items in a large ziploc. Rice Krispy treats dry out so quickly!!
- -Do not wrap items until the chocolate is hard so the wrap won't get smeared.
- -Make sure items are completely cooled so they don't get too soft from trapped moisture.
- -If your treat must be made ahead of time, choose Chex Mix or Puppy Chow.


