Among many others, government <u>lost</u> in Buenos Aires province, the most populated district and one of its traditional allies.</li> <li>Opposition coalition won the primary elections and is gaining momentum for the 2023 presidential elections.</li> <li>In the wake of the government's defeat, the local press began to mention a <u>possible</u> risk of management radicalization. Likewise, post-election, the President made public appearances with his most contested ministers, thereby reducing rumors of cabinet changes according to the <u>press.</u></li> </ul>
	Economic	• Following the government's defeat, Argentine companies' shares rise. <u>Local press</u> assures markets are "celebrating".
