


## From the Vice Postulator/Guild Director

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Father Peyton's life was firmly rooted in his faith and family. Those two elements were crucial in his journey to the United States of America, and all that followed. At the age of 19, he and his brother, Thomas, left Ireland to find work and pursue the American dream. They brought minimal material possessions but a strong faith in the Blessed Mother and Our Lord, Jesus. Like many

young men and women, they went to stay with family. Their sister, Beatrice, and her husband, Michael Gallagher, lived in Scranton, Pennsylvania, and so this became Patrick and Thomas' new home.

Their sister, Nellie Peyton, who worked in the bishop's residence, would also play an essential role in both brother's lives. Knowing of Patrick's past sense of God calling him to the priesthood, Nellie arranged a meeting for Patrick with Monsignor Paul Kelly, rector of the St. Peter's Cathedral, about a position of sexton (custodian). Patrick would first work selling American flags door to door and then briefly, construction. However, work at the Cathedral under the direction of Monsignor Kelly and time praying and working close to the Eucharistic Lord would reignite his call to the priesthood.

In the following year, strengthened through prayer and family support, Patrick approached Father Patrick Dolan, C.S.C., who was conducting a parish mission with three other Holy Cross priests. Patrick shared his desire to serve God as a missionary and received a glowing recommendation from Monsignor Kelly. At the end of that summer, both Patrick and Thomas left for the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, to enter the Congregation's high school seminary and begin their journey with the Congregation of Holy Cross.

At the time, it was difficult to comprehend God's plan. However, the Peyton family's foundation of faith, which began in Ireland, allowed them to trust God's will. The love of sisters who shared that faith facilitated the spiritual rekindling of the future Father Patrick Peyton's call to the priesthood and enlightened his brother Thomas's mind and heart.


