

COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Argentina: Postponement of legislative elections formally approved.

Bolivia: President Arce calls for open patent on COVID-19 vaccines.

Brazil: Positive GDP results could signal country's pandemic adaptation.

Colombia: OAS's Human Rights commission begins in-country visit amid ongoing tensions with Strike Committee.

Chile: The Ministry of Health announced special vaccination campaign.

Ecuador: A new director of the National Agency for Health Regulation, Control and Surveillance (ARCSA) was appointed.

Mexico: Mid-term elections for the House of Representatives were held.

Paraguay: Minister of Health calls for more funds to deal with the pandemic.

Peru: Peru more than doubled its official death toll from the COVID-19 pandemic after a review of official figures.

Uruguay: While opening vaccination to young people, Government adjusted the prices of fuel tariffs.

	Health	 Government defined a <u>direct purchase</u> for USD 6.3 million to meet the requirements of public health system institutions participating in COVID-19 management. The Governor of the province of Buenos Aires announced a conditioned purchase agreement for 10 million <u>COVAXIN</u> vaccines. The city of Buenos Aires also obtained <u>legislative approval</u> to purchase vaccines.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Russian and Argentinean Presidents announced the beginning of local production of Sputnik V. It will be manufactured by the Argentinean laboratory Richmond. Record number of vaccine applications was registered throughout the country. A total of 356 thousand were applied in one day. Representatives of Pfizer presented themselves in Congress to provide details of the frustrated negotiation for vaccines with Argentina.
	Country Opening	Government authorized provinces to <u>reschedule</u> winter school recess.
	Political	 The <u>postponement</u> of the legislative elections was approved in Congress. The primaries will be held in September and General Elections in November. Former Brazilian presidents Lula Da Silva and Henrique Cardoso <u>supported</u> the Argentine President in his position against the reduction of import tariffs in MERCOSUR.
Outlook	Economic	 World Bank estimates that Argentina's <u>GDP growth</u> in 2021 will be 6.4%. Government to launch an anti-inflation food basket with frozen prices for 6 months, local press <u>reported</u>.

	Health	 Government places oxygen generating plant for COVID-19 patient attention in rural and urban areas of Cochabamba. Meeting of official and opposition authorities of Chuquisaca was held to outline policies for accelerating vaccination and containment of COVID-19. President Arce called for the release of COVID-19 vaccine patents. Then, he stated that, if patents are released, Bolivia is capable of locally producing the vaccine.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Government <u>authorized</u> to apply second dose of Sinopharm to patients requiring the first dose. Long lines and crowds of people <u>lined up</u> at health centers in major Bolivian cities to receive COVID-19 vaccine. At risk of <u>running out</u> of vaccines before other batches arrive, Bolivia decides to accelerate the pace of immunization.
	Country Opening	Up to Friday, June 11th, <u>allowed hours</u> of circulation in Santa Cruz are between 5 am and 11 pm.
Outlook	Political	 The Legislative Body to interrogate Government Minister for the <u>arrest</u> of former President Añez. After road blockades and subsequent agreement with the government to stop smuggling, the Ruta de los Valles is back to <u>normal operation</u>.
	Economic	 According to the Statistical Institute (INE), urban unemployment <u>fell</u> to 7.6% in April 2021. This is the lowest record since July 2020.

Government	Health	 Current Minister of Health, Marcelo Quiroga, will <u>return</u> to testify before the Pandemic CPI on June 8th. The Health Ministry will <u>release</u> a safety protocol for the hosting of the Copa América, which was moved to Brazil due to protests in Colombia and health issues in Argentina. The Bolsonaro administration <u>made</u> key changes in the Department of Health, dismissing the Director of Evaluation and Monitoring at the Unified Health System as well as a legal advisor to the Health Ministry.
Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 ANVISA <u>approved</u> the importation of the Indian Covaxin vaccine, to begin human trials in Brazil. ANVISA is also <u>awaiting</u> documents to approve trials for the Butantan Institute's Butanvac vaccine, developed in Brazil. The first doses of the Janssen vaccine <u>will</u> arrive in Brazil on June 10th, with three million one-shot doses shipped from the United States.
	Political	 Bolsonaro will likely <u>affiliate</u> with the Patriota party, ahead of the 2022 elections, given his son's affiliation and the institutional changes meant to provide the president with more control over the party. Administrative Reform will <u>remain</u> a focus in Congress, with Speaker Arthur Lira meeting with party leaders this week to define next steps.
Outlook	Economic	 Surprisingly positive GDP results from the first quarter demonstrated the economy's adaptation to pandemic restrictions, alleviating pressure on the deficit and introducing flexibility to the spending cap. The government's fiscal situation in regard to renewing emergency aid and income distribution programs has become more comfortable, although political considerations may hinder renewal.

	Health	 The country <u>reached</u> an 97% occupation of hospital beds for critically ill patients. The Center for Diagnosis and Research of Infectious Diseases of the University of Valparaiso <u>warned</u> about five cases of infection with Aspergillus fumigatus, in patients with COVID-19.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 The Ministry of Health <u>announced</u> the launch of a special vaccination campaign for people over 23 years of age that will seek to reach 800,000 people. The Ministry of Health <u>decided</u> to suspend the application of second doses of AstraZeneca's COVID-19 vaccine in people under 45 years of age. President Piñera <u>announced</u> that "very soon" the population from the age of 12 will begin inoculation.
	Economic	 President Piñera <u>issued</u> a law that extends until September an economic aid to families.
	Country Opening	 The government <u>announced</u> the extension of the border closure until June 30th. The Ministry of Health <u>announced</u> changes to the COVID Mobility Pass that came into effect at the end of May. Authorities <u>decreed</u> "total quarantine" measures in the Valparaíso Prison after detecting a COVID-19 outbreak.
	Social	The Health Commission of the House of Representatives <u>approved</u> a bill that establishes labor jurisdiction and compensatory rest for all health personnel.
Outlook	Economic	 The World Bank once again <u>increased</u> their growth expectations for Chile. The IDB <u>approved</u> a loan of 50 million USD with the aim of accelerating decarbonization.

The Ministry of Health <u>began</u> re-distribution of medicines used in ICUs that had presented shortages. The Government <u>invited</u> the business sector to collaborate in the vaccination process and the idea of creating a trust mechanism is being prepared
	Vaccine Rollout	 The United States will <u>provide</u> free COVID-19 vaccines to Ecuador although the amount has not yet been specified. The Minister of Health reported that the budget allocation for the purchase of CanSino is being made and <u>announced</u> there will be talks to acquire the Russian vaccine Sputnik V. The country will <u>receive</u> an additional 600,000 vaccines from Pfizer and Sinovac.
	Country Opening	 The government <u>authorized</u> the progressive return of faceto-face classes in schools and universities. The requirement of the PCR test for passengers who arrive by air has been <u>eliminated</u> if they have a vaccination certificate.
Outlook	Political	 The mayor of Quito, who faces a corruption trial for the irregular purchase of COVID-19 tests, was <u>dismissed</u> from his charge. Former president Bucaram will not continue under house arrest by <u>decision</u> of a Provincial Court. President Lasso <u>presented</u> the country's new environmental public policy
	Economic	The Central Bank of Ecuador <u>estimates</u> that the country's economy will grow by 2.8% this year.

The first case of a person infected with mucormycosis in Mexico was <u>detected</u> in a patient recovered from COVID-19. The delivery of mechanical respirators to Latin American countries <u>began</u>.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The United States will <u>send</u> Mexico one million coronavirus vaccines from Johnson & Johnson to be applied on shared border. The Supreme Court of Justice <u>rejected</u> the proposal to suspend the federal government's policy that prevents municipalities from buying their own vaccines. The vaccination calendar for people in vulnerable or disabled conditions to be <u>announced</u> soon.
	Country Opening	 Almost two thirds of the country <u>reached</u> green status in the epidemiological COVID-19 traffic light system.
Outlook	Political	Mid-term legislative elections were <u>held</u> , although results are not final, MORENA is expected to keep simple majority in the House of Representatives.
	Social	Patients from Health Institutes are <u>reporting</u> a lack of medicines and basic medical supplies.
	Economic	 Mexico's economic recovery shows signs of strengthening, <u>according</u> to the National Institute of Statistic and Geography (INEGI).



Government	Health	 Peru more than <u>doubled</u> its official death toll from the COVID-19 pandemic after a review of official figures. The Government <u>created</u> a Specialized Commission to investigate the lack of updating of the death registry from COVID-19. EsSalud <u>warned</u> of an increase in patients with stress cardiomyopathy. Two new medicinal oxygen plants and a new "villa" for COVID-19 patients were <u>inaugurated</u>.
Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 The Judiciary <u>admitted</u> for its review an appeal that seeks to enable the purchase and distribution of COVID-19 vaccines to private companies. Peru Libre <u>announced</u> that a possible Pedro Castillo government will renegotiate the contracts for the COVID-19 vaccines.
Outlook	Political	 Pedro Castillo <u>leads</u> Peru's presidential election, according to first polls; although the incoming results are still close. Keiko Fujimori elevates <u>claims</u> of fraud while OAS's Electoral Mission calls for "democratic attitudes" from both candidates while results are officialized. Amid electoral <u>uncertainty</u> PEN sees 2% drop while the BVL sees 7,7% drop.
	Social	 A commission in Congress <u>approved</u> a bill that establishes labor rights for delivery workers.

Government Measures	Health	 Intensive care bed occupancy <u>reached</u> 80%. Among the total, 56% of this consisted of COVID-19 patients. During May, deaths due to COVID19 <u>remained</u> steady but the average age decreased. Health Ministry <u>issued</u> a report on vaccines applied between March and May 2021. Most vaccinated people fall between <u>50 and 70 years of age</u>. Among them, 85.69% already have the first dose while 70.38% have the second dose as well.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Vaccination for <u>young people</u> aged 12 to 17 years starts on June 9th. Uruguay is the first country in Latin America to vaccinate this age group.
	Economic	 Uruguayan electric company (UTE) signed a contract with Chinese company for an electric transmission project in the north of the country. It will be the major project of this administration. Government announced new fuel tariffs. Adjustment is 12%. These tariffs are aligned with international prices.
	Country opening	 Progressive return to <u>on-site classes</u> continues. As from Monday, 51 thousand children returned to school in Salto, Canelones and Montevideo.
Outlook	Political	 President Lacalle Pou declared that Uruguay intends to "play on the big field" in order to <u>strengthen exports</u> yet without disassociating itself from MERCOSUR. The <u>Frente Amplio</u> proposes a one-year minimum wage for partners of people deceased by COVID-19.
