### **COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS**

**Argentina:** While the vaccination campaign gains pace, the government launches new tools to reduce inflation.

Bolivia: ECLAC donated over 150,000 COVID-19 vaccine doses

**Brazil:** São Paulo's vaccine schedule highlights differentials in vaccination rates among large urban states and rural states.

**Colombia:** The economic reactivation plan began to take place in some capital cities amid concerns from health authorities.

Chile: Sanitary alert extended until September amid a new COVID-19 outbreak.

Ecuador: The country secured financing for USD 550 million to cover the vaccination plan

**Mexico:** BIRMEX announced that Mexico could soon package the Sputnik V vaccine.

Paraguay: Government to monitor prices of basic food basket.

Peru: Vaccination campaign against COVID-19 for pregnant women began.

**Uruguay:** While the country displays one of the fastest vaccination campaigns in Latin America, admissions to intensive care units decreased during the last few days.
