# FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

# Q) How do we know that Jesus is God? A) Miracles reveal it

Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

The early Christian church had to grapple with their beliefs. These individuals had been around Jesus of Nazareth for years. They considered him a friend and their teacher. They had witnessed his miracles on earth.

Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples and said to Him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" And Jesus answered him, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. (Matthew 11:2-5)

When Jesus was crucified, his followers were crushed. But Jesus then appeared, not in a mirage or vision but in flesh and blood, to them after his death. That isn't supposed to happen! These appearances were convincing enough to those individuals that these believers endured being ostracized – even to the point that they were willing to give up their lives to defend their belief in the risen Jesus.

The miracles of Jesus showed that he was not just a normal human being. There was something very unique and special about him. But more than that, by witnessing His resurrection over death itself, Jesus of Nazareth proved that he was more than just a miracle worker – he was God. Jesus pulled off the greatest miracle that has ever taken place. No one other than God has been, or will be able, to defeat death. This is the core of the Christian faith. Jesus Christ died a human death and was raised to life three days later. Also, since we are linked to Jesus Christ, we too will experience the miracle. Those who believe in the resurrection will experience our own resurrection after our earthly death where we will be united eternally with God in heaven. And that promise is the reason for the hope that we have (1 Peter 3:15).

# **OFFICE of SCHOOL CULTURE/Dean of Students**

#### Greetings,

As Deans we feel strongly in ensuring that your son or daughter is safe in the building and can focus on his/her education and faith. There are policies and procedures put into place to make sure those things happen. Please contact me if you have any questions regarding policies/procedures. #### **Arrival To School**

- -The earliest students can enter the building is 7:15.
- -Please aim for arrival by 7:50 as classes begin at 8:00.
- -If a student is late (arrives past 8:00), they need to go to the Main Office entrance.

#### **Dress Code**

- -Masks must be worn in the building
- -Rips/Tears/Frays are not allowed in jeans or any other clothing
- -No writing on shirts is allowed unless it is a Christian message, a team/school, or a name brand
- -If a student is out of dress code, they will not be allowed in class.

#### Lunch

-Make sure your son or daughter has a lunch, has cash for lunch, or has money on their lunch account before they are dropped off. We want to avoid parents bringing money or lunch during the school day.

-If a parent has to bring money or lunch during the day (we do want to avoid this), we will have a staff member get that from you outside. We do not want parents entering the building during the school day.

#### **Parking Permit/Driving**

- -If a student is parking in the school parking lot, they need to either renew their permit from last year or get a parking permit. The cost is \$10. Please see Ms. Adams regarding parking permits.
- -Students that are driving should review our Parking Lot Regulations/Violations on p. 127 in the school planner.

#### **After-School Procedures**

- -The school day ends at 3:20
- -Students can be on school property until 4:15



# Hall of Fame

MLHS was pleased to induct 9 more honorees into the MLHS Athletic Hall of Fame this August!

- Tom Burger (1987-1991) Track, Basketball, Soccer and Football Athlete. Annual track meet at MLHS is named after him. 7 WISSA State Championships in track, WTCA Male Athlete of the Year (1991). MLHS Record Holder in the 55 and 100m indoor high hurdles. Currently resides in Woodbury, MN.
- Rev. Erich "Pat" Falk (1927-1964) Coach and Athletic Director. Coached Football, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball and Baseball. Taught English, history, math and phy ed. Advised the Yearbook, Archery Club and Hot Rod Club. Our football/soccer field is named after him: "Pat Falk Field".





- Harvey Kuenn (1945-1949). Football, Basketball and Baseball Athlete. Played baseball at UW Madison before playing in Major League Baseball for various teams, most notably the Detroit Tigers. He won the AL batting title in 1959 and was an MLB All-Star 8 years in a row. He managed the Milwaukee Brewers in their only World Series appearance in 1982, coaching "Harvey's Wallbangers".
- Toni Cavins Kulibert (1979-1983) Basketball, Softball and Volleyball Athlete. Holds MLHS records for steals in basketball and the MLHS records for strikeouts, home runs and slugging percentage in softball. She went on to play "Class A" softball! Currently she resides in Mayville, WI.





- Eric Pankow (1984-2018) Coach of Track and Field, Cross Country and Football. Eric's Track Teams were WISSA State Runners Up 3 times and WIAA State Runners Up 2 times, North Shore Conference Champions 3 times. Eric's teams won 17 combined (boys and girls) Regional Championships, 5 combined Sectional Championships. Eric coached 46 WISSA Individual State Champions, 13 WISSA Relay State Champions, 6 WIAA Individual State Champions and 6 WIAA Relay State Champions. Eric was the 2014 Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Coach of the Year. Eric currently is a Physics Teacher and Teacher Mentor at MLHS!
- Jennifer Rhodes (1989-1993) Basketball, Track and Volleyball Athlete. Jenny was a Regional Champion and participated in the WISSA State Tournament in Basketball. She was a 2 time All-Conference player. 1993 WISSA State Champion in the Shot Put. Jenny played Basketball at UW-Madison and was Academic All-Big Ten in addition to playing in the NCAA Tournament. She currently serves as an attorney in the Milwaukee area.





- Rebecca Tuma Stark (1994-1998) Volleyball, Basketball and Track Athlete. Conference and Regional Champion in Volleyball where she was also All-Academic and All-Conference and Conference Player of the Year. Regional Champion and WISSA State Tournament participant in Basketball. In Track she earned 6 WISSA individual State Championships in the Shot Put and Discuss. She was named to the 1997 All State Team for Track and Field. She earned an athletic scholarship to UW-Madison and competed in Track and Field earning two Big Ten Scholar Athlete awards. She currently works as a clinical oncology pharmacist in West Bend, WI.
- Cliff Thompson (1980-1992) Coach and Athletic Director. Coach Thompson served as the head varsity basketball coach for nine years winning the 1985 Metro Conference Championship and finishing as the 1986 WISSA State Runners-up. His team again won the Regional Championship in 1990 and appeared in the state tournament. Coach Thompson also served in the Track program coaching 5 State Champions in distance running as well as leading the 1990 Cross Country team to a 5th place finish at the WISSA State Meet. Coach Thompson also found time to coach in the Football program all the while as the Athletic Director. Coach Thompson is in the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, inducted in 2009. His positive concern, care and love for his players beyond athletics was his greatest gift to MLHS. He is recently retired from the Sauk Prairie School District and lives in Sauk Prairie, WI.





• Cary Wenthur (1977-1981) – Golf and Swimming Athlete. Cary helped lead the Golf Team to a 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> place WISSA State Finish. He excelled in swimming as a 1981 State Champion in the 100 and 200 freestyle. He holds the MLHS record in both events. He also was All Conference in 1979, 1980 and 1981. His Swim Teams placed 2<sup>nd</sup> (1980) and 3<sup>rd</sup> (1978 and 1981) at the WISSA State Meet. He swam collegiately at the University of South Carolina wining the 1982 Metro Conference Championship. He currently lives in San Marcos, CA where he works as a Senior Vice President for Realty Income Corporation.

# How to Set Up a Pre-Paid Lunch Account



Follow the directions below if you are setting up a pre-paid lunch account at MLHS for the first time.

If your teen is a returning student and you already set up an account last year, your closing balance has transferred to the 20-21 school year.

How to set up a pre-paid lunch account:

- Log in to Skyward—go to the MLHS website www.milwaukeelutheran.org
   Point to Quick Links (upper right) and click on Gradebook/Skyward. (All families received
   their login information in their red folder.)
- 2. Open Family Access (right side)
- Click on Student Info (left side); make note of your teen's Other ID number (You will need this number to set up your account.)
- 4. Click on Food Service (left side)
- 5. Click on Make a Payment
- You are now in *e-Funds for Schools*, our online payment system.
- Click on Fund Lunch and choose Create an Account Fill in the required fields
- 7. Click on Create Account
- 8. Click on Add Student(s)
  - Add your teen's last name and ID number
- Click on Add Student(s)
- 10. Click on Continue on Home
- 11. Click on Fund Lunch
  - Choose the student name
  - Enter the amount you would like to deposit
- 12. Click on Add to Cart
- 13. Click on Begin Checkout
  - Complete the requested credit or debit card information
- 14. Click on Add Credit/Debit Card to save your payment information to your account. Follow the directions to complete your deposit.

(Note: If popups are blocked any time during the setup process, choose "disable" to continue.)

After the account is set up and money has been deposited, your teen may use their ID card to purchase food in the cafeteria.

You will be able to log in to Skyward at any time to add money, check your balance, and track your teen's cafeteria purchases.

<u>PARKING LOT SAFETY:</u> For the safety of all our students and parents, please find below a few reminders about dropping off/picking up your student(s) in the morning and after school.

- 1. When picking up after school, please DO NOT park between the orange cones. This area is designated for the buses.
- 2. When dropping off in the morning, you may pull up next to the canopy or next to the parking lot. Please DO NOT stop in the middle of the driveway this causes congestion.
- 3. Please **DRIVE SLOWLY** at all times and watch for pedestrians crossing.
