FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

God sends us to our families

Throughout the first semester we have broken down our theme for the year into various parts – who sends us and how we are equipped for the task. Over the next few weeks, we look at who God sends us to.

We live in a globally connected world through technology and an ease of mobility, but first century people had a very different experience. Travel was slow and difficult, and messages took time to spread across the globe. Nevertheless, Jesus gives a powerful calling, and prediction, to His disciples after His resurrection.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Acts 1:8

His disciples would respond to that calling and spread the Gospel message to all lands. But it started first at home. The people living near were often family members and relatives. The Church started by sharing the message of a resurrected Jesus, as recorded in the first chapters of Acts, with family members and households.

Though the world has in many ways changed, one of the first calls we receive is to ensure that the next generation hears the message of salvation through Jesus Christ. We have a responsibility to our children and grandchildren to be witnesses.

He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children, that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God. Psalm 78:5-7

- Students must report to each final period at the assigned time for each core class or for other courses that have an assigned final.
- Students must be in school dress code on finals days.
- Students are allowed to arrive immediately prior to their first final of the day and are allowed to leave after their last final of the day. Students who are leaving must leave campus, not just the building. If a student has a break in finals during their day, they must report to their assigned class – even if that teacher has not assigned a final exam.
- Students that arrive early for a final while other finals are in session will be directed to the cafeteria without stopping at their locker.
- All study halls will meet in the cafeteria. The study center will be available for students to quietly work, but they must be issued a pass from a teacher to work in there.
- All students are required to be in the classroom for the entire hour of the final exam. Anyone that is tardy without a pass from the main office to their class will be sent to the attendance office and required to take their final at an alternate time or receive a zero if not rescheduled.
- Students must take care of any financial obligations prior to taking their first final each day. Students should check the lists posted outside the main office to see if they owe any money. If students do not take care of obligations, they will have to take their exams at a rescheduled time.

1. Apply now! Take time to complete college applications online.
2. Notify me (ksteinke@milwaukeeelutheran.org) when an application is submitted. I will send your transcript right away!
3. Complete the FAFSA found at fafsa.gov. Students MUST complete the FAFSA in order to qualify for federal financial aid. The application opened October 1st
4. An updated Scholarship List can be found in Schoology. Go to “Courses,” select “Red Knight Vault: Class of 2022,” and click on “Scholarships.”
