FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) Why did Jesus need to come to Earth?A) Sin required a sacrifice...and only Christ could be the atoning sacrifice

Adam Kirsch Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

After God delivered His people from slavery in Egypt, He wanted to set His people apart. He wanted them to be different from the other nations of the world. God established a covenant relationship with the Israelites. They would be blessed as long as they kept the requirements that God commanded. Part of that covenant dictated what was expected of the Israelites – including the necessity of a blood sacrifice. In order to atone for their sins, God's people would offer animal sacrifices in the tabernacle. This was their way of showing that they were sorry and repentant of their sins.

Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. (Hebrews 9:22)

When Jesus came as the Savior, He broke the old covenant requirements. Sin still requires a sacrifice. But Jesus Christ fulfilled the sacrifice requirements for all time and for all people. Instead of the requirement to sacrifice animals on the altar to God, Jesus Christ became the once-and-for-all sacrifice. His death fulfilled the obligation. No longer would God's people be required to sacrifice animals for the forgiveness of sins. It was bought through the blood of Jesus Christ.

In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace. (Ephesians 1:7)

We are the recipients of that gift. We enjoy the benefits of a Savior who sacrificed himself for you and for me. His blood has purchased our forgiveness. It has given us life. It is our hope (1 Peter 3:15)

Milwaukee Lutheran has experienced a decrease in face-to-face student attendance the last few days due to a number of factors. Additionally, we have seen an increase in the number of our faculty who have been required to isolate due to contact with individuals who have tested positive for COVID. As a preventative effort, we have proactively decided to close face-to-face instruction for the week of November 16-20. Learning will be remote for all students. This change will essentially affect two weeks as the week of November 23-27 was already planned for remote learning only with Wednesday to Friday off for Thanksgiving Break. Details regarding any extracurricular activities will be communicated by the leader or coach. Our plans remain in place to return to face-to-face instruction starting the week of November 30 and for the remainder of December until the end of the semester.

Help Needed This year we are changing things up for the bake sale to make things easier. If you are able to help bake, please use the sign-up genius below. If you need a copy of the MLHS approved recipe, please let us know & we will email it to you. The recipes are easy; three don't even require baking! Since we're all at home at least part of the week, making the treats to sell is a fun way to contribute—even for those who can't be in school at this time. Here are some notes about it:

-Everything must be homemade, following the recipe for consistency. (Please let us know if you need a copy.)

-Please make your treat no sooner than the day before the Craft Fair - we want as fresh as possible!

-Put your batch of wrapped items in a large ziploc. Rice Krispy treats dry out so quickly!!

-Do not wrap items until the chocolate is hard so the wrap won't get smeared.

-Make sure items are completely cooled so they don't get too soft from trapped moisture.

-If your treat must be made ahead of time, choose Chex Mix or Puppy Chow.
