Below is this week's government and legislative affairs update. All previous legislative guidance and other affiliate resources are stored via the <u>VillageMD Affiliated Practices COVID-19 Resource Center</u>.

- The Senate completed week three of a five-week session before July 4th recess begins, focusing on the Senate version of police reform legislation. Senators state a COVID-19 response package will be debated beginning July 20th and finalized by August 7th. The House continues to hold hearings, but did not take any votes.
- 2. The Senate Finance Committee Chairman is <u>seeking</u> member input on policies to reduce healthcare disparities.
- 3. The Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) <u>held</u> a hearing on the future of telehealth.
- 4. A group of bipartisan senators, led by Sen. Brian Schatz (D-HI), want telehealth provisions included in previous COVID-19 emergency legislation to be made permanent to allow for expanded telehealth flexibilities after the pandemic.
- 5. Senate Finance Committee leaders are pressing HHS to be more transparent on how much individual providers have received in COVID-19 funding from both Medicare loans and provider relief funding grant.
