Below is this week's government and legislative affairs update. All previous legislative guidance and other affiliate resources are stored via the <u>VillageMD Affiliated Practices COVID-19 Resource Center</u>.

General updates:

- The U.S. Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) <u>held</u> a hearing on safely getting back to work and school in relation to COVID-19.
- The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) <u>announced</u> they will extend the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, currently set to expire at the end of July, including waivers of telehealth restrictions.
- Physician Advocacy Groups <u>asked</u> Congress to remove taxes on CARES Grants.
- Congress voted to <u>extend</u> the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) application deadline for loans until August 8, 2020.
- More than 300 stakeholders <u>sent</u> a letter to Congress, urging permanent action on telehealth services.
- Both the Senate and House will be in recess the weeks of July 6 and July 13, returning the week of July 20. The main focus of the July/August work period will be the negotiation and consideration of the next COVID-19 relief package.

VillageMD On The Hill:

- VillageMD worked in collaboration with America's Physicians Groups (APG) in writing a letter to CMMI, expressing concern on certain matters related to DCEs. Issues involved opinions around benchmarks, Concurrent Risk Adjustment, voluntary attribution and timelines.
- VillageMD continues to develop policy positions on a variety of issues that impact primary care and providers. We work directly with Congress, HHS/CMS and CMMI and the White House on pressing issues of the day.
- After the recess, we anticipate addressing continuation of the next phase of the CARES Act and creating statutory language around tele-health.
