DSST WAS FOUNDED IN 2004.

DSST was founded in 2004 with a dream that one public charter high school could redefine the American high school experience. The school's mission then was the same as it is today: **to provide every student with an outstanding and rigorous STEM education that serves as strong preparation for college and life.**

From our first day, we have been striving to ensure that every student and staff member is affirmed for their **unique gifts and talents**, and has the opportunity to **meaningfully and positively contribute** to our **collective human story**. It's what we refer to as **the human condition**, and it continues to be core to the work that we do.

I was DSST's founding School Director, and since opening our first public school with a 9th grade class of 130 students, DSST's impact has grown to serving over 6,200 students in Aurora and Denver at 15 middle schools and 6 high schools, across 9 campuses. Our team works to provide all of our students with a world class education - an education that empowers our students to graduate with a **strong sense of values**, a **deep understanding** of their **identity**, and **academic skills** that ensure they are college and career ready. As our network grows and we watch our alumni flourish, we continue to be dedicated to working with our students and families as we build schools that bring opportunity in the communities we serve for many generations to come.

WHAT MAKES DSST SPECIAL?

DSST's core school model focuses on a few key elements that make us unique:



Integrated schools: Our goal is to bring students from a multitude of backgrounds to learn alongside and from one another. We do this by running world-class schools that are incredibly effective at serving all students and by recruiting students from a variety of backgrounds to each of our schools. We aim for our schools to have a mix of students where our Free and Reduced Lunch population makes up no less than 40% and no more than 70% of our student body. While this isn't true of all of our schools currently, this is the bar we aspire to continuously.



Values: DSST is built on 6 Core Values: Respect, Responsibility, Courage, Curiosity, Doing Your Best and Integrity. They have helped to guide our staff and student culture through conversations, morning meetings and celebrations. These values act as our network's north star as we continually improve as in our ability to contribute to the human story.



Academic Preparation with STEM: DSST runs schools with a liberal arts curriculum with an additional focus on STEM. Our goal is to prepare our students in every way for college and beyond – to be strong leaders and clear communicators who are well-versed in every academic area. DSST's curriculum prepares students for internships and independent projects and to have a broad understanding of the world around them. This preparation manifests in some of the highest SAT scores and AP pass rates in Colorado.



College Success: Our curriculum, systems and culture are all geared towards ensuring our students are both admitted into college and are successfully set up for a multitude of career and life opportunities. Even in our middle schools, you will see our walls adorned in college symbols, and college is deeply embedded in the lexicon.

WHAT IS DSST?

DSST is a non-profit public charter school network. Like all non-profits we have a mission and our bottom line is ensuring our students are prepared for college and life. This means Denver Public Schools and Aurora Public Schools authorize us to have schools in certain neighborhoods, serving their students and families. The application and agreement between our non-profit and the school district is called a “charter” – which is where the term “charter schools” come from. All of our schools are completely public and tuition-free, but we can use our own curriculum and staff, who are not district employees, to work in our schools. This allows us to avoid bureaucracy, be more innovative and continually refine our approach.

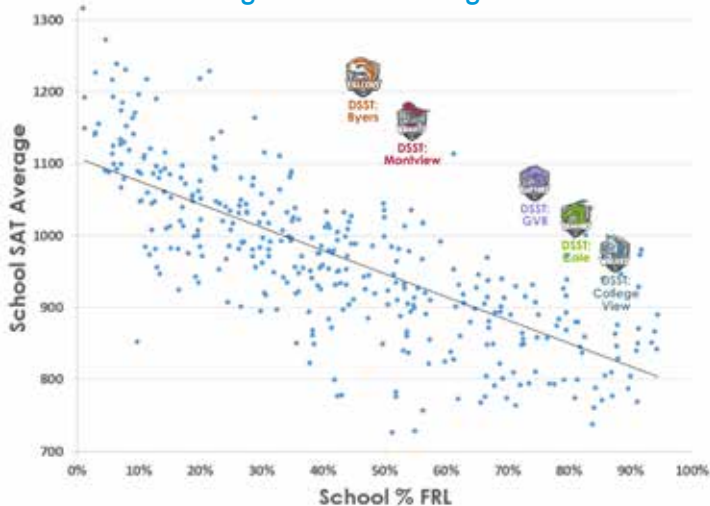
COLLEGE READINESS

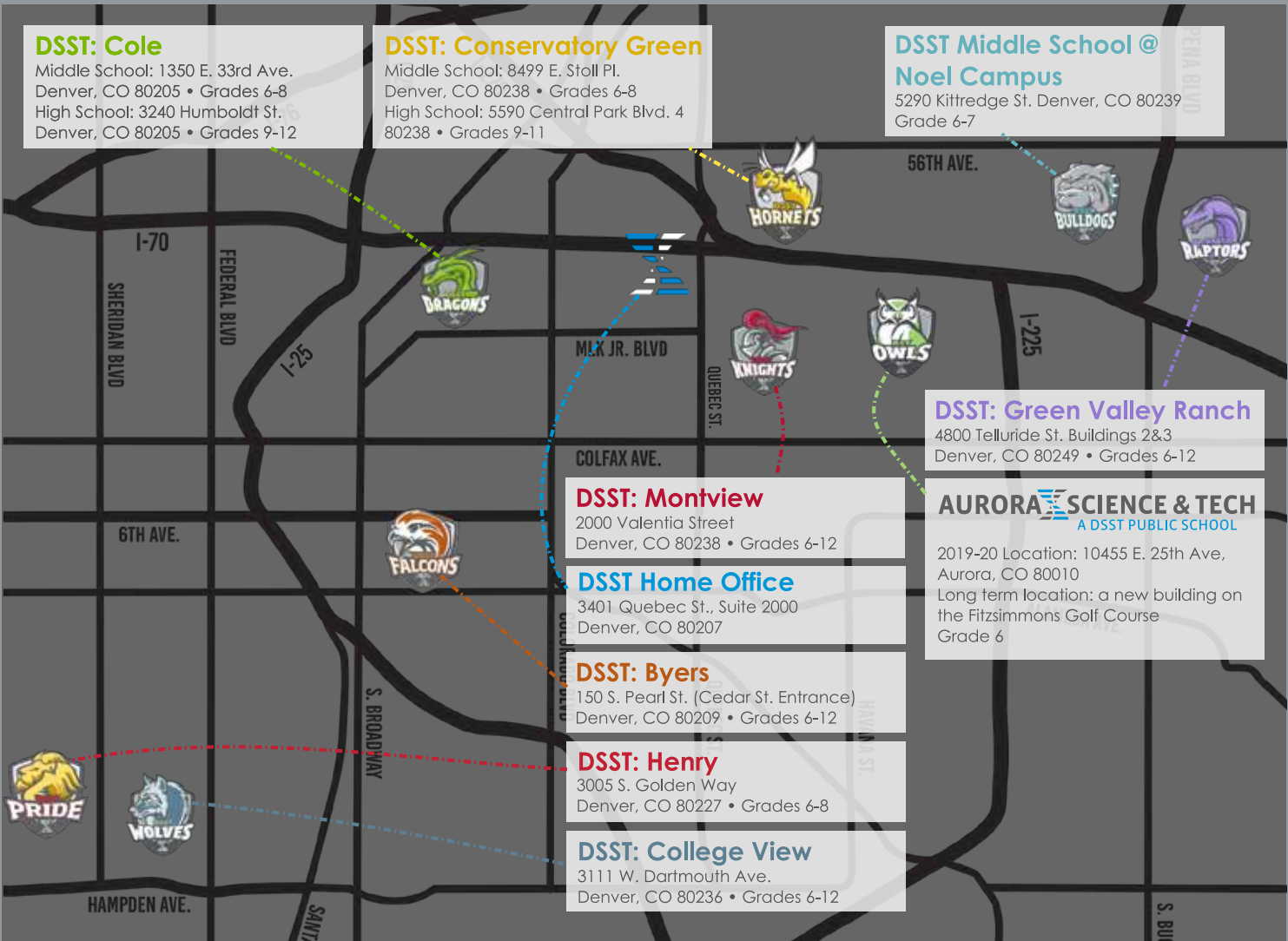

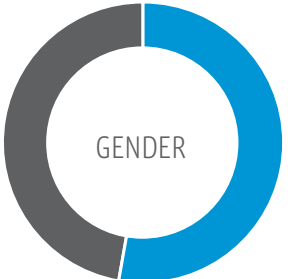
