Must-Have Plays for Preventing Commercial Crime on Your Property



'WATTS' UP WITH YOUR PERIMETER SECURITY?

We've all heard the expression "crime doesn't pay." While that's certainly true for the victims, the perpetrators sometimes make out shockingly well.

- Theft of commercial equipment and materials from construction sites alone accounts for \$1 billion in annual losses.
- Cargo theft costs U.S. businesses up to \$30 billion each year.
- And, in a recent survey, 25% of businesses reported employee theft losses of more than \$1 million.

Would you rather deal with the aftermath of a crime—or stop it before it can happen?

This playbook will get you started with five must-have plays you can take to prevent theft at your commercial property.







A physical fence is the first line of defense in controlling access to your site and protecting your business assets.

To be effective, perimeter fencing should be:

- At least six feet high.
- · Sturdy and free of any gaps or breaks.
- Secured at the bottom to prevent would-be thieves from crawling under it.

Maintenance and vigilance are also important. Be sure to:

- · Check your fence regularly for signs of weakness or damage.
- Trim or remove tall hedges, large bushes, weeds and other vegetation that can provide cover for intruders.
- After rain or snow storms, check outside your fence for evidence of lurking. Food wrappers, drink containers, cigarette butts and similar items may all be telltale signs.





Thieves like dark, unprotected jobsites where they can get in and out undetected.

To deter thieves:

- · Make sure your property's entire perimeter is well lit.
- Install additional lighting around all buildings, with special attention to points of access like doors and windows.
- Install motion detection lighting in any particularly dark areas.
- Regularly check and replace bulbs, timers and other lighting features.





Burglary is often a crime of opportunity. Don't make it easier for thieves to enter your premises.

- · Lock and double-check gates, doors and windows when you leave for the night.
- Lock work vehicles and take the keys with you, even during work hours.
- Rekey high-value equipment or install keyless ignition devices that require a passcode. Most
 equipment comes with generic keys that can be purchased online, enabling thieves to simply
 drive away with it.
- Install steering wheel and trailer hitch locks to make equipment more difficult to move.
- · Consider removing vehicle batteries and/or wheels over long holiday weekends.
- Use product identification tags, GPS tracking devices or similar security measures on highvalue equipment.
- Store smaller equipment inside a building or in locked cages in secure areas.





Many thefts are "inside jobs," committed or facilitated by someone who works for you.

To minimize this possibility:

- · Run thorough background checks on every new hire or contract worker.
- Contact references and ask open-ended questions that leave room for previous employers to speak openly.
- Limit access to cash, checks, financial records, computers, easily pilfered inventory, and building and vehicle keys to employees whose jobs require it.
- Assign two people to work on tasks involving cash, finances or expensive equipment.
- Pay attention to changes in employee behavior or attitudes, like wanting to work after hours or suddenly displaying a more lavish lifestyle.





Thieves want their job to be as easy as possible and usually leave highly secured sites alone. The solution to effective security is to make it dauntingly difficult for them to get onto your property in the first place.

Recommendations include:

- A physical fence may deter some criminals, but motivated intruders can cut, climb, lift or even drive through them.
- A layered perimeter security solution avoids any single point of failure by forcing criminals to penetrate a series of security measures to reach the target.
