FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) How do we know that Jesus existed as a human? A) He died a real death

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

The Crucifixion of Jesus Christ is a critical component to the faith of those who follow Him. This event must have taken place for the fundamental and most important event of our faith – the Resurrection – to occur. Jesus must have died. So how do we know with confidence that Jesus was killed?

The Scriptures record the event in all four Gospels. A substantial portion of each Gospel is devoted to the final week of Jesus life. This not only reflects the importance of this event, but also outlines a number of supporting details. They clearly show that Jesus Christ suffered and died. If Jesus was not human, death in this world would be impossible. His death did happen and has been recorded clearly by the witnesses of that event.

But when they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break his legs. But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. He who saw it has borne witness – this testimony is true, and he knows that he is telling the truth – that you may also believe. (John 19:33-35)

But the accounts of Scripture are not the only evidence for the death of Jesus Christ. Others, who weren't believers in Jesus, also recorded this event in history. Tacitus, the first century Roman historian, references the death of Jesus in his writings. Josephus, another first century historian of the Jewish faith, records Jesus' trial, persecution, and death.

There is substantial evidence that points to the physical and earthly death of Jesus of Nazareth. His death narrative is an important piece of historical evidence, but an even greater spiritual reality. It is in His death, in the shedding of His blood, that we have received forgiveness. We no longer live under the penalty of our own sin, but instead, in faith, have been granted grace through this sacrifice. His death means life for us.

May we always be prepared to give an answer for reason for our hope (1 Peter 3:15).

Arrival To School



Hall of Fame

MLHS was pleased to induct 9 more honorees into the MLHS Athletic Hall of Fame this August!

- Tom Burger (1987-1991) Track, Basketball, Soccer and Football Athlete. Annual track meet at MLHS is named after him. 7 WISSA State Championships in track, WTCA Male Athlete of the Year (1991). MLHS Record Holder in the 55 and 100m indoor high hurdles. Currently resides in Woodbury, MN.
- Rev. Erich "Pat" Falk (1927-1964) Coach and Athletic Director. Coached Football, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball and Baseball. Taught English, history, math and phy ed. Advised the Yearbook, Archery Club and Hot Rod Club. Our football/soccer field is named after him: "Pat Falk Field".





- Harvey Kuenn (1945-1949). Football, Basketball and Baseball Athlete. Played baseball at UW Madison before playing in Major League Baseball for various teams, most notably the Detroit Tigers. He won the AL batting title in 1959 and was an MLB All-Star 8 years in a row. He managed the Milwaukee Brewers in their only World Series appearance in 1982, coaching "Harvey's Wallbangers".
- Toni Cavins Kulibert (1979-1983) Basketball, Softball and Volleyball Athlete. Holds MLHS records for steals in basketball and the MLHS records for strikeouts, home runs and slugging percentage in softball. She went on to play "Class A" softball! Currently she resides in Mayville, WI.





- Eric Pankow (1984-2018) Coach of Track and Field, Cross Country and Football. Eric's Track Teams were WISSA State Runners Up 3 times and WIAA State Runners Up 2 times, North Shore Conference Champions 3 times. Eric's teams won 17 combined (boys and girls) Regional Championships, 5 combined Sectional Championships. Eric coached 46 WISSA Individual State Champions, 13 WISSA Relay State Champions, 6 WIAA Individual State Champions and 6 WIAA Relay State Champions. Eric was the 2014 Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Coach of the Year. Eric currently is a Physics Teacher and Teacher Mentor at MLHS!
- Jennifer Rhodes (1989-1993) Basketball, Track and Volleyball Athlete. Jenny was a Regional Champion and participated in the WISSA State Tournament in Basketball. She was a 2 time All-Conference player. 1993 WISSA State Champion in the Shot Put. Jenny played Basketball at UW-Madison and was Academic All-Big Ten in addition to playing in the NCAA Tournament. She currently serves as an attorney in the Milwaukee area.





- Rebecca Tuma Stark (1994-1998) Volleyball, Basketball and Track Athlete. Conference and Regional Champion in Volleyball where she was also All-Academic and All-Conference and Conference Player of the Year. Regional Champion and WISSA State Tournament participant in Basketball. In Track she earned 6 WISSA individual State Championships in the Shot Put and Discuss. She was named to the 1997 All State Team for Track and Field. She earned an athletic scholarship to UW-Madison and competed in Track and Field earning two Big Ten Scholar Athlete awards. She currently works as a clinical oncology pharmacist in West Bend, WI.
- Cliff Thompson (1980-1992) Coach and Athletic Director. Coach Thompson served as the head varsity basketball coach for nine years winning the 1985 Metro Conference Championship and finishing as the 1986 WISSA State Runners-up. His team again won the Regional Championship in 1990 and appeared in the state tournament. Coach Thompson also served in the Track program coaching 5 State Champions in distance running as well as leading the 1990 Cross Country team to a 5th place finish at the WISSA State Meet. Coach Thompson also found time to coach in the Football program all the while as the Athletic Director. Coach Thompson is in the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, inducted in 2009. His positive concern, care and love for his players beyond athletics was his greatest gift to MLHS. He is recently retired from the Sauk Prairie School District and lives in Sauk Prairie, WI.





• Cary Wenthur (1977-1981) – Golf and Swimming Athlete. Cary helped lead the Golf Team to a 3rd and 5th place WISSA State Finish. He excelled in swimming as a 1981 State Champion in the 100 and 200 freestyle. He holds the MLHS record in both events. He also was All Conference in 1979, 1980 and 1981. His Swim Teams placed 2nd (1980) and 3rd (1978 and 1981) at the WISSA State Meet. He swam collegiately at the University of South Carolina wining the 1982 Metro Conference Championship. He currently lives in San Marcos, CA where he works as a Senior Vice President for Realty Income Corporation.
