FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) What is my response to Jesus being my Savior? A) Display love.

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

The last few weeks have illustrated our identity in Christ and the gifts He has given us. We are called to serve our neighbor using those gifts. This stewardship of our gifts is a direct calling to love our neighbor. That love is seen not just in our voice, but in the actions we take every day.

Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. 1 John 3:18

Why should we love others? After all, there are many examples of hurt caused by others. There are those that actively seek to harm us – not necessarily just in a physical sense. It would be much easier to just love those that we have a natural or familial bond with. But Jesus is very clear in Scripture, that we are to love all people – even our enemies (Matthew 5:43).

How can we love others? We love with the strength that God provides in gratitude for the love that He has expressed for us. We are undeserving of His love, but He has graciously poured it out through the sacrifice of His Son Jesus Christ (1 John 4:10). And because of the love He has given, we should love those around us (1 John 4:19).

That expression of love is different from what the world experiences. Love should not be a transaction where it is offered based on perceived value or return. Rather Christians are to love without the expectation of anything in return. They are to love in a way that points to Christ. That demonstration of love will cause notice, which offers the chance to share the reason for the hope within us (1 Peter 3:15).

Greetings,

Is there really less than 1 month left of school?? I know the Seniors have had the countdown going for quite a while. We certainly would love to see all students finish these last couple of weeks strong as Friday, May 28th is our last day of school.

This past week we focused on the use of hall passes and hallway behavior. Students were shown a short power point on Wednesday regarding this. There was an emphasis on making sure you are excused to be in the hallway. A teacher should sign a student's planner if they have to leave the class to go to the bathroom or get some water or for any other legitimate reason. If they are talking to a staff member and that conversation causes them to be late, the staff member should sign a pass for them. Finally, there was an emphasis on phones and earbuds not being used in the hallways or bathrooms.

Next week our focus will be on the reasons why we have a dress code. Just a reminder, we still require masks. 
