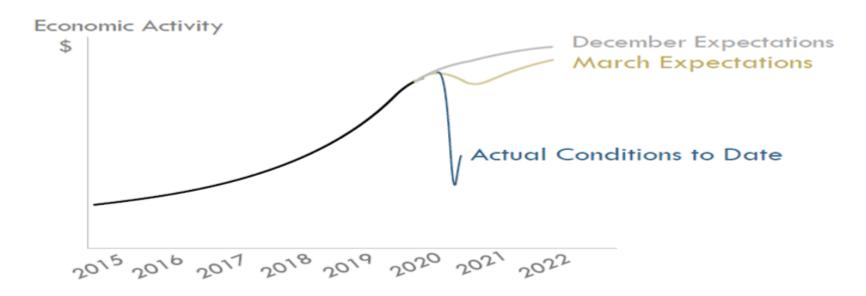
Actual expenses came in \$50k higher than forecast while revenue was favorable by \$140K.

Additional revenue available to spend above FY 2019-20 spending levels.\*

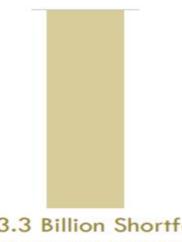

#### Changes relative to March:

\$895.8 million deficit carried over from FY 2019-20

General Fund revenue expectations were reduced in FY 2020-21 by \$2.42 billion

Shortfall amount does not include inflation or caseload pressures

Any budget changes for FY 2019-20 will carry into FY 2020-21

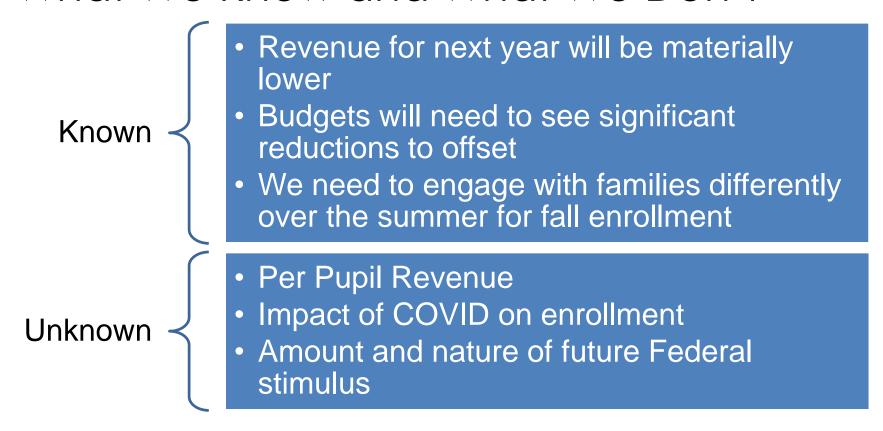

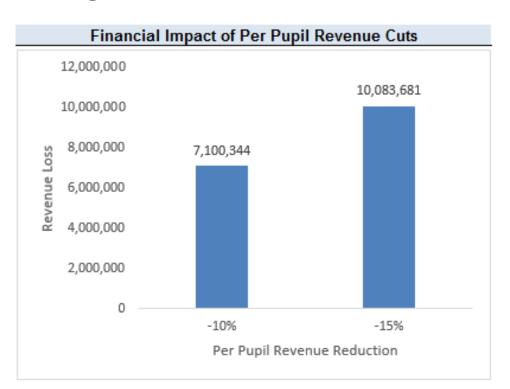

## Latest Revenue Information

### ESSER (Elementary Secondary Schools Economic Relief)

- Allocation from Federal Government to Local Education Agencies
- Per CDE projections, DSST will receive ~\$1.6M
- Money needs to be spent by September, 2021
- State Coronavirus Relief Fund
  - Governor Polis has allocated \$510M to K-12
  - Assuming flat per student, DSST may receive ~\$3.5M
  - Money needs to be spent by December, 2020
