

COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Argentina: Minister of Economy adjusted upward the country's GDP growth forecast for 2021.

Bolivia: Sanitary measures to control the COVID-19 expansion were extended until December 31, 2021.

Brazil: Hospital systems are at their most stable point since the beginning of the pandemic.

Colombia: Sanitary Emergency extended for 90 more days

Chile: New strategies to boost COVID-19 testing and traceability controls were announced.

Ecuador: At the request of Vice President Borrero, the government reactivated the National Health Council.

Mexico: The National Electoral Institute formalized the new integration of the House of Representatives as of September 1.

Paraguay: As second-dose vaccination moves forward, first-doses are expected to resume next week.

Peru: Congress granted the vote of confidence to the Ministerial Cabinet.

Uruguay: While most of the population approves the management of the pandemic, process of signature verification to call for a referendum against a strategic law is advancing.

Government Measures	Health	 New meeting of the Federal Health Council to discuss the pandemic situation. The opening plan, the monitoring of indicators and the situation of the Delta variant are topics to be discussed. Cordoba province is the epicenter of the Delta variant in the country, concentrating 31% of the cases.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Argentina <u>surpassed</u> 50 million vaccine doses received. 60% of the population over 50 years of age already have two doses of COVID-19 <u>vaccines</u>. Richmond laboratory <u>delivered</u> 307,000 doses of locally produced Sputnik V component II.
	Economic	 Government <u>signed</u> a reference price agreement for construction materials. It is intended to provide predictability in public housing program budgets. Government <u>extended</u> the unemployment benefit until the end of the year. It is for people who have lost their jobs during the pandemic.
	Country Opening	 Uruguayan and Chilean tourists would be allowed to enter the country as of September 6th, local press <u>reported</u>.
Outlook	Political	 Minister of Economy <u>adjusted</u> upward (from 7% to 8%) the country's GDP growth forecast for 2021. Two weeks before the legislative elections, an opposition governor obtained a landslide victory in the province of Corrientes, local press <u>reported</u>. Government is planning an increase in the amount starting from which income tax is levied on employees in dependency. It is only for individuals, local press <u>reported</u>. Buenos Aires Province <u>obtained</u> 98% of the creditors' adherence to its debt swap.
	Economic	 According to the <u>Argentine Rural Society</u>, as a result of export closures, the Argentinean meat chain lost USD 1,000 between mid-April and the end of August.

	Health	 Local governments to <u>reform</u> vaccine strategies against measles, rubella and poliomyelitis. Ministry of Health <u>launched</u> the VII Scientific Conference on rare diseases. Different high-level panelists participated from cross-cutting sectors including experts from the San Andrés University (UMSA), Franz Tamayo University, and the Bolivian Children's Hospital. Government <u>launched</u> a digital-based system to facilitate workers access to social security benefits.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 Sanitary measures to control the COVID-19 expansion were extended until December 31, 2021. More than 3 million doses have not been yet administered in the country. The national government called on municipalities and departments to speed up the process.
	Economic	 Government <u>authorized</u> a fund to reactivate the construction of road infrastructure in rural zones. Bolivian Congress <u>approved</u> a government-backed bill that allowed a 15% withdrawal of private-held pensions funds to help overcome the pandemic crisis. This had been a key campaign pledge by President Luis Arce.
Outlook	Political	 Former President Jeanine Áñez <u>requests</u> precautionary measures from the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights amid concerns over her health condition. Carlos Mesa's opposition party <u>presents</u> a plan to reform Bolivian justice amid concerns on judicial mishandling.
	Economic	 President Luis Arce <u>highlighted</u> the contributions of Bolivian state-owned companies amid the economic recovery.

Government Measures	Health	 The President of the Pandemic CPI, Senator Omar Aziz (PSD/AM) <u>announced</u> that the body has ample evidence to indict multiple government officials for profiting from the pandemic. For the first time since the beginning of the pandemic, 20 states <u>have</u> bed occupancy rates below 50%, with only one state, Roraima, above 80% occupancy.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The Ministry of Health <u>announced</u> that vaccine booster doses will be distributed to those over the age of 70 and the immunocompromised, beginning in September. Brazil has <u>vaccinated</u> 80% of its population with a first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, but half of this group remains only partially vaccinated. Rio de Janeiro has begun <u>vaccinating</u> adolescents, which will be completed in September.
	Political	 Bolsonaro's relationship with the Judiciary is likely to remain tense as the president is using the conflict to generate electoral support for 2022. Income Tax Reform is on the House's agenda for August 31st, but continued disagreement over broader reform may delay voting on the project once again.
Outlook	Economic	 Debate over the Judicial Debt PEC continues, with former officials from the Ministry of the Economy arguing that the amendment will create larger future debt liabilities. Second quarter GDP data is due to be released on September 1st, with growth expected at 0.2%, down from the 1.2% growth seen in the first quarter. The Central Bank is continuing to pursue a tight monetary policy to counteract the inflationary effects from the water crisis, which is putting pressure on energy and food prices.

	Health	 The Undersecretary of Public Health <u>launched</u> new strategies to boost the testing and traceability controls against COVID-19.
	Vaccine Rollout	 New shipment of over 2 million Sinovac doses <u>arrived</u> in Chile. Sinovac has been the company with the highest number of vaccines administered in the country so far. New shipment of Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines <u>arrives</u> in the country.
Government Measures	Country Opening	 Experts <u>called</u> for a reopening plan based on sanitary conditions while encouraging female employment along the process.
	Economic	 Ministry of Agriculture <u>announced</u> agricultural emergency in four regions of the country amid intense water shortages reported in the past months. Final report on the employment recovery landscape in Chile was <u>launched</u> by the government. Chile <u>launched</u> program to help local farmers and boost agriculture production amid the economic recovery. Government <u>extends</u> the Employment Protection Law for one more month.
Outlook	Political	 Government to <u>announce</u> a strategic plan in Maule's region to confront the water crisis. Among the nine presidential candidacies that have <u>registered</u> before the National Electoral Office (Servel), only two are independent.
	Economic	 President Piñera <u>announces</u> the production of the first green hydrogen molecule in the country. This is another milestone in the country's intention to transit towards clean energies and decarbonize its energy matrix. 57% of Chileans <u>believe</u> that the best way to confront the economic crisis is by granting social packages for vulnerable populations.

	Health	Sanitary Emergency <u>extended</u> for 90 more days.
	Vaccine Rollout	 The government <u>surpassed</u> the 35 million doses applied and met in advance the goal proposed for August. Second Moderna shot <u>delayed</u> for three months, Minister of Health confirmed last week.
Government Measures	Economic	 Former minister of Finance Alberto Carrasquilla, the one that led the tax reform that resulted in a month of protests, was appointed as codirector on Colombia's Central Bank. This decision may generate backlash against president Iván Duque due to Carrasquilla's controversial profile. President Duque ratified its commitment towards SME's economic recovery announcing a bill to permit VAT free days. President Duque highlighted the approval, in first debate, of the Social Investment Law, which strengthens the free provision of public education and grants a special subsidy for youth employment.
Outlook	Political	 Colombian president Iván Duque and high-level officials visited South Korea to boost investments, reinforce the economic recovery plan, and prompt joint actions. In total, six cooperation agreements were signed and investment commitments with Korean officials that exceeded USD \$200 million were formalized. Former Minister of Health, Alejandro Gaviria launches bid for presidency.

Government Measures	Health	 At the request of Vice President Borrero, the government reactivated the National Health Council (CONASA). Vice President Borrero also released some details of the 2021 – 2025 Health Plan for Ecuador. The National Agency for Regulation, Control and Sanitary Surveillance (ARCSA) warned of the commercialization and irregular use of three medicines. The Ministry of Health identified 82 new cases of the Delta variant.
	Vaccine Rollout	 Due to the presence of COVID-19 variants of concern, the Ministry of Public Health <u>decided</u> to shorten the second dose application interval for the Astra Zeneca vaccine. 394,950 thousand new doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine <u>donated</u> by Canada will go to border areas or the country. Navigation on the digital platform of the Vaccine Meter was fully <u>enabled</u> after a technical review.
	Country Opening	 The College of Physicians of Pichincha <u>asked</u> the authorities to guarantee strict security protocols upon the return to face-to-face classes. The state of exception <u>ended</u> in the provinces of El Oro and Guayaquil.
	Economic	ARCSA <u>updated</u> the list of products for human consumption that do not require Sanitary Registration for importation and distribution.
	Political	President Lasso <u>met</u> with his Mexican counterpart President AMLO to propose a Free Trade Agreement.
Outlook	Social	The Ecuadorian Pro Transplant Foundation <u>reported</u> that the situation of transplant patients in Ecuador "is critical" due to the lack of medicines.

	Health	 The number of oncological drugs was <u>expanded</u> in the national compendium. The Delta variant is responsible for more than 94% of the COVID-19 infections reported in Mexico, <u>warned</u> the PAHO.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 COFEPRIS <u>authorized</u> for emergency use the Sinopharm vaccine. The first shipment of Moderna vaccines <u>donated</u> by the United States government arrived in the country. Mexico has <u>exceeded</u> 97 million packaged vaccines against COVID-19.
	Economic	 The government <u>signed</u> an agreement with the Yaqui community to reactivate the agricultural and fishing sectors.
Outlook	Political	 The National Electoral Institute (INE) <u>formalized</u> the new integration of the House of Representatives as of September 1. A new Secretary of Government was <u>appointed</u>, while former Secretary, Olga Sánchez Cordero, took office as president of the Board of Directors of the Senate. The Electoral Court of Mexico <u>ordered</u> Congress to regulate the referendum process to revoke the presidential mandate. The President of Ecuador <u>made</u> an official visit to Mexico. The Secretary of Foreign Relations <u>called</u> on the international community to strengthen cross-border arms control. Foreign Minister <u>insisted</u> on Mexico's plan to say "goodbye" to the current Organization of American States (OAS).
	Social	 Members of the National Coordinator of Education Workers (CNTE) <u>prevented</u> President AMLO from arriving to his daily press conference. The government <u>decided</u> to receive Afghan refugees.

	Vaccine Rollout	 Massive second-dose vaccination <u>campaign</u> for those who received first doses of Moderna, Astrazenca, Pfizer and Sputnik COVID-19 vaccines. 0,06% of vaccinated people have <u>reported</u> side effects. First-dose vaccination to <u>resume</u> on September.
	Economic	 Deputy Minister of Trade remarked that a more "competitive" tariff for land freights will be <u>implemented</u> amid discussions carried out in a Technical Committee with different associations.
	Country Opening	 New sanitary measures <u>enacted</u> until September 7th, 2021.While mobility restrictions are still in place, sporting events were <u>authorized</u>. 	Health	 The General Directorate of Medicines, Supplies and Drugs (DIGEMID) recommended avoiding irrational use of antibiotics and other medications in cases of COVID-19. Health Minister Cevallos indicated that so far, no deaths have been registered from the delta variant in the country.
Government Measures	Vaccine Rollout	 The Ministry of Health <u>received</u> a new shipment of 1,000,000 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine from Sinopharm. President Castillo <u>received</u> the second dose of the Sinopharm vaccine against COVID-19. On August 30, vaccination for adolescent patients with comorbidities that require their second dose against COVID-19 will be <u>carried</u> out.
	Economic	 The Executive Power <u>sent</u> to Congress the draft for the Budget for Fiscal Year 2022. The new Vice Minister of Economy was <u>appointed</u>. The Ministry of Economy <u>published</u> the document that contains the official multiannual macroeconomic projections for the 2022-2025 period.
	Political	 The Congress granted the vote of confidence to the Ministerial Cabinet chaired by Guido Bellido. The president of the Congress announced that she will promote a common agenda of urgent issues to present it to the Executive. President Castillo called on all three powers of the State to work together to meet the needs of the population.
Outlook	Economic	 Prime Minister Bellido <u>announced</u> that the Government will adopt measures for the effective and rapid collection of tax debts. The Ministry of Economy <u>raised</u> the projection of GDP growth as well as of private investment.
	Social	 The Minister of Agrarian Development <u>stated</u> that the second agrarian reform will seek to industrialize agriculture. President Castillo <u>held</u> a meeting with a group of scientists to address the creation of the Ministry of Science, Technology and Technological Innovation.



	Health	 Drop in COVID19 cases continues to be <u>sustained</u>. According to the Harvard index, there are no Departments at orange or red risk. Local press <u>highlighted</u> that only 10 people were hospitalized in intensive care units last Friday.
Government	Vaccine Rollout	 Uruguay has a <u>pre-agreement</u> with Pfizer to purchase an additional 4.5 million doses. Government is working with PAHO for the donation of the vaccines from COVAX. The executive decided not to use the reserved vaccines, local press <u>reported</u>. Uruguay reached 70% of the population vaccinated against COVID19 with two doses, local press <u>reported</u>.
Measures	Economic	 Government <u>announced</u> family allowance supplements to be applied in September and December. They are for pregnant women and for children from 0 to 3 years old. The <u>Interior Development Fund</u> will finance projects aimed at promoting road infrastructure and productive development initiatives.
	Country opening	Presidential Decree <u>enabled</u> the entry of foreigners owning property in the country as from September 1st. They may enter with relatives up to the second degree of consanguinity.
Outlook	Political	 According to a survey by <i>Opción Consultores</i> reported in the local press, 75% of the population approves the government's management of the pandemic. The PIT-CNT announced a general strike for Sep. 15th. After 39 out of 150 days of verification, the Electoral Court validated almost 200 thousand signatures of the nearly 700 thousand required to call a referendum against the Urgent Consideration Law (LUC), local press remarked.
