



COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Argentina: Health Minister stated that "herd immunity" would be achieved after July.

Bolivia: COVID-19 vaccine was delivered in all nine departments prioritizing healthcare workers.

Brazil: New leadership in Congress elected.

Colombia: Vaccination plan decree enacted weeks before the start of vaccine rollout.

Chile: As massive vaccination moves forward, Piñera's approval reaches highest level since October.

Ecuador: First round of presidential elections took place amidst increased contagions.

Mexico: 3 million medicines purchased to support the fight against COVID-19.

Paraguay: Abdo appoints new Minister of Technology while Minister of Health faces questionings on budget execution.

Peru: The first batch of COVID-19 vaccines arrived in the country.

Uruguay: As contagions drop, logistics move forward to start the vaccination process.

Government Measures	Health	 <u>Brazilian variants</u> of COVID19 were detected in Argentina. After an authorized inflation increase of 3.5% for March, private health providers are still <u>negotiating</u> an automatic authorization formula.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Health Minister stated that 62 million doses of COVID19 vaccines have been committed to Argentina through agreements already signed. Considering this, he stated that "herd immunity" would be reached after July. With no agreement on prices and quantities, the government is waiting for a gesture from the Chinese president to close the deal for Sinopharm, local press reported.
	Political	 A bill to make less people pay income tax is promoted by the officialism. It will be discussed in extraordinary sessions. Government meets to schedule appointments with business chambers and union representatives to reach price and wage agreements.
	Economic	 Government re-launched the Productive Recovery Program II <u>(Repro II)</u> to help companies in need to pay salaries. Alberto Fernández ratified the possibility of limiting exports or increasing withholding taxes to the <u>agriculture</u> <u>sector</u>. The aim would be to control food prices.
	Country Opening	 The Buenos Aires City Government defined the inperson <u>back-to-school</u> protocol. The Minister of Education said that it will be possible to return to in-person classes in <u>"weekly blocks"</u> by groups.
Outlook	Political	 Opposition representatives traveled to the province of Formosa to gather information from people who were in COVID 19 <u>isolation centers</u> accused of human rights violations.

	Economic	• The Consumer Price Index registered a positive variation of 0.47% compared to December 2020, Bolivia's INE <u>reported</u> .
Outlook	Political	 Government <u>celebrated</u> the return of democracy after taking office in October 2020 by creating a special date called "Día de la Recuperación de la Democracia Intercultural". The National Electoral Tribunal (TSE) <u>announced</u> the sanitary measures to be enacted in March elections. After the sanitary emergency law was enacted by Congress, President Arce <u>celebrated</u> the decision. But, some health associations, especially from Santa Cruz, have raised concerns regarding the content of the initiative.
