A free 6 week course for public servants


# **ABOUT THE COURSE**

More and more, actively involving citizens in government processes is being seen as a critical part of sound, democratic decision-making, policy development and project evaluation.

Public engagement is one important way to facilitate effective citizen participation. Engagement can help to heighten government responsiveness, strengthen trust in public institutions, and give a voice to those who have historically been left out of public decision-making.

Through **14 short reads, resources and activities**, this course offers public servants a grounding in public engagement so that they can better understand how to apply it to their work. The course would certainly also inspire public servants already working in the field to try new approaches to working directly with their communities.
