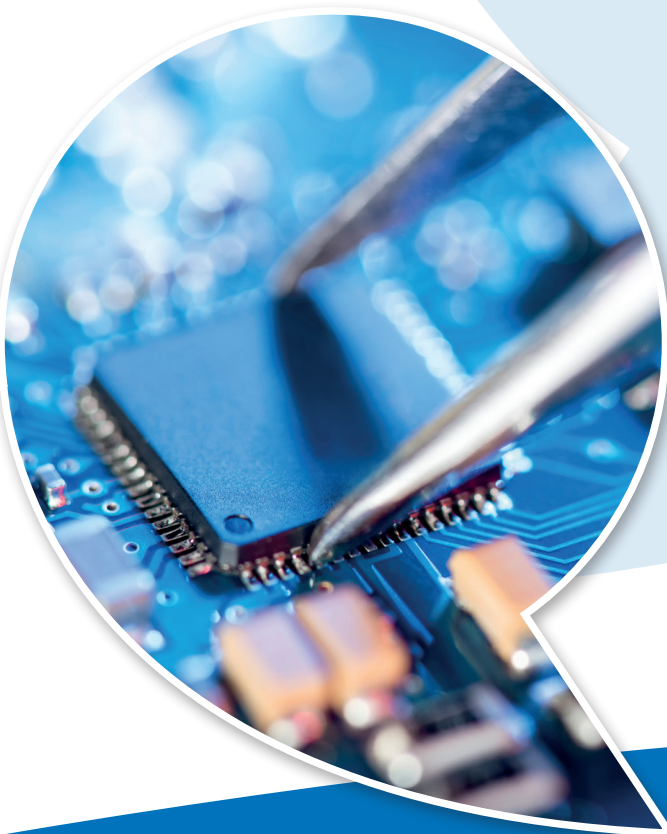
Robert Blake Science College
