## **COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS**

Argentina: Following vaccination scandal, key positions have been filled at the Health Ministry

Bolivia: Local elections took place without any major reports of corruption or violence.

Brazil: As COVID-19 cases surge, government seeks to enforce curfews and lockdowns.

**Colombia:** Government delivers the schedule of COVID-19 vaccines arrival for March.

**Chile:** Despite vaccine rollout progress, Piñera requested the extension of the state of exception.

**Ecuador:** Ministry of Health establishes guidelines for municipalities to purchase COVID-19 vaccines.

Mexico: The government reported that over 2.7 million vaccines have been applied so far.

Paraguay: Political turmoil prompts wave of changes in key offices.

Peru: Ministry of Health issues a call to strengthen social distancing measures.

**Uruguay:** While the arrival of Pfizer vaccines is expected, the enrollment calendar is open for non-essential personnel aged 55-59 to be vaccinated with Sinovac.
