

**Argentina:** The government unilaterally issues a resolution to freeze the prices of 1,500 food and consumer goods for 90 days.

**Bolivia:** Ministry of Health and PAHO announced joint actions to boost digital transformation.

**Brazil:** Pandemic CPI will vote on report this week, recommending charges against Bolsonaro.

**Colombia:** Inovio Pharma signed a non-biding memorandum with the Colombian government.

**Chile:** Ministry of Health, ECLAC, and PAHO presented the Healthy Aging 2021-2030 agenda in the Americas.

**Ecuador:** President Lasso fixed values for the sale of extra gasoline and diesel.

**Mexico:** Mexican and US authorities discussed an action plan for the development of the south of the country.

**Paraguay:** Kristalina Georgieva, from the IMF, addressed the economic recovery of the second half of 2021 and highlighted the good work done by Paraguay.

**Peru:** The National Health Institute confirmed the presence of Delta variant in all the country's regions.

**Uruguay:** Campaign in favor of the repeal of the Urgent Consideration Law's articles was officially launched.


