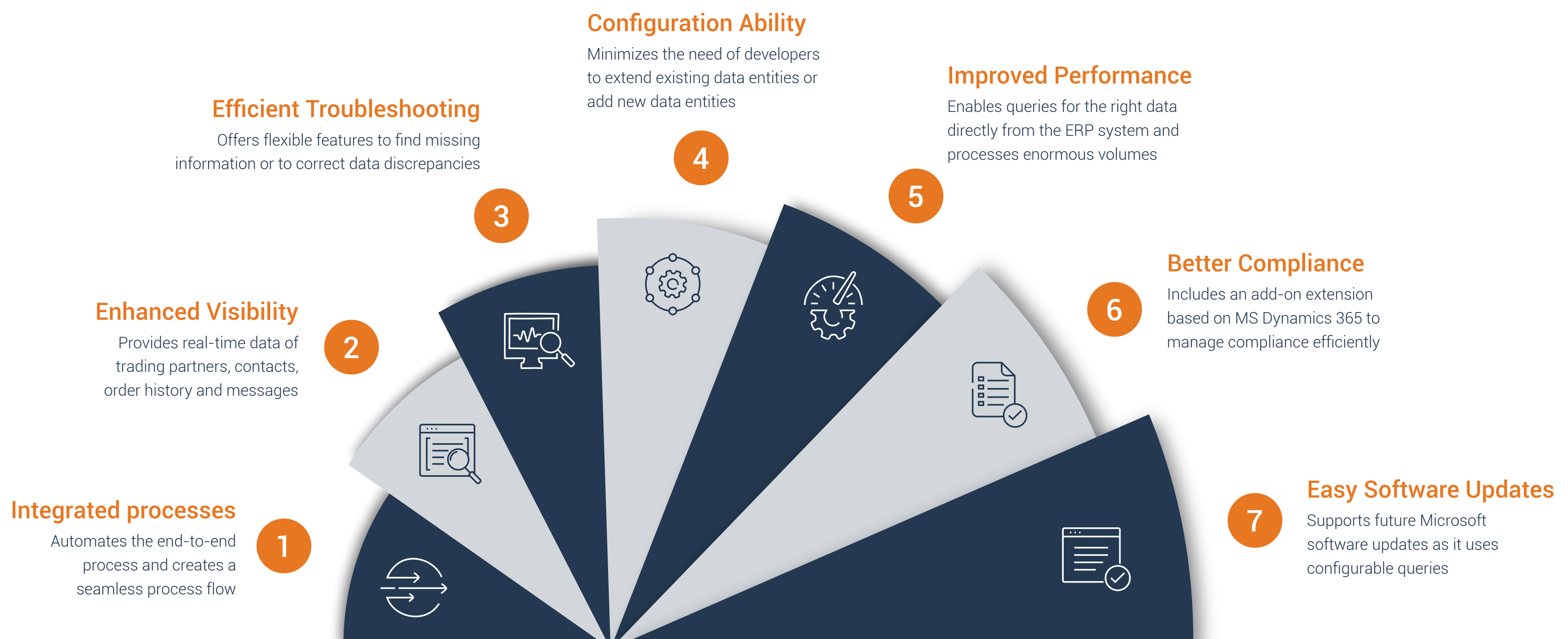


7 Reasons to Invest in an EDI Solution Embedded in Dynamics 365
