### FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) How do we know that Jesus was raised from the dead?

A) It is the foundation of our faith

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

The question we are looking at over the next few weeks is really the most important to consider. Why does the resurrection matter? What significance did it have then and why should we be so focused on it almost 2,000 years later. This single event, the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead after being put to death, is the core of our faith. If Jesus had died and not raised from the dead, He would have been a great martyr. However, the evidence shows that He did rise after three days in the tomb. That resurrection showed that God even has power over unnatural things in our world. That power revealed that He is God. And because He is God, we should worship Him.

If Christ had not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. (1 Corinthians 15:17-18)

Our faith is based on the resurrection. If Christ didn't rise, we are still in our sins and will have to face the consequences. We quickly realize that we can't fulfill the requirements on our own merits. Without the grace of God, we will all perish. To be a Christian means that we must believe in the resurrection. Without the resurrection we have no benefit of the gifts Christ offers. However, with the resurrection we have hope (1 Peter 3:15).

### Checklist to Become a Red Knight

MILWAUKEE LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL 2021-2022 School Year

ALL STEPS must be completed for your child to attend MLHS.

You need both ACADEMIC ACCEPTANCE and a CHOICE SEAT or TUITION PLAN to be accepted and enrolled at MLHS.

- Complete an online application at www.milwaukeelutheran.org. Click on Admissions tab at the top and "Get Started."
- Register for a Placement Exam. Students will register to take the Placement Exam on the online application
- Take a VIRTUAL Placement Exam at MLHS
- After a Placement Test has been taken, you will receive your test

results and a Next Step Letter.

If academically accepted, you will be prompted to finish an enrollment form. To enroll, either log back into your online application or use the link found in your 'New Student Welcome' email.

Remember to set up a payment plan in February! (see next step)

- Starting February 1, 2021, apply for a Choice Seat OR set up a **Tuition Payment Plan:** 
  - □ Choice: Apply online for a MPCP seat (February 1 22, April 1 20, July 1 20, 2021) or a WPCP seat (February 1, – April 15, 2021). When Choice Seats are filled, a wait list will be started.

    APPLY EARLY! (see Milwaukee/Wisconsin Parental Choice Programs sheet)
  - ☐ Tuition: After being academically accepted, enroll & set up a billing agreement. To enroll, either log back into your online application or use the link found in your 'New Student Welcome' email.
- Select Classes. We will contact you in the Spring to sign up for a Freshman Course Selection Night only AFTER Academic Acceptance AND a Choice Seat or Tuition Plan are verified.
