While superintendent of the Fountain-Fort Carson School District (Colorado), Jones' work to raise student achievement led to minority students actually out-performing their non-minority peers. As an operational vice president of EdisonLearning Inc., after opening three reconstituted, 100-percent minority schools in Baltimore, Jones was recognized by the state of Maryland for realizing the highest student achievement growth in the city. His work as an elementary, middle- and high-school principal, and as assistant superintendent in Wichita Public Schools yielded similar results.

Jones is a commissioner for the 21st Century Commission on the Future of Community Colleges and the Education Commission of the States, and an advisory committee member of the Education Research and Development Institute. He serves on national and local boards for a number of organizations including WestEd, Education Sector, the International Association for K-12 Online Learning, and the Center for Research on Education Outcomes, and has addressed state legislatures and advised numerous governors, as well as U.S. Department of Education administrators, on student achievement and other education matters.
