

COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Argentina: The mid-term primary legislative elections will be held next Sunday.

Bolivia: Ministry of Health presents vaccination coverage map to facilitate public policy decision-making.

Brazil: As COVID cases drop, attention turns to political demonstrations on Independence Day.

Colombia: Digital vaccination certificate was launched by the government.

Chile: Lowest positivity rate registered since the pandemic started.

Ecuador: The Ministry of Health began the countdown to meet the goal of the 9/100 Vaccination Plan.

Mexico: President AMLO presented his third yearly government report.

Paraguay: Clinical trial for Taiwanese COVID-19 vaccine to take place in the country.

Peru: The National Institute of Health (INS) reported that the country registers 86 cases of the 'Mu' variant.

Uruguay: President met with Ministers to analyze strategies in defense of the Urgent Consideration Law (LUC) since it may be submitted to referendum.

	Health	 At the G20 Health Ministers' meeting, the Argentine Health Minister highlighted the challenge of strengthening a "coordinated and equitable" global response to future pandemics. President Fernandez promised the General Workers' Central (CGT) extra assistance for Social Works before the end of the year.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Argentina <u>received</u> in total more than 57 million vaccines against COVID-19. Government <u>surpassed</u> its self-imposed goal of applying 7 million second doses during August. Vaccination schedules have been completed for 70% of the population over 50 years of age.
	Economic	 Government <u>extended</u> meat export ban until the end of October.
	Country Opening	 As from September 6th and until October 1st, the quota of Argentine and resident passengers allowed to return (via planes) to the country will be increased to 2,300 per day, local press reported.
Outlook	Political	 The mid-term legislative elections will be held next Sunday. As these are primaries, they serve to define which forces can compete in the general elections and which candidates will compete within each force. Campaign closings of the main political forces are scheduled for next Thursday. While the Front for all (ruling party) will close the campaign in La Plata (BA provinces) with the President's presence, Together (opposition) has not yet defined the venue, local press reported.
	Economic	 According to private <u>consulting firms</u>, August inflation would be around 2.7%. It would be the first time in ten months that inflation would be below 3%.

	Health	 The Ministry of Health <u>enables</u> free health care registration for migrants living in Bolivia.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 A new shipment of 30,000 Sputnik doses arrived in the country last week. President Arce confirmed that more dosed will land in the upcoming days. President Arce announced that Bolivia will receive 3.3 million Sinopharm doses allowing full vaccine access for over 86% of people. Nonetheless, in this moment Bolivia has only fully vaccinated over 25% of their eligible population. While Bolivia managed to decrease COVID-19 cases by 21%, young adults (18 to 29 years old) are the ones that attend the least to get inoculated. La Paz amongst the departments with less progress in rural vaccination. Ministry of Health presents a vaccination coverage map to facilitate monitoring and public policy decision-making.
	Economic	 Government enacted Law No. 1391 on tax incentives to support and promote productive activity amid the economic recovery. The measure reduces to 0% the rate of the Value Added Tax (VAT) for importing capital goods, industrial plants, machinery, and equipment for agriculture, industry, construction and mining, establishing as well a zero-rate regime for domestic capital goods, machinery, and equipment.
Outlook	Political	Over 95% of the wildfires in the eastern part of the country were controlled by the government and local authorities. The country has faced outstanding problems amid a strong summer season that has triggered forest fires and consume vast areas. While the most affected areas border Brazil, this year forest fires have consumed more than 147,000 hectares in Bolivia's eastern Santa Cruz department.
	Economic	• Bolivian economy grows 8.7% as of June 2021.

Government	Health	 The weekly average of deaths from COVID-19 in Brazil is at its lowest level since December of 2020, reflecting the success of the vaccination campaign and health measures. The Ministry of Health and ANVISA suspended the Brazil-Argentina soccer match due to non-compliance with sanitary measures, which will be investigated by the Pandemic CPI.
Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Brazil has <u>distributed</u> more than 200 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines, with 31.1% of the population fully vaccinated and an additional 33.7% partially vaccinated. The distribution of booster doses to the elderly and immunocomprimised has <u>begun</u> in state capitals including Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo.
Outlook	Political	 Brazilian Independence Day, on September 7th, will <u>delay</u> the work week in Congress until Wednesday, when the House will discuss changes to the Electoral Code and the Senate will consider the Industrialized Products Tax Law. Protests scheduled for the holiday in support of President Bolsonaro's Paper Ballot amendment and against the ministers of the Supreme Federal Tribunal will <u>demonstrate</u> Bolsonaro's ability to mobilize his base.
Outlook	Economic	 Brazil's GDP <u>fell</u> 0.1% in the second quarter, due to declines in agriculture and industry, leading to fears of a "sideways recovery" where vaccination leads to shifts in consumption from goods to services rather than growth in the overall economy. The release of the IPCA inflation data on September 9th and retail data on the 10th will <u>provide</u> a deeper look into Brazil's economic recovery.

	Health	 Ministry of Health <u>launches</u> National Health Plan for the Elderly (2020-2030). CONFUSAM <u>announced</u> a national strike due to the delays of the commitments announced by the Ministry of Health at the beginning of the year. While protests are still not a major risk, demands may intensify months before elections.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	Two new vaccine shipments <u>arrived</u> in the country adding more than 720,000 doses.
	Economic	 Government <u>announced</u> the National Mining Policy 2050 that seeks to generate a more sustainable model for the Chilean industry. Over 3,500 representatives of the sector, NGOs, union groups, and academic leaders participated throughout the drafting process.
	Political	 President Piñera <u>signs</u> a decree that creates the Ministry of Public Security. The new office will restructure the current functions of the Ministry of the Interior granting urban security a priority within the agenda.
Outlook	Social	 Ministry of Education <u>launches</u> digital platform to grant information of every educational establishment around the country, in order to provide clear and useful information for policymakers. The government <u>launched</u> an overarching plan to prevent and fight forest fires amid a complex water crisis.
	Economic	• The latest economic data <u>provided</u> by the National Statistical Center (INE) confirms a positive outlook one year after the government launched the economic recovery plan. The unemployment rate reached 8.9% representing a 4.2 points drop compared to the same quarter of the previous year. Meanwhile, in July the economic activity grew 18.1% compared to the same month of the previous year, a number above projections.

Government Measures	Health	 Health Superintendency to <u>participate</u> along the monitoring process of the Ten-Year Health Plan goals, Ministry of Health announced. New <u>guidelines</u> for HIV / AIDS care launched. Director of National Health Institute <u>established</u> that following a seroprevalence study carried out in 12 cities, 89% of the population has already had COVID-19. Minister of Health delivers information of COVID-19 <u>variants</u> within the country's epidemiological specter.
	Vaccine Rollout	Digital vaccination certificate was <u>launched</u> by the government to facilitate the registration and monitoring of those fully vaccinated in the country.
Outlook	Political	 President Duque <u>celebrated</u> the appointment of Sergio Diaz-Granados as the new executive president of the Latin America Development Bank (CAF). Diaz-Granados would be the first Colombian to occupy this position. Government <u>released</u> a new administrative procedure code, which improves public instruments providing tools and simplifying executive procedures in public offices. Minister of Technology Karen Abudinen will <u>remain</u> in her post after an accountability session failed to endorse the minister's resignation. Right-wing sectors, Cambio Radical, Partido de la U, and some representatives from the Liberal Party backed Abudinen amid alleged funds misuse by government contractors. Gustavo Petro's political platform will <u>become</u> an official party after the Constitutional Court granted legal status to <i>Colombia Humana</i>. This is a key announcement amid the presidential campaign as greater benefits are going to be arranged for the left-wing movement.
	Economic	Unemployment rate in July <u>decreased</u> to 14.3% according to the National Department of Statistics (DANE). While July's numbers were below those registered in the same period of 2020, in the previous month, almost 3 million Colombians have recovered their jobs.

Government Measures	Health	 The National Agency for Health Regulation, Control and Surveillance (ARCSA) <u>announced</u> the digitization of 42 institutional procedures. The Minister of Health <u>participated</u> in the signing of a cooperation agreement between the National Institute for Donation and Transplantation of Organs, Tissues and Cells (INDOT) and LATAM airlines. During the month of September, the supply of medicines to the certain health units will <u>begin</u> as part of the focalized emergency. The Ministry of Health has <u>guaranteed</u> the supply of medicines for patients with Hemophilia. The WHO named variant B.1.621 as Mu and <u>classified</u> it as "of interest", with a significant prevalence in Ecuador.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The Ministry of Health <u>began</u> the countdown to meet the goal of the 9/100 Vaccination Plan of inoculating 9 million people in 100 days. The Government <u>emphasized</u> that it will continue to vaccinate with the same intensity until reaching 85% of the population.
	Economic	The British Embassy and ARCSA will <u>sign</u> a memorandum of understanding.
Outlook	Political	 President Lasso <u>marked</u> the first 100 days of his government. Different legislative benches have <u>announced</u> their rejection to the general state budget presented to the National Assembly.
	Economic	The Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) <u>estimated</u> a growth of 3% for the Ecuadorian economy.
	Social	 Ecuador has <u>sent</u> a shipment of humanitarian aid to Haiti that included 300,000 tablets of hydroxychloroquine. Associations of patients with rare diseases <u>requested</u> the government access to medicines. President Lasso met with the new president of the CAF to <u>promote</u> social development projects.

Government Measures	Health	 The Secretary of Health <u>reported</u> that up to date they have acquired 390 million pieces of medicines and supplies for federal hospitals, national health institutes, INSABI and IMSS. The Health Institute for Wellbeing (Insabi) <u>delivered</u> hightech equipment for diagnostic imaging to hospitals in three states. Authorities from the INSABI <u>led</u> the twelfth meeting with parents of children with cancer. INSABI and UNOPS <u>reported</u> that until August 140 million pieces of health supplies have been delivered.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The Federal Commission for the Protection against Sanitary Risks (COFEPRIS) released six batches of the AstraZeneca vaccine packaged in Mexico. The Committee on New Molecules gave a favorable opinion for the emergency use of the Abdala vaccine. President AMLO reaffirmed the government has no intention to vaccinate minors.
	Economic	 The Economy Secretariat <u>participated</u> in in the fifth meeting of the Commission of the Comprehensive and Progressive Treaty of Trans-Pacific Partnership. The High-Level Economic Dialogue between Mexico and the United States to be <u>reactivated</u> in September. The Labor Secretariat <u>celebrated</u> that the reform in terms of subcontracting represents a paradigm shift.
Outlook	Political	 President AMLO <u>presented</u> his third yearly government report, where he emphasized that they had been able to lay the foundations for the transformation. President AMLO <u>announced</u> the departure of the head of the Legal Counsel of the Presidency. The Senate <u>approved</u> the Mandate Revocation Law.
	Social	President AMLO <u>launched</u> the start of the 2021 National Collection of the Mexican Red Cross.


Government Measures	Health	 The National Institute of Health (INS) reported that the country registers 86 cases of the 'Mu' variant. The Ministry of Health trained health professionals in molecular testing for COVID-19 in the event of a third wave. The creation of the National Network of Communicators (RNC) which will serve as an articulated space to establish health policies was announced. President Castillo Castillo carried out an unexpected inspection today at the National Institute of Child Health.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The Ministry of Health <u>approved</u> the protocol for the vaccination against COVID-19 of pregnant women from 12 weeks of pregnancy, including adolescents. The Ministry of Health <u>started</u> the vaccination process for teachers in urban areas. The Minister of Health <u>reported</u> that thanks to the availability of vaccines, new vaccination strategies will be worked on to protect half of the target population.
	Country Opening	The government <u>lifted</u> the suspension of flights from Brazil and India and extended the ban on flights from South Africa.
	Economic	 The government <u>detailed</u> the draft Budget for 2022 before the Congress. The Ministry of Economy <u>modified</u> the guidelines of the national government guarantee program for companies in the financial system.
	Political	 President Castillo <u>announced</u> that his government will empower women and that there will be a greater female presence in the Executive branch.
Outlook	Economic	 Moody's <u>adjusted</u> the country's credit rating to Baa1 and changed the economic growth projection to 12% for 2021. The Economy Minister <u>revealed</u> that they are evaluating a possible tax collection on digital platforms.
	Social	The "Union of Trade Unions of Peru" <u>urged</u> the President to prioritize the generation of decent employment.

	Economic	 Ministry of Labor <u>extended</u> partial unemployment insurance for sectors affected by pandemic until March 2022. Government <u>announced</u> a drop in fuel prices as of September 1st.
	Country opening	Government <u>authorized</u> public admission and commercial reactivation in football tournaments. Capacity will be 40%.
Outlook	Political	 President <u>Lacalle Pou</u> participated in the Global Summit on Trade in Services. Minister of Economy <u>traveled</u> to meet with her Brazilian counterpart to discuss MERCOSUR's flexibilization. The President <u>met</u> with Ministers to analyze strategies in defense of the Urgent Consideration Law (LUC). Meanwhile, <u>political parties</u> have already launched their campaigns for a "yes" or "no" vote in the referendum against the LUC.
