What's College Prep (CP)?

An intervention designed to ...

- support our academic growth and development
- help us build strong academic skills and habits
- support us in making up missing or incomplete work to improve your grades
- hold us accountable to fully completing and submitting our work on time
- take ownership of our grades and our work





What's College Prep (CP)?



College Prep will support you to build habits of **responsibility** and **self-advocacy**.

Students who do not complete work or stay organized tend to experience a 'snowball effect' that leads them to become progressively more disorganized and behind as the year progresses. During College Prep you will have time to get organized and get things done in hopes that you address immediate challenges and <u>develop long-term habits of success</u> that will support you through college and in life.

<u>Reflection is an important part of growth</u>. By taking the time to not only complete work but also to reflect on how to change your habits will impact not only your present, but also your future success.

How do I earn a College Prep (CP)?
