



## **COVID-19 pandemic: New OSHA guidance for Construction workers**

**Washington DC: OSHA has provided new guidance for the construction industry directed at protecting construction workers from exposure to COVID-19.**

As part of the response to COVID-19 virus exposures, OSHA provided an OSHA Alert on April 21, 2020, regarding the protection of construction workers. Precautions provided in the OSHA Alert include limiting the length of in-person meetings, maintaining social distancing at meetings and all locations on site, and properly cleaning tools and equipment.

In the alert, OSHA also provides additional recommendations for employers to consider including [EPA approved](#) disinfectant products, and guidance on employee training.
