Asynchronous Attendance - meaning pre-recorded, Q&A with teachers, etc., could be viewed or completed after scheduled class time.	Synchronous Attendance - modeled after an in-person school day, students are required to attend and be "in-class with their teacher" on time the during time as scheduled with appropriate screen breaks.
Optional Participation: Some participation through question and answer, but not required.	Expected Participation: Cameras on when possible, participation is expected whether verbally with mic, typed in teams chat or through learning platforms like Nearpod, Peardeck, or Google Classroom.
Modules / End of Week Due Dates: Classwork / modules could be completed any time before Friday at 12PM.	Classwork Done Synchronously: Students should complete classwork with classmates during class period (due by end of class). Exceptions should be worked out with teacher / advisor.
More Review / Less Supportive: Review content from earlier with a little new content, less supportive since most work needed to be done independently.	New Content & More Supportive: New learning, more access to teacher support, and more like normal school environment!

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Scott Franzblau- "College Prep"

What's the same (now) in 20-21?

- Teachers assign them for missing work
- Students & Advisors get emailed immediately
- Families get a robo-notification
- Parent Portal is available 24-7 to get ahead and catch up on knowing your student's work completion status





What's new (now) for College Prep in 20-21?

- There is no room or time/space assigned as a result of earning a College Prep
- Teachers will ONLY assign them for missing work
- Family notifications will be 1x/ week (Friday afternoons)
- Google Classroom Flyer access will allow parents to have even MORE transparency into their student's work completion!
- Advisories have uniquely created their own Accountability follow-ups (will vary)

Why do we even have "College Prep" in E-school?

- If your student missed an assignment turning in an assignment by accident, this clearly informs them it is missing
- Completing assignments is essential to learning and to students earning the best grade they can (ie... "prep for college, "college prep")
- Missing assignments can be completed!
- It communicates to student's Advisor & their family that they may need support! (early warning signal!)

- Mute/Unmute as directed by teacher
- Chat/ Don't chat as directed by teacher
- Participate in Chat respectfully & responsibly
- Use of Hand-Raising feature to ask a question or respond to a question
- Appropriately Direct message vs. whole group message (to peers, to teachers)

Outlook: Email & Calendar

- Use Email to communicate:
 - Completed missing work
 - Request support from content teacher
 - With teachers outside of class time

How Tos: What should you ask about?

We recognize the various new platforms are a lot for learners, let alone for families to stay on top of. The following is a list of what you can ask your learner to show you so you know they are on top of things!

1. The "Turn In" button!

- a. On Google Classroom, each assignment needs to be turned in. Teachers receive no other communication that an assignment is indeed complete otherwise.
- b. The ask: "Hey, can you show me that your work from today/this week is turned in Google Classroom?"
 - i. Note: There will be an "Unsubmit" button if it is already turned in.



2. Student Portal!

- a. The ask: "Hey, let's look at your grades on the student portal!"
- b. The link: <u>https://myportal.dpsk12.org</u>
- c. The student login info:
 - i. Username: lunch number/student id
 - ii. Password: 8 digit birthday (i.e. January 4, 2008 is: 01042008
- d. You can see all grades, missing assignments, and so forth.
- e. This is the best place to spend time.



3. Pear Deck Takeaways

- a. Want another level of accountability? Some classes use Pear Deck. This allows students to respond to questions that are being presented live. After class, "takeaways" are emailed to them that include all of their responses.
- b. The ask: "Can I see your Pear Deck takeaways from Social Studies today?"



4. If in doubt, reach out!

- a. The ask: "Hmm, I'm not sure about that. Should I email your advisor?"
- Always feel free to reach out and we will do our best to get back to you as soon as we can!
- c. All staff email addresses are on the Byers website AND they are simply our
