Clayton Cavalier Homes Project Wins ABC Excellence in Construction Award

The new facility will include five classrooms that will be expandable to accommodate conferences, four large offices, a large wrap-around glass gallery, large restrooms and lots of

space for storage.

"We realized schools in Giles and Lincoln Counties weren't going on field trips because they couldn't afford to rent a bus and travel to Nashville or Huntsville, so I thought what if I could bring those field trips to them?" says Kelly, founder of the non-profit organization.
