Government Measures	Health	 The ministry of health <u>denied</u> a new COVID-19 outbreak despite an increase of confirmed cases. New oxygen plant was <u>inaugurated</u> at Chuquisaca last week.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Government <u>announced</u> the arrival of 522,500 doses to complete the vaccination process of those who received the Sputnik V vaccine. Around one million Pfizer vaccines from the COVAX-Facility mechanism will <u>arrive</u> in Bolivia as of October 19. With this new shipment, the government is expecting to start vaccinating people between 16 and 17 years. Bolivia <u>announced</u> booster shots for people with underlying health conditions and those over 60 years.
	Economic	• As of October 6, the return of contributions <u>begins</u> through the National Financial System, Ministry of Economy announced.
	Country Opening	 According to the Ministry of Education, over 80% of students in Bolivia are already <u>attending</u> schools signaling a positive reopening process.
Outlook	Political	• Sectors from the opposition in Bolivia <u>called</u> for a civic strike to protest against the government as well as to demand the immediate release of former president Jeanine Añez.
	Economic	 According to President Arce, Bolivia's ammonia and urea plant is already <u>operating</u> at 75% of its capacity and a sales growth of USD \$236.5 million is expected by the end of the year. World Bank projections <u>estimate</u> a 5.5% growth of the Bolivian economy for 2021. Over BOB \$17 million have been <u>returned</u> to vulnerable families after the RE-IVA reactivation plan was announced at the beginning of the year.

Government Measures	Health	 The Pandemic CPI <u>approved</u> a new request for testimony from the Health Minister Marcelo Quiroga ahead of presenting the committee's final report. The Health Ministry <u>declined</u> to investigate an unfulfilled contract for BRL 1 billion in respirators.
	Vaccine Rollout	 60% of the adult population in Brazil is now fully vaccinated against COVID-19, while the vaccination campaign has now shifted to include booster doses for the elderly and immunocompromised. The Ministry of Health will not use the CoronaVac vaccine in its immunization campaign in 2022, citing low effectiveness in elderly populations.
Outlook	Political	 Due to the holiday on Tuesday, large projects are not being considered in the Legislature, with focus instead <u>turning</u> to committee hearings. The unification of the Democrats (DEM) and the Social Liberal Party (PSL), <u>demonstrated</u> progress in center-right negotiations for a third-way candidacy to oppose President Bolsonaro and former President Lula in the 2022 elections. Ministerial conflicts over the budget are <u>beginning</u> to arise as the end of the year approaches, with Minister Marcos Pontes (Science and Technology) expressing his discontent with his portfolio's budget for 2022 on social media.
	Economic	 Tax Reform <u>remains</u> a politically contentious topic, with little consensus in the Senate, even with the watered-down reform that would require complementary legislation. Central Bank data on services and GDP forecast will be <u>released</u> this week and inform opinions on the economy through the end of the year, after disappointing data for commerce and industry, which both saw significant monthly declines last week.

	Health	• The Breast Cancer Prevention Campaign <u>took place</u> last week. According to the Ministry of Health, breast cancer is the most frequent disease and the leading cancer death within the female population.
	Vaccine Rollout	• President Piñera <u>presented</u> the results of the first study of COVID-19 booster doses that revealed an increase of effectiveness and immunization among those vaccinated. More than 2 million people participated along the research.
Government Measures	Economic	 Chilean Corfo <u>announced</u> free courses and conferences to promote the green hydrogen industry in the country with the goal of attracting investors. According to the government, 25% of the green hydrogen projects would start operations before 2030. MTT and Movistar <u>inaugurated</u> the country's first regional 5G campus at the Catholic University of Valparaíso. Authorities <u>explained</u> the new registration process for the Universal Emergency Family Income (IFE). Concerns over the fourth pension withdrawal <u>continues</u> to generate discussions at the legislative level and beyond.
Outlook	Political	 Government <u>announced</u> changes to the reopening border plan as of the first week of November after a reduction of COVID-19 cases. The Constituent Assembly <u>approved</u> its last regulatory guideline and is now ready to begin drafting the new constitution. The content will begin to be written by next Monday, October 18. Leftist Gabriel Boric <u>leads</u> the presidential race as far-right Kast surpassed Sebastian Sichel in the second place, according to the latest Criteria poll.
	Economic	• Experts <u>anticipates</u> a complex economic scenario due to the dollar, oil and copper prices as well as inflation volatility.

Outlook	Political	 President Duque along with other high-level officials <u>met</u> to discuss the main advances of the <i>Pacto de Leticia</i> Agreement, anticipating concrete actions that will be announced at COP26. President Duque <u>gathered</u> with Zac Goldsmith, UK's Minister for Pacific and the Environment last week. Both leaders agreed to continue strengthening bilateral environmental relationships as well as enforcing actions to tackle climate change. Angela Ospina was <u>appointed</u> as Ambassador of Colombia to Mexico. Among its objectives on the agenda are to strengthen the Pacific Alliance bilateral relations, accelerate security agreements, and prioritize investment and cultural exchanges. Prior to the appointment, Ospina worked as the director of the Presidential Agency for International Cooperation.
	Economic	 Rating agency Moody's <u>keeps</u> Colombia credit rating and raises outlook to stable. This decision was taken after Fitch downgraded Colombia's ratings in the first weeks of July.

Government Measures	Health	• The Ministry of Health announced a 13% <u>increase</u> in cases of the delta variant of coronavirus, concentrated in the Alto Paraná and Central regions.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Alejandro Dominguez, president of Comebol, <u>announced</u> that 30,000 doses of Coronavac will be donated to the government of Paraguay. Mexico will <u>donate</u> 150,000 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine to Paraguay.
	Country Opening	• Considering the <u>improvement</u> in the epidemiological situation, the government of Paraguay contemplates eliminating restrictions on night movement in the country.
Outlook	Political	 The strike of teachers continues, now turning into a hunger strike. They remain firm in their request for a 16% salary increase as Government sets its proposal on a 11% increase. Paraguay held local <u>elections</u> last weekend, with a turnout of 60.55%, over 81 thousand blank votes and placing the Colorado party with the best results by mayor. Authorities from the Foreign Ministries of Paraguay and Bolivia held a virtual meeting, addressing various issues of their bilateral agenda.
	Economic	 Teresa Rivarola de Velilla is <u>appointed</u> as the new head of the Financial Development Agency (AFD), replacing Maria Carrón. Strategic <u>investment</u> managed by the Ministry of Public Works, whose projects are mainly focused on economic recovery, increased 27.8% during September.

The Ministry of Health is seeking to strengthen the closing of gaps in the application of first and second doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine. PAHO reported that the Covax Facility mechanism will not be able to comply with the delivery to Peru of the total number of COVID-19 vaccines committed for this year.
	Country Opening	• The Ministry of Health and the National Police will verify that public transport <u>complies</u> with COVID-19 biosafety protocols.
	Economic	 The government <u>ratified</u> Julio Velarde as president of the Central Reserve Bank.
Outlook	Political	 President Castillo <u>participated</u> in the swearing-in ceremony of a new ministerial cabinet, after accepting the resignation of Prime Minister Guido Bellido. The INDECOPI <u>reaffirmed</u> its commitment to the approval of the National Intellectual Property Policy (PNPI) in Peru. President Castillo <u>sent</u> a letter to OECD to ratify the country's aspiration to be part of the organization.
	Economic	 President Castillo stated that the government is working on reversing the increase in the price of the basic family basket. The World Bank <u>reduced</u> Peru's economic growth projection to 3.2% by 2022.
