FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) What is my response to Jesus being my Savior? A) Be His Witness

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

It is appropriate that this is the final theme for the academic year. The disciples of Jesus have followed Him, witnessed the miraculous through Him, learned from Him, watched Him die, and were witnesses of His resurrected body. Now they stand with Him as He gives His final instructions to them before His ascension into heaven.

The first command several years ago seemed simple – Follow Me. What they realized is how difficult that discipleship would be. And yet they continued to walk alongside Jesus throughout His ministry. Now the training wheels were coming off completely. Jesus was no longer going to be physically present with them. No longer would they be able to watch how He handled situations. Instead, they were called to be His witnesses as the message of the Resurrected Christ spread.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

The final command is Go. Don't sit with the knowledge that you have, share it. Don't neglect the people around you, but instead use the power that has been gifted from God. Don't shy away from your identity in Christ, but instead be a bold and courageous witness of His faith in you to this world. That is the core of what our theme for the year has centered on. May God especially gift our Senior Class with this conviction, but all of us as well – "always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have (1 Peter 3:15)."
