

	Health	 A new <u>record number</u> of COVID19 cases was reported. It was also confirmed the <u>highest</u> number of deaths so far in the pandemic. The Minister of Health warned that the "unusual" growth of cases of COVID-19 puts the health system <u>under</u> strain in the provinces. Buenos Aires province's congress <u>approved</u> the bill that enables the province to negotiate and purchase COVID-19 vaccines.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Health Minister stated that Argentina will receive almost 4 million AstraZeneca vaccines <u>during May</u>. Russian President announced <u>regular shipments</u> of Sputnik V vaccines to Argentina. Argentina will be part of phase III studies of the Israeli vaccine Brie Life, local press <u>reported</u>.
	Economic	 Government decided to suspend meat exports for 30 days. This measure seeks to curb inflation, local press reported. Rural associations announced a 9-day stoppage in response to this measure. The Maximum Prices program, which includes ceilings for several food products, was extended until June 8th.
	Country Opening	Government evaluates new restrictions for the next stage. Even though a "total shutdown" has been ruled out, the government is considering tightening controls, local press reported.
Outlook	Political	 Government met with opposition leader, head of the Buenos Aires city government, to discuss the withdrawal of funds from the city. The ruling party called to discuss in committee a bill that modifies the necessary requirements to elect the General Attorney of the Nation. The opposition has advanced its rejection.

	Health	 The government <u>expanded</u> contracts for more than 3,000 frontline doctors amid concerns over a health reform bill. Bolivia <u>participated</u> at the International Patent Forum and emphasized starting an international and joint campaign for releasing vaccine patents.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 A massive vaccination center was <u>launched</u> in Santa Cruz last week. A new Sinopharm shipment <u>arrived</u> in La Paz and El Alto last week. The government <u>received</u> new Sputnik V doses to continue expanding vaccine rollout around the country. In the official speech, President Arce highlighted the importance of Russia amid the vaccination campaign.
	Economic	 More than USD \$1 billion have been <u>invested</u> in social and fiscal programs to reactivate the national economy, President Arce stated. Compulsory Insurance for construction workers was <u>presented</u>.
Outlook	Political	 Journalist associations <u>rejected</u> the idea of regulating television content and programs after alleged petitions in this matter were made within the Chamber of Deputies. While the pandemic is still the main topic on the agenda, different factors such as the "shadow of Evo Morales, the incapacity to approve the judicial reform, and the political persecution" have been other key topics that <u>marked</u> the first six months since President Luis Arce is in power.
	Economic	Concerns rise <u>over</u> VAT initiative for digital platforms and its repercussions on final users. Digital services have grown steadily amid the pandemic crisis, especially for education and entertainment purposes.

Government	Health	 Pandemic CPI will hear testimony from former Minister of Health Eduardo Pazuello on May 19. The government published a decree temporarily banning travelers from India, the United Kingdom, and South Africa. The Ministry of Health launched the Awareness Campaign on Preventative Measures and Vaccination against COVID-19 on May 12.
Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 The Ministry of Health will be <u>distributing</u> a new batch of 6.4 million vaccines on May 18. Fiocruz, which produces the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine in Brazil, is set to <u>receive</u> a new shipment of active pharmaceutical ingredients from China on May 22. São Paulo <u>expanded</u> its vaccination campaign to include pregnant women and women who recently gave birth.
Outlook	Political	 Administrative Reform will likely <u>advance</u> through the House CCJC with minimal changes, before facing real debate in the Special Committee. The much-awaited testimony of former Minister Pazuello at the COVID CPI this week could have severe repercussions for President Bolsonaro, although the Supreme Court <u>approved</u> his right to remain silent. New polling from DataFolha <u>shows</u> former President Lula da Silva in a strong position against Bolsonaro in a hypothetical 2022 election, although conditions are subject to change between now and the election.
	Economic	 According to an analysis from Citi, Brazil's economy will take two years to fully <u>recover</u> from the effects of the pandemic.

	Health	 Minister of Health made a call to <u>comply</u> with sanitary measures amid elections after concerns of possible new COVID-19 outbreaks. Universities <u>duplicated</u> their local capacities throughout the country to monitor COVID-19 genome sequencing. President Piñera <u>enacted</u> a new law on mental health.
	Vaccine Rollout	More than 16 million vaccines have been administered so far in the country as of Monday of this week, MoH <u>informed</u> .
Government Measures	Economic	 Ministry of Transport to <u>intensify</u> fines on the public transport system. Ministry of Labor <u>launched</u> a Multidisciplinary Table to boost policies on the creation of formal jobs.
	Social	 Government <u>announced</u> the start of the Middle-Class Bonus second phase and the IFE payment for April. The Presidency Secretary, Juan José Ossa, <u>announced</u> new support agenda for Chilean families hit hardest by the COVID-19 pandemic. Housing middle-class subsidy can be used in all the country regardless of where the application was made, Minister of Housing <u>announced</u>.
Outlook	Political	 In a historic <u>speech</u> after polls were closed, President Piñera brought up different insights and conclusions on the constitutional results. Among them, that the "citizens have sent a strong message to the government and traditional parties" regarding the disconnection with demands and social petitions. A two-hour permission was <u>granted</u> to vote for those that worked during the electoral dates.

Government Measures	Health	 Health reform bill loses strength in Congress after several legislators stopped supporting the measure. Breast cancer bill advances at Congress after its approval in third debate.
	Vaccine Rollout	 More than 7.4 million doses have been <u>administered</u> as of the end of last week, Ministry of Health reported.
	Political	 Government and the strike committee met for a second time as protests continue to take place in some main cities of the country. President Duque announced deployment of military and police forces to remove blockades across the country. President Duque enacted hybrid working law. Foreign Minister, Claudia Blum, stepped aside from office one week after the resignation of Finance Minister Alberto Carrasquilla. Opposition senator filed claim against the Colombian government before the International Court of Justice.
Outlook	Social	 Subsidies to grant low-income students university <u>support</u> with tuition, and for <u>salaries</u> for citizens between 18 and 28 years, announced. Intense protests with episodes of violence were <u>reported</u>.
	Economic	 Consumer confidence index reached -34% in April, according to Fedesarrollo's <u>opinion poll</u>, 22.8 percentage points decrease when compared to March. After 15 days of strike, and despite transport of basic goods has been facilitated through humanitarian corridors, the economic losses add up to USD \$200 million, FENALCO reported. Additionally, 90% of the medical supplies and medicines have been retained in national routes due to roadblocks and illegal barricades. A moderate new tax reform is expected to be <u>presented</u> before Congress, given the president's little room for maneuver and low legislative support. Despite the pandemic crisis, the economy grew by 1.1% in the first quarter of 2021.

Government Measures	Health	 The Secretary of Health <u>launched</u> a sanitary strategy to tackle COVID-19 expansion at the local level. COFEPRIS <u>announces</u> new evaluation guidelines for the certification of pharma manufacturing. The Mexican Pharmaceutical Institute (INEFAM) <u>warned</u> of a rise in drug shortages in the first months of 2021. As a result, people are turning to the black market for medication, local press <u>reported</u>. According to COPARMEX, the Mexican government should <u>strengthen</u> the centralized purchase of medicines amid the pandemic crisis. The Institutional Revolutionary Party (PRI) <u>proposed</u> a law for access to free medicines and called for an urgent response of the drug shortage situation.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Pregnant women to <u>receive</u> vaccines against COVID-19 to reduce maternal mortality. Government to <u>begin</u> packaging and bottling the Sputnik V vaccine. More than 34 million doses will <u>arrive</u> in the country in June. Around 500,000 Sputnik V and 35,000 CanSino doses <u>arrived</u> in the country at the end of last week.


Government Measures	Health	 Number of deaths <u>rises</u> again after 16 days of decline. MOH delivered <u>541 tons</u> of medical supplies throughout the country during the last few days. The supplies were mostly personal protective equipment. Health Ministry and Public Prosecutor's Office coordinate actions to strengthen surveillance in the vaccination process, local press <u>reported</u>.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Government set restrictions on the use of Sinopharm and AstraZeneca vaccines on people with certain pre-existing conditions. According to the Health Minister, vaccination for people over 60 years of age will begin before the end of the month. A batch of Pfizer's 700,000 vaccines has been received. In total, more than 2,400,000 vaccines have already been provided to the country.
Outlook	Country opening	 Minister of Education confirmed that on-site classes will not be resumed in urban areas regardless the reduction in the number of cases, local press <u>reported</u>.
	Political	 Presidential candidates Castillo and Fujimori signed the "<u>Citizens' Proclamation</u> - Oath for Democracy" where they committed themselves to accomplish twelve points associated to democratic practices.

Government Measures	Health	 The number of hospitalizations and admissions to intensive care for COVID-19 has decreased during the last two weeks, Uruguayan society of intensive care medicine reported. However, the lethality of the virus has not decreased. New intensive care beds were added to the public system. As a result, the state health administration (ASSE) constitutes itself as the main service provider against COVID-19, presidential portal reported.
	Vaccine Rollout	 A Mobile Vaccination Unit will reach more than 300 villages enabling the vaccination of more than 150,000 people, local press reported. Health Ministry asked a scientific commission to evaluate three anti-COVID19 vaccines -Sinopharm, Covaxine and Johnson & Johnson's vaccine- to study their further purchase, local press reported. Car vaccination center to be opened this week. Priority will be given to those over 70 years of age and people who are not self-sufficient.
	Economic	 Uruguay issued debt in local currency at the lowest interest rate in its history. Government launched funds to mitigate effects of pandemic in the tourism sector. Uruguay created a specialized team, formed by the ministries of environment and livestock, to reduce the environmental effects of livestock farming.
	Country opening	 On-site attendance is resumed in some levels of rural schools and in special education. Direct flights between Montevideo and Miami will return as of June 25th.
Outlook	Political	Trade union movement (PIT-CNT) <u>announced</u> a general work strike "against hunger and inequality" on June 17th.
