## FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

**A) He wants us to be holy**

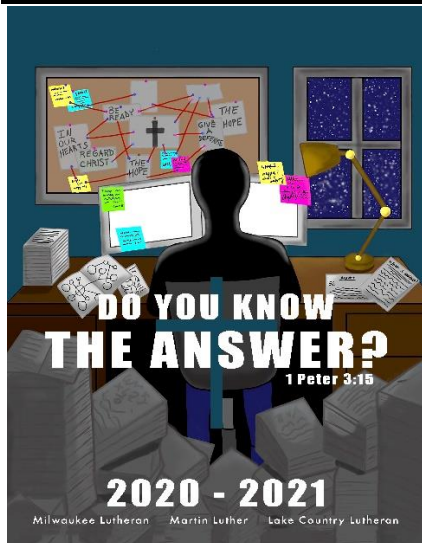
Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

We have been purchased by the blood of Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 6:19-20) and we daily die to ourselves and are renewed in Christ (Ephesians 4:22-24). After this transformation occurs, God next calls us to be holy. It is impossible for any individual to be holy on their own. A true reflection on our lives will reveal a large number of areas where we fall short of perfection. But because God is perfect and holy, He has redeemed us from the bondage of our sin and given us the opportunity to be pure, blameless, and holy.

*But as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct. (1 Peter 1:15)*

Because of what God has done in our lives, we should try to live holy lives. We should work to live our lives following with commands to Love God and Love Others around us. It is because of the strength provided by the Holy Spirit that we live our lives in accordance with God's perfect design. We emulate His love towards others. We seek to use our spiritual gifts in service to others.

We will continue to fall short of perfection. Others will see our flawed human state and generalize Christians as hypocrites. And yet, our lives as believers of Jesus Christ should be notable. Our conduct should look different. The way we live should stand out from the non-believer culture. And when we are asked to explain why this difference exists, we should be prepared to offer the reason for the hope that we have (1 Peter 3:15).

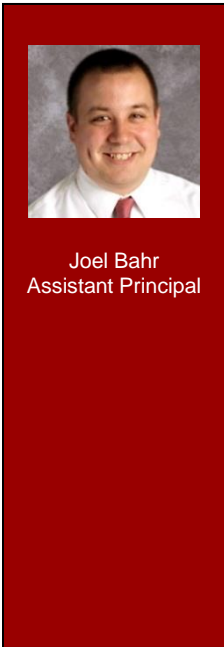

# OFFICE of SCHOOL CULTURE/Dean of Students

Greetings,

What an exciting week! With Groups A and B combined, it felt a little more like normal school. It was great to see students interacting with teachers, classes a little fuller, and more students having the ability to experience live chapel. With students being at school 4 days instead of 2, there are a couple of policies that I would like to emphasize:

1-As a parent if you need to communicate with your child, please contact the Attendance office. Students are not allowed to use their phones without teacher permission. If you text them in the middle of class and they check their phone, it is a cell phone violation.

2-A few of our male students seem to be forgetting their belts at home. Exposure of undergarments is not allowed. Pants need to be worn around the hips. Sagging pants is a dress code violation.

3-Students need to be in their first class by 8:00. For their other classes, they have a 5 minute passing period. If a student accumulates a total of 5 or more late marks to classes in a week, it is a violation of our tardy policy.

## Dress Code

- Masks must be worn in the building. If a student is a repeat offender of not bringing a mask to school, they will be charged \$2 for a mask. We have had an increasing number of students have to purchase masks from the attendance office.
