FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) Why is Jesus' death and resurrection so important? A) In Song

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

"Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise. The gift of language combined with the gift of song was given to man that he should proclaim the Word of God through Music." (Martin Luther). This quote illustrates the importance and power of music from the perspective of one of our church fathers. Song, along with prayer, was a way to communicate with our Heavenly Father. He hears our prayers and He hears our voices as they bring praise to Him.

Often we get wrapped up in the style of songs or quality of singers in our worship. While it is important for all of us to use our gifts well, including in the area of singing, it is more important to faithfully reveal our heart.

Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, bless His name; tell of His salvation from day to day. (Psalm 96:1-2)

Song is one of the powerful opportunities to proclaim the power of God. It recognizes how God receives our songs – as a blessing of who He is and as a proclamation of Christ's redemptive action. It tells the story of who God is. It reminds us of the promises He has given to us. Songs can quiet an anxious soul, give comfort to the grieving, and give platform for rejoicing in thanksgiving. May we sing with confidence to God and faithfully sing of the hope that we have in Jesus Christ (1 Peter 3:15).

State Required ACT Testing for Juniors

The state is moving forward with required state testing this spring. The statewide ACT test date required for juniors is Tuesday, March 9^{th} , 8:00 am -1:00 pm. Due to size limits, we won't be able to space our students out enough to continue to have regular classes going on at the same time that we are testing. Therefore, ONLY JUNIORS should report to school on Tuesday, March 9^{th} , 8:00 am -1:00 pm. Snacks will be provided. There is no lunch at school that day.

All JUNIORS, <u>including remote students</u>, are required to attend the statewide ACT testing. Social distancing guidelines will be observed.

The deadline for re-enrollment for the Choice program is February 22. All families need to complete this to secure a seat for next school year.

According to our plan that we submitted to the Milwaukee Health Dept., our building is open to students from 7:15-4:15. With it being colder outside, it is very important that students are picked up from school before 4:15.

Arrival To School

- -The earliest students can enter the building is 7:15.
- -Please aim for arrival by 7:50 as classes begin at 8:00. Students need to be on time.

Dress Code

- -Masks must be worn in the building. If a student is a repeat offender of not bringing a mask to school, they will be charged \$2 for a mask.
- -Rips/Tears/Frays are not allowed in jeans or any other clothing
- -No writing on shirts is allowed unless it is a Christian message, a team/school, or a name brand. T-shirts with musicians, movies, and tv shows are not allowed.

ALL STEPS must be completed for your child to attend MLHS.

You need both <u>ACADEMIC ACCEPTANCE</u> and a <u>CHOICE SEAT or</u>
<u>TUITION PLAN</u> to be accepted and enrolled at MLHS.

Complete an online application at www.milwaukeelutheran.org . Click on Admissions tab at the top and "Get Started."
Register for a Placement Exam. Students will register to take the Placement Exam on the online application.
Take a VIRTUAL Placement Exam at MLHS (upcoming dates are either December 5th or January 23)
After a Placement Test has been taken, you will receive your test results and a Next Step Letter . If academically accepted, you will be prompted to finish an enrollment form. To enroll, either log back into your online application or use the link found in your 'New Student Welcome' email.
Remember to set up a payment plan in February! (see next step)
Starting February 1, 2021, apply for a Choice Seat OR set up a Tuition Payment Plan :
□ Choice: Apply online for a MPCP seat (February 1 – 22, April 1 – 20, July 1 – 20, 2021) or a WPCP seat (February 1, – April 15, 2021). When Choice Seats are filled, a wait list will be started. APPLY EARLY! (see Milwaukee/Wisconsin Parental Choice Programs sheet)
☐ Tuition : After being academically accepted, enroll & set up a billing agreement. To enroll, either log back into your online application or use the link found in your 'New Student Welcome' email.
Select Classes. We will contact you in the Spring to sign up for a Freshman Course Selection Night only AFTER <u>Academic Acceptance</u> AND a <u>Choice Seat or Tuition Plan</u> are verified.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

TO: Parents of all Students, Faculty and Staff, Leaders of All Auxiliary Organizations, Lutheran Special School Parents and Staff

Each year we are required to let you know what we are doing to comply with the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). As we informed you in the past, we do have some asbestos—containing materials in the school. At this time we need to update your concerning the status of our management plan, the periodic surveillance that we conduct and the response actions we have taken.

Management Plan: Our management plan is on file with the State of Wisconsin. Copies are kept at each school. You may arrange to see the management plan by contacting me at (414) 461-2927.

Periodic Surveillance: We inspect all asbestos containing materials every six months to be sure they are still in good condition. Inspections are done in January and July. As required by law, professional inspection and update of the management plan are done every three years. Records of inspections are maintained in the office of the Director of Buildings and Properties. You may arrange to see them by contacting me at (414) 461-2927.

Response Actions: Our maintenance staff performs what are called "operations and maintenance" actions in dealing with our asbestos-containing materials. These response actions assure that the asbestos containing materials remain in a safe and undamaged condition and allow the Maintenance Department to make any necessary small-scale repairs. Larger scale projects in the past have been professionally abated in accordance with AHERA standards. Records of these actions are kept with the management plan. You may arrange to see them by contacting me at (414) 461-2927.

It is our intent to comply fully with the law and to provide students, faculty, staff, and guests with a safe and healthy building. I will be glad to answer any questions or address any concerns that any of you may have about asbestos in our building.
