FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Q) How do we know that Jesus existed as a human?
A) He had human attributes and human emotions.


Our theme for the year focuses on the idea that we need to be prepared to answer the questions for the reason for the hope that we have. There are questions that non-Christians have of Christians in relation to our faith. Throughout the year we will focus on answers to these questions through a lens on the central figure to our faith – Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ was a real person who walked on this earth. We also believe that he was true God (more about that in a couple of weeks). The accounts of Jesus Christ of Nazareth have been documented not only in the Bible, but also from a number of secular historians. They reveal in their history books of this popular figure who emerged in Israel with a great following. They recorded that he performed miracles that could not be explained, but also that the portions of the public rose up against him and executed him under the authority of the Roman government. These facts are reliable. Even those who don't believe that Jesus Christ was God recognize that this is not simply a story, but evidence of a real person.

Beyond that, Scripture reveals that Jesus didn't just exist but he was fully human. He looked as we do. He grew up as we have. He experienced the world as we do. He had real emotion like we experience. He died a painful, emotion-filled death. In John 11, the account is given of Jesus arriving at the home of his close friends — one of whom has recently died. The raw emotion that Jesus expresses as he sees the grieving is real. Everything about him is real.

Furthermore, because Jesus experienced this world as we do, he understands us. He recognizes our experiences. He feels what we go through. He is not disconnected from us, but rather is closely united with us as human beings. As Christians, we believe that this human aspect allows him to interact with us in a different way as God. He understands us and our lives and therefore can provide for us exactly what we need – assurance, comfort, peace, joy, hope.

May we always be prepared to give an answer for reason for our hope (1 Peter 3:15).



<u>Physical or Alternate Year Card??</u> All MLHS athletes need a Physical From on file to practice and compete. These forms are found in the online registration, are filled out offline, and uploaded during your online registration.

Take the WIAA Clearance form (physical form) with you to your doctor appointment and have the doctor sign it before you turn it in. Physical needs to be done before a student can participate in practice or a game.

Do you need a physical or the alternate year card this year? Use this info to help determine:

- Physical Needed every 2 years
 - o All Freshman Athletes and new students to MLHS need one submitted
 - o All Returning Students
 - Physical Dated before April 1, 2019 Good for 2020-21 School Year
 - Physical Dated on/after April 1, 2019 Good for 2020-21 and 2021-22
 School Years
 - o Usually needed by Freshman and Juniors
- <u>Alt Year Card</u> Gets filled out in the years when the Physical is valid (usually Sophomore and Senior Years)

Athletic Locks need to be purchased → Returning athletes should have their lock from the previous year. Check with the Athletic Department office if you can't seem to locate your lock from last year. We have several locks that were either left behind or misplaced. We can match the serial number to the owner and give you the combination once again (in case you can't remember). New athletes must purchase a new lock for \$6.00 from the athletic department. Locks will be available on the first day of practice and when the office is open after that (typically 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM).
