COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Argentina: In general mid-term legislative elections the government was defeated in 15 provinces and lost control of the Senate.

Bolivia: COVID-19 cases increased by 400% in Santa Cruz amid the social unrest.

Brazil: Average cases and deaths began rising again, ahead of the holiday season.

Colombia: Ministry of Health installed a roundtable to strengthen the public hospitals system around the country.

Chile: Concerns over COVID-19 outbreak one week before elections.

Ecuador: President Lasso changed Armed Forces chiefs after prison riot.

Mexico: The 2022 Expenditure Budget was approved by Congress.

Paraguay: The Executive branch, Ministry of Health, and business representatives announced a campaign to give greater incentives for vaccinated people.

Peru: ECLAC agreed to strengthen cooperation in different areas.

Uruguay: Central Bank of Uruguay raised its interest rate to contain inflation.

Government Measures	Health	 President Fernandez met with the interministerial commission in charge of carrying out vaccine production projects. The Development Plan for Pharmaceutical Services based on Primary Health Care was <u>approved</u>. It is an initiative promoting the strengthening of the actions carried out by pharmacy professionals throughout the country.
	Vaccine Rollout	 A shipment of 870,000 Sinopharm vaccines <u>arrived</u> in the country. Argentina to <u>donate</u> COVID-19 vaccines.
	Economic	• At a joint press conference, authorities <u>confirmed</u> the agreement to freeze drug prices. The agreement is framed within a strategy to curb inflation and will be extended until January 7.
	Country Opening	• In the city of Buenos Aires, it is no longer <u>mandatory</u> to wear a mask in kindergarten and first cycle of elementary school.
Outlook	Political	 In mid-term legislative elections the government was defeated in 15 provinces and lost control of the Senate. The government managed to improve its performance in the province of Buenos Aires with respect to the primary elections but was unable to achieve victory. After electoral defeat, the President <u>called</u> for a dialogue with the opposition and for a debt agreement in the Congress. In this context, pro-government social movements are preparing a demonstration in support of President Alberto Fernandez. The Food Front Labeling Law was <u>enacted</u>. Now begins the regulation period for which the executive has 90 days.
	Economic	• <u>Inflation</u> was 3.5% in October and already exceeded 40% so far in 2021.

	Health Vaccine Rollout Economic	 Government <u>launched</u> free cancer treatments for adult patients. Ministry of Health reported that COVID-19 cases <u>increased</u> by 400% in Santa Cruz due to the social unrest. Health authorities to <u>begin</u> vaccinating children ages 12-17. ICAM and HUB 7 <u>signed</u> alliance to promote entrepreneurship projects across the country.
Government Measures	Political	 President Arce <u>visited</u> Brazil to meet with the Bolivian community and address the economic reactivation, education, and health initiatives enforced amid the pandemic. While the government <u>announced</u> the repeal of the Bill 1386 after six days of national strike, opposition groups stepped up its demands on President Arce and called for the repeal of more laws and regulatory actions. As of last week, <u>several</u> road blockades remain in force in Santa Cruz main streets but also in other cities of the country such as Sucre, Cochabamba, and Potosi. Meanwhile, pro-government union leaders, mining workers, and indigenous communities <u>announced</u> holding a march to La Paz to defend Arce's administration.
Outlook	Economic	 According to experts, <u>delays</u> on the presentation of the 2022 general budget signals uncertainty within the government of the sources of financing that will be used. The budget bill should already be under treatment in Congress. Farmers <u>reported</u> USD \$2 million in damage from road blockades amid strikes in different cities of Bolivia.

Government Measures	Health	 The Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (Fiocruz) issued a warning in its COVID-19 bulletin over the threat that rising cases in Europe and Asia could pose to Brazil. The Ministry of Health launched a campaign to promote primary health care and basic health units, as part of the Unified Health System.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The federal government <u>expects</u> to receive 24.4 million COVID-19 vaccine doses from Pfizer, AstraZeneca, and Janssen in December. Of the eligible population, 156.3 million people (88.3%) have <u>received</u> at least one dose, while 124.6 million people (70.4%) have completed vaccination. Pfizer <u>submitted</u> a request to ANVISA for approval of its Comirnaty vaccine for children between the ages of 5 and 11.
	Country Opening	• The São Paulo coordinator for government action against COVID-19 <u>announced</u> that, going forward, social distancing measures and other restrictions will be lifted on the vaccinated and imposed on the unvaccinated.
Outlook	Political	 The Judicial Debt PEC was <u>approved</u> by the House of Representatives on Wednesday (10), but now moves to the Senate, where the conditions for approval are less favorable. President Bolsonaro is now <u>expected</u> to officially join the Liberal Party (PL) on November 22, after an announcement from the president of the party Valdemar Costa Neto.
	Economic	 The release of economic indicators for September and October were largely negative, with declines in industrial production and trade, along with lower-than-expected growth in services and higher inflation. Despite the negative economic indicators, Minister of Economy Paulo Guedes <u>stated</u> that markets are underestimating Brazil's growth potential, with his expectation that the economy will grow 5% in 2021 and continue to grow in 2022.
