### FOR EVERY FAMILY

- The evening before the first Sunday of Advent, host a New Year's Eve party to celebrate the beginning of the new Church year. This year's theme: the Year of Grace.
- Take a drive to look at the Christmas lights in your neighborhood.
- Bake Christmas cookies and share some with friends/ neighbors.
- Donate diapers and formula to a local crisis pregnancy center. Larger size diapers are always particularly needed.
- Each evening as you light the Advent candles, pray for the people who sent you Christmas cards in the mail.
- ## Have a birthday cake for Jesus for Christmas Day dessert.
- Host an Advent tea with treats and an Advent book.
- Make posters about the true meaning of Christmas. Hang them in your windows.
- Clean out toys and give away those in good condition.
- Make Christmas cards for shut-ins or for a food pantry to include with Christmas dinners.
- Use your Advent wreath every day, but after dinner so you are not rushed. Each person in the family can take a turn lighting the candle and saying a prayer.
- Do someone else's chores for a day without telling them
- Watch a Christmas movie about Jesus.
- Give out candy canes when you go shopping.
- Attach a thank-you note to a water bottle for delivery drivers.
- Make a list of all things you are thankful to God for.

## FOR FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

- Read a Christmas storybook together by the light of the Christmas tree.
- Move the figures of Mary and Joseph closer to the Nativity scene every day during Advent.
- Use pink and purple paper to make a paper chain that shows children how many more days until Christmas. Remove one link from the chain each day.
- For each good deed or selfless act, put straw or crinkly paper in the manger to get ready to welcome Jesus.
- Read Luke 2 or Matthew 1; draw a picture of a Nativity scene.
- Make a good deed paper chain decoration. Every time someone does something kind, write it on a strip of construction paper and add it to the chain. Use Advent or Christmas colors.
- Pray one decade of the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary, the Annunciation for pregnant women; or the Birth of Jesus for those giving birth that day.
- Make a card for Mary and Joseph congratulating them on their new baby.
- Decorate stars and put them in your windows.
- Make paper plate angels.
- Draw a picture for Jesus.
- Make a paper crown to remember that the Three Kings came to honor Jesus.
- Make a lamb or shepherd's crook in honor of the shepherds who came to visit Jesus.

# FOR FAMILIES WITH TWEENS/TEENS

- Fill a shopping bag with nonperishable grocery items and deliver to a food pantry.
- As you light the Advent candles each night, sing a verse of an Advent hymn.
- Make prayer ornaments for your Christmas tree with the names of people you'd like to pray for during this season.
- When you set up your Nativity, learn about how St. Francis started this tradition.
- Pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary with intentions for women who are pregnant.
- Read one chapter of the Gospel of Luke each day.
- ℧ Eat dinner by candlelight.
- Make a Christ candle for the center of your Advent wreath and light all the candles on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day when you enjoy your family meal.
- Write a letter to Jesus.
- Send Christmas cards to people who will be alone at Christmas.

# **FOR EMPTY NESTERS**

- ♥ Pray Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours together during Advent.
- Send a Christmas thank-you card to your pastor and parish staff, with a personal note of thanksgiving for their service to your parish community.
- ♥ Purchase a toy or gift card for children in need.
