COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Argentina: While newly elected legislators take office this week, technical meetings with the IMF to define Argentina's debt agreement begin.

Bolivia: National healthcare system equipped to detect the new Omicron variant.

Brazil: The economy entered a recession despite lifting of sanitary restrictions.

Colombia: Border reopening between Colombia and Ecuador will begin as of December 15.

Chile: Health authorities detected first case of Omicron variant.

Ecuador: The tax reform proposed by President Lasso came into force.

Mexico: The government detected the first positive case of the Omicron variant.

Paraguay: Amid efforts to revamp vaccination against COVID-19, DINAVISA confirms that as over 20,000 doses expired, they will be incinerated.

Peru: The government announced new measures to prevent expansion of the Omicron variant

Uruguay: Approximately 20,000 signatures remain to be validated by the Electoral Court to confirm the call for a referendum against the Urgent Consideration Law.

	Health	 First case of Omicron variant detected in traveler from South Africa. Authorities of the Ministry of Health met with the WHO's General Director for Access to Medicines and Health Products. Among other issues, they discussed transparency in contracts and concerns about the high prices of certain drugs. Ministry of Health and National Agency on Disability (ANDIS) signed an agreement to strengthen care for people with disabilities.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Following ANMAT's evaluation, the Ministry of Health granted emergency authorization for the Sputnik Light COVID-19 vaccine. Minister of Science and Technology stated that Argentine vaccine against COVID-19 would be available by the end of 2022.
	Economic	 <u>Technical meetings</u> to define concrete steps for the debt negotiations with the IMF begin this week. President Fernandez <u>announced</u> the creation of the Productive Plan 2030. It is to boost industry, exports and employment.
	Country Opening	 Minister of Tourism <u>affirmed</u> that no new restrictions are being evaluated despite the expansion of the Omicron variant.
	Political	 New Deputies and Senators <u>take</u> office this week. Minister of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries initiates meetings with representatives of the meat industry to define the future of meat export restrictions, local press <u>reported</u>.
Outlook	Social	 Government will hold a <u>mobilization</u> for the "Democracy Day". The event will be attended by social movements and, according to <u>local press</u>, will include speeches by President Fernandez and VP Cristina Kirchner and former Brazilian President Lula Da Silva.

	Health	• The Ministry of Health <u>announced</u> a USD \$10 million budget to guarantee free treatment for people living with HIV-AIDS in the country.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 More than 8.7 million people have been fully <u>vaccinated</u> in the country, according to the Ministry of Health's records. PAHO country representative Alma Morales, <u>highlighted</u> that Bolivia had the capacity to detect the Omicron variant due to the equipment installed at the National Institute of Health (INLASA).
incusures	Economic	Government <u>increases</u> smuggling controls amid concerns over the entry of illegal trade during December.
	Political	 President Arce <u>received</u> letters of credentials from new ambassadors of Peru, Sweden, Egypt, and France. The government agreed to strengthen joint actions in cross- cutting issues with the four countries, especially in health, infrastructure, technology, tourism, and trade.
Outlook Economic	 President Arce <u>launched</u> the Biofuels Forum on December 3rd in the city of Santa Cruz. International and local experts have been providing information on energy transition and the benefits of a sustainable economy moving forward. Additionally, panelists highlighted Bolivia's capacity to manufacture eco-friendly fuels as well as the need to depend less on importations. Among the projects <u>announced</u> during the meeting was the construction of a Renewable Diesel Plant in the department of Santa Cruz. President Luis Arce <u>highlighted</u> that mining royalties are on the rise due to a sustained increase in production reported in the last months.

	Health	 Brazil has <u>confirmed</u> six cases of the Omicron variant in Rio Grande do Sul, São Paulo, and Brasilía. Brazil <u>reached</u> its lowest average deaths from COVID-19 since April 2020, at the beginning of the pandemic. A change to the Ministry of Health's reporting rules in May <u>could</u> be leading to an undercount of COVID-19 cases according to analysts from Fiocruz.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Over 90% of the eligible population has <u>received</u> at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. The State Health Secretary of Mato Grosso do Sul <u>suggested</u> sending vaccines to Bolivia and Paraguay, due to low vaccine availability in both countries.
	Country Opening	 President Bolsonaro has <u>sent</u> a provisional measure to restrict the government's ability to create a COVID-19 vaccine passport to Congress, while the House is set to consider the passport on Wednesday (8).
Outlook	Political	 The Judicial Debt PEC <u>remains</u> in limbo after returning to the House, with Speaker Arthur Lira preferring to separate the amendment into two, against the will of the Senate. Bolsonaro's 2022 electoral coalition <u>appears</u> likely to include the Progressives (PP) and the Republicans, providing the president with more mandated airtime and party capacity but changing his rhetoric towards the political establishment.
	Economic	 The Monetary Policy Committee of the Central Bank is expected to raise the SELIC interest rate by 1.5% on Wednesday (8), following increasingly high inflation. Brazil entered a technical recession last week following two quarters of consecutive GDP declines, with the future of economic growth in 2022 more dependent on export-oriented sectors like agribusiness and mining.

	Vaccine Rollout	 The ISP <u>authorized</u> vaccines for children between 3 to 5 years old.
Government Measures	Economic	 Ministry of Finance increased its public sector salary readjustment offer to 6.1% after several meetings with public associations. Luis Felipe Céspedes was appointed as the new advisor of Chile's Central Bank. Cespedes will join the bank as of February 2022.
Outlook	Political	 The Constitutional Assembly approved adopting "institutional and democratic measures" to halt violent manifestations and strikes moving forward. Far right-wing Jose Antonio Kast <u>visited</u> the United States in a brief tour to meet with politicians and business leaders. Constitutional members to <u>present</u> policy guidelines that establishes greater fiscal, administrative, and political capacity for local governments. Former minister Sebastian Sichel <u>announced</u> support for right-wing candidate Jose Antonio Kast after accepting a list of commitments and proposals. Leftist Gabriel Boric <u>tops</u> the latest CADEM poll for the December 19 presidential runoff.
	Economic	 OECD raises Chile's GDP growth forecast to 12% this year but <u>estimates</u> an economic contraction for 2022. According to the organism, this year's growth will be driven by a strong consumption driven by to the fiscal stimulus enacted by the Chilean government, pension withdrawals, and the relaxation of mobility restrictions. A high economic activity in October opens space for the Central Bank to improve fiscal <u>projections</u>. Unemployment <u>fell</u> to 8.1% from August to October, the latest INE's report concluded.

Outlook	Political	 Youth Councils <u>elections</u> took place to elect more than 10,000 young leaders. While nearly 12 million Colombians from ages 14 to 28 were enabled to vote, authorities reported a low level of participation. Barranquilla <u>hosted</u> the 27th edition of the World Law Congress. More than 1500 participants took part in the event, among them King Felipe VI of Spain and the president of the Organization of American States (OAS) Luis Almagro. 2022 general elections will <u>have</u> special software to ensure transparency, local press announced. The National Electoral Office (CNE) <u>returns</u> legal status to Ingrid Betancourt's political party.
	Economic	The third and last VAT-free day took place. While the government confirmed that the commerce sector is recovering and that sales exceeded all expectations (COP \$11.2 billion approximately), experts warned a possible increase in inflation, especially in the telecommunications and fashion sectors.

	Health	 Doctor Óscar Barreneche was <u>named</u> as the new PAHO / WHO representative in Ecuador. Members of the National Association of Private Clinics and Hospitals of Ecuador <u>elected</u> their authorities for 2021 – 2023 period.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Due to the presence of the omicron variant, the Ministry of Health <u>decided</u> to start administering third doses of the COVID-19 vaccine in December instead of January.
Government Measures	Country Opening	 The governments of Ecuador and Colombia <u>postponed</u> the opening of the shared border until December 15. Measures that seek to delay the arrival of the Omicron variant in Ecuador <u>came</u> into force.
	Economic	 The tax reform proposed by President Lasso <u>came</u> into force. The Foreign Trade Committee <u>suspended</u> the simplifying procedures for products subject to prior import controls until February 2022. The Minister of Labor <u>decided</u> to extend the deadline for setting the basic salary in 2022.
Outlook	Political	 Assembly members <u>delivered</u> a bill repealing the tax reform; a lawsuit of unconstitutionality will also be filed. The government <u>defended</u> the 2022 Budget against objections from the National Assembly.
	Economic	 The Minister of Labor <u>assured</u> that the draft for the labor reform is ready, but they are yet to present it to the National Assembly. The Constitutional Court <u>prohibited</u> extractive activities in the Río Magdalena mining project.

Government Measures	Health	 The government <u>detected</u> the first positive sample for the Omicron variant. COFEPRIS <u>issued</u> an authorization for emergency use of an injectable combination to treat COVID-19. The results of the National Health and Nutrition Survey (Ensanut) 2020 were <u>presented</u>. New directors of BIRMEX and ISSSTE were <u>appointed</u>. INSABI and UNOPS <u>announced</u> the consolidated purchase results for 2021 and the national supply actions for 2022.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The Health Secretariat <u>reported</u> that 134 million doses against COVID-19 have been supplied so far in the 32 states. President AMLO <u>announced</u> the government will start to administer the booster vaccine for adults over 65 years old.
	Economic	 A 22% increase to the minimum wage for 2022 was approved. The Senate approved the appointment of Victoria Rodríguez Ceja as a member of the Governing Board of Banco de Mexico.
Outlook	Political	 Mexico <u>chaired</u> the III Ministerial Forum Meeting of the ECLAC – China. High-level representatives of Mexico and the US <u>met</u> within the framework of the Bilateral Executive Committee for the Border Administration. The federal government will <u>seek</u> to dialogue with opposition political parties. The consultation to revoke the mandate will <u>take</u> place on April 10, if the necessary signatures are gathered.

	Vaccine Rollout	 Over 22,000 doses of AZ vaccines <u>expired</u> and will be incinerated by DINAVISA. Health brigades carry out <u>vaccination</u> against COVID-19 in commercial areas in Asuncion. COVID-19 vaccination strategies to be <u>intensified</u> in Alto Parana, Central, Itapua, and Caaguazu departments. 

The National Center for the Supply of Strategic Health Resources <u>distributed</u> 624 126 kilos of medical supplies during November. A new Antiretroviral Treatment Center was <u>inaugurated</u>.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	Restrictions for those who are not fully vaccinated have been pushed forward to begin on December 10 th .
	Country Opening	New measures to prevent expansion of the omicron variant of COVID-19 were <u>announced</u> .
	Economic	 Minister of Economy <u>led</u> technical meetings with regional governors to collect their concerns over budget. Minister of Foreign Trade and health authorities are <u>working</u> on a new mechanism to streamline health control in foreign trade.
Outlook	Political	 President Castillo <u>reaffirmed</u> his commitment to decentralization and joint work with regional governments. President Castillo will <u>hold</u> various meetings with the leaders of political parties with parliamentary representation. The Peruvian government and the OAS <u>signed</u> a Joint Declaration in favor of democracy, human rights, security and development.
	Economic	 President Castillo <u>stated</u> his government's decision to avoid shortages and price rises. The IMF <u>affirmed</u> that there is room to increase progressivity of the mining tax regime.
	Social	 President Castillo <u>spoke</u> with the Secretary General of the OAS on governance and the fight against corruption. The government <u>declared</u> four regions in a state of emergency to serve those affected by the earthquake.

Delegation of the Ministry of Public Health expressed its willingness to work on new proposals to positively impact international health at the extraordinary meeting of the World Health Assembly. Ministry of Public Health promotes free tests for HIV detection.
	Economic	 Uruguay <u>completed</u> UD S\$442 million public bond issue in the Japanese market. The issuance was made at historically low rates.
	Country opening	 President Lacalle Pou ruled out the implementation of restrictive measures in the context of Omicron's variable expansion, local press <u>reported</u>.
Outlook	Political	 The Electoral Court <u>surpassed</u> 650,000 validated signatures. Approximately 20,000 signatures remain to be validated to confirm the call for a referendum against the Urgent Consideration Law (LUC), local press remarked. <u>Turnout</u> of more than 100,000 people at the internal voting to define the new President of <i>Frente Amplio</i>, the main opposition party of the country. Results are not yet available.
	Economic	 According to <u>INE</u>, unemployment dropped in October to 8%. Labor Minister <u>assured</u> that the 90 000 jobs lost during 2020 have already been recovered. International Monetary Fund <u>praised</u> Uruguay's actions in response to the pandemic.
