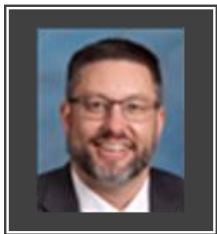

FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

God sends us when we are not prepared

Preparing for the worst is something build into us. When threats of a winter storm emerge, individuals flock to stores to stock up on essentials. When we must have a difficult conversation, we may anticipate a negative response and psych ourselves up for the worst-case scenario. For some people, this pessimistic view can dominate – and destroy confidence.

As Christians, similar doubts can enter our mind when we examine our Calling. We don't have all the preparation we think we need. We don't have the answers to every question we might encounter. What if the message is not received well?

And when they bring you before the synagogues and the rulers and the authorities, do not be anxious about how you should defend yourself or what you should say, for the Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say. (Luke 12:11-12)

Despite all of our doubts and insecurities, God gives us assurance throughout Scripture that He will meet our needs. When He sends us He also equips us. When we feel like we are not prepared, God sends us with His authority, His power, and His message. Our response is to be that vessel useful for God's purpose. May we overcome our apprehension and fear, by God's power, to be faithful in our Calling (*Isaiah 6:8*).

It is **STRONGLY** recommended that you apply for CHOICE during the February open enrollment period, as all our MPCP seats will be filled during that month, and you will be on a wait list if you apply after February – we can NOT guarantee your student a CHOICE seat at Milwaukee Lutheran if you apply during a later open enrollment period. 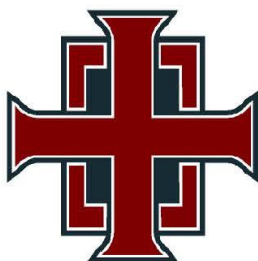

Juniors: ACT Prep Opportunity

The ACT is a standardized test that measures a student's skills in five core areas: Math, English, Science, Reading, and Writing. Results from the ACT are reviewed by most colleges as part of the application process. **All Juniors will take the ACT on March 8 as part of state testing.**

In order to help students prepare for the ACT, MLHS will be offering ACT Test Prep Sessions at no cost to our students.
